When performing these exams, it's imperative that we maintain the ethical principle of patient autonomy. Pelvic exams are invasive and traumatic for some patients; therefore, we must provide all patients with informed consent. Our oath as medical students and physicians is to do no harm to the patient. Performing unauthorized pelvic exams on anesthetized patients for the sole purpose of medical student education violates this principle and may cause unacceptable psychological harm to patients.
