My name is Elizabeth Shimoura, and I am a third-year medical student at the University of Toledo College of Medicine and Life Sciences. I am a constituent of Toledo, Ohio (43614). I am writing in support of House Bill 89 "Regards intimate examination of anesthetized, unconscious patient". As a medical student, I am taught to practice consent, respect and to put the patient's well-being above my personal benefit. In the same way that other elective procedures must be explained and consent obtained before surgery, I believe the same should apply for learning opportunities like pelvic exams. This is a skill that we are able to learn with consent, and therefore should **only** be practiced with consent. Patients, especially patients who would be subject to pelvic exams, already experience a significant amount of trauma at the hands of the medical system. Unconsented procedures will only further patient distrust and harbor resentment with the medical community.
