Please provide a brief statement on your position:

From the first days of medical school, we are taught that everything we do is "about the patient", meaning that we act as physicians to help, not to harm. I pursued a career in medicine so that I could play a critical role in treating and supporting my patients through some of the most vulnerable, intimate, and sometimes even terrifying parts of their lives. As a medical student, I hold in the highest regard the sacred trust and vulnerability that is involved in the physical-patient relationship. When I learned that unconsented intimate exams are still legal in some states despite a rapid shift in the social and cultural climate of medicine, I decided to become involved in advocating for HB 89 in the state of Ohio. Patients must give informed consent prior to having an intimate exam performed, whether or not they will be conscious for it. As medical students, we learn how to perform these types of exams from willing standardized patients who have consented to being examined for the sake of our learning, and it is only right that real patients are afforded the same

degree of autonomy. We are all patients, and there is no place for unconsented intimate exams on anesthetized patients in the field of medicine.
