Please provide a brief statement on your position: As the parent of a trans child, I cannot emphasize enough how critical access to trans affirming care is to the health of my child. Trans affirming care at all ages is evidence-based and supported by our finest medical institutions in the US. Without the trans affirming care my child receives from their pediatrician, endocrinologist, therapists, social workers, and other medical professionals, they would be immensely depressed, dysphoric, and likely suicidal. It is not for the state to determine what is medically appropriate for our kids — our most respected medical professionals in the world have already made these determinations through their extensive knowledge, experience, research, and practice of medicine. You wouldn't take away a pediatric cancer patient's access to life saving radiation therapy, so why would you take away a child's access to life saving medical care for gender dysphoria?

Transgender children are eight times as likely to be suicidal. There should be nothing more important than the relationship between medical providers and the rights of parents to get the best possible care they can for their children. It is not appropriate for elected officials to attempt to practice medicine or override evidence-based medical decision making.

This committee must not move this bill any further — it is medically ill-informed and it would do appreciable harm — both mentally and physically — to the same children it claims to be protecting. Medical orgs oppose this bill. Ohio citizens oppose this bill. You should oppose this bill.
