This Occupational License Review Report contains the recommendations of the House State and Local Government Committee concerning the continuation, modification, or elimination of occupational licensing boards and occupational licenses, pursuant to the review process outlined in R.C. Section 101.63.

Ohio law dictates all occupational licensing boards shall expire six years after creation or last renewal, unless renewed by the General Assembly for another six-year period. The review process provides an opportunity and forum to assess whether existing occupational licenses protect the health, safety, or welfare of the public; whether boards employ the least restrictive means of licensing; and whether changing or eliminating a board or license would increase the state's competitiveness and better serve the public's interest.

Earlier this year, the House State and Local Government Committee was directed by Speaker Jason Stephens to review one-third of all occupational licensing boards and occupational licenses. Nineteen public licensing entities testified before the Committee: Accountancy Board, Ohio Police Officer Training Commission, Department of Agriculture, Ohio Architects & Landscape Architects Boards, Ohio Casino Control Commission, Department of Commerce – Division of Financial Institutions, Department of Commerce – Superintendent & Division of Industrial Compliance, Department of Commerce – Division of Real Estate and Professional Licensing – Real Estate Commission & Appraiser Board, State Cosmetology and Barber Board, Motor Vehicle Repair Board, Bureau of Motor Vehicles, Department of Public Safety, State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors, State Racing Commission, Secretary of State, and the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services.

Ultimately, this report does not include legislation, but it does provide the framework for legislation for the continuation, modification, or elimination of occupational licensing boards and occupational licenses. The recommendations herein were formulated after hearing testimony from the entities listed above, interested parties, and the public. The recommendations also reflect a thorough

examination of surrounding states' licensure requirements. Each recommendation was determined after considering the criteria set forth in R.C. Section 101.65.

The Committee remains eager to continue working with public licensing entities, stakeholders, and the public to ensure that unforeseen and unintended consequences arising from these recommendations are mitigated.

GENERAL RECOMMENDATIONS

- For the purposes of this review, the Committee recommends including within the existing definition of "occupational license" any business license and certification that requires satisfaction of any personal qualification, as defined in R.C. Section 4798.01.
- The Committee also recommends that continuing education (CE) requirements should be limited to
 new occupational and safety information that addresses a concrete and particularized risk or danger
 to the health, safety, and welfare of the licensed professionals or the public. "Diversity, Equity, and
 Inclusion" topics should not be mandated or approved to satisfy CE requirements unless the topic is
 demonstrably essential to the preserving the health, safety, and welfare of the licensed professionals
 or the public.

The Ohio Department of Agriculture (ODA) Senior staff has reviewed and considered whether the Department issues occupational licenses as defined in ORC 4798.01:

"Occupational license" means nontransferable authorization in law that an individual must possess in order to perform a lawful occupation for compensation based on meeting personal qualifications established by statute, or by a rule authorized by statute. "Occupational license" does not include a commercial or other driver's license issued under the Revised Code.

The above definition contains five requirements, and if all are met, the license/permit/registration will be deemed to be an occupational license. The requirements are:

- Individual (not simply the facility or business entity)
- Nontransferable
- Occupation
- For compensation
- Personal qualifications

After a thorough review of the thirty-six license/permit/registrations issued by the Department, we determined that seven of those qualify as occupational licenses:

- Auctioneers
- Certified Livestock Manager
- Commercial Pesticide Applicator
- Dog Broker
- Grain Commodity Tester
- Milk Weigher, Tester, and Sampler
- Weights and Measures Service Person

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The remaining twenty-nine did not meet all elements of an occupational license. For example, a Restricted Snake permit is a non-transferable permit issued to an individual. However, it is not an occupation, and no compensation is earned.

The Department, in addition to this memo, is submitting an Excel spreadsheet detailing all 36 license/permit/registrations and whether they meet the five requirements as detailed above.

The Ohio Division of Financial Institutions (the "Division") recently participated in the Occupational Licensure Review process established by SB 255, passed by the 132nd General Assembly. On September 19, 2023, Division Counsel Matthew Green testified before the House and Local Government Committee regarding the Mortgage Loan Originator ("MLO") license. The MLO license is the sole occupational license administered by the Division.

O.R.C. 4798.01 defines "occupational license" to mean a "nontransferable authorization in law that an individual must possess in order to perform a lawful occupation for compensation based on meeting personal qualifications established by statute, or by a rule authorized by statute." The MLO license meets this definition because MLO licenses are issued exclusively to individuals who may transfer employment without getting relicensed, and successful candidates for licensure must complete a set amount of coursework and pass a licensing examination.

In addition to the MLO license, the Division administers eleven other licenses or certificates of registration. They are: (1) the Small Loan license; (2) the General Loan certificate of registration; (3) the Insurance Premium Finance Company license; (4) the Credit Service Organization certificate of registration; (5) the Short-Term Lender license; (6) the Ohio Residential Mortgage Lending Act ("ORMLA") certificate of registration; (7) the Pawnbroker license; (8) the Money Transmitter license; (9) the Precious Metals Dealer license; (10) the Check-Cashing Business license; and (11) the Consumer Installment Loan license.

As to the ORMLA certificate of registration specifically, the Division notes that materials recently provided by the Legislative Services Commission ("LSC") identify two certificates of registration—the mortgage broker and mortgage lender certificates of registration—that no longer exist. As a result of ORMLA, these two certificates of registration were combined into a single certificate of registration, now known as the ORMLA certificate of registration. By statutory definition, mortgage brokers and mortgage lenders must be corporate entities. See R.C. 1322.01(Y), (Z).

With regard to all eleven of the licenses or certificates of registration identified above, on September 12, 2023, LSC issued a memo identifying several factors that are relevant to the inquiry of whether a license is a business, rather than an occupational, license. One such factor is whether the regulation is portable—i.e., if an individual left a job, does the employer have to get a new license to keep operating or does the license stay with the employer. The Division's licenses identified above can be, and almost 100% of the time are, issued to businesses or corporate entities. In these instances, the license is not "portable" by any employee, officer, or owner of the licensee. Rather, the license is issued exclusively to the corporate entity and cannot be transferred to any other entity without Division approval.

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A second relevant factor identified in the LSC memo is whether the issuance of the license focuses more on an individual's skill or knowledge, or the product or service itself. The eleven licenses or certificates of registration identified above all relate to non-depository lending or some type of consumer finance product or service. Unlike many traditional occupations, the licensing inquiry for these businesses is not focused on the specialized skills of or credentials held by an individual. Rather, and without exception, the focus is on ensuring that licensees have the financial capacity to engage in the activity in question (often through net worth or surety bond requirements), and whether there is any indication that licensees would be unwilling or unable to comply with minimal operational requirements or conditions in contracts, prohibitions on certain types of transactions or fees, limits on interest rates, etc.).

In conclusion, the Division does not administer any occupational licenses other than the MLO license. Thank you, and please feel free to contact me should you have any further questions regarding the activities of the Division.

Dear Chair John:

I write to you regarding the Division of Industrial Compliance's occupational licensing review; and specifically, as it pertains to potential review of two registrations required by the Division: 1) that importers, manufacturers, renovators, wholesalers, or reupholsterers of stuffed toys or articles of bedding register with the Division under section 3713.05 of the Revised Code, and 2) that boiler contractors register with the Division under section 4104.101 of the Revised Code. For the following reasons, the Division maintains that neither of these registrations are "occupational regulations" under Chapter 4798 of the Revised Code, because they do not require registrants possess any particular "personal qualifications" to satisfy the registration requirement.

Under section 4798.01 of the Revised Code:

"Occupational regulation" means a statute, policy, rule, adjudication order, practice, or other state law requiring an individual to possess certain qualifications to use an occupational title or work in a lawful occupation. "Occupational regulation" includes registration, certification, and occupational license. "Occupational regulation" excludes a business license, facility license, building permit, or zoning and land use regulation, except to the extent those laws regulate an individual's personal qualifications to perform a lawful occupation, and excludes sections of the Revised Code related to commercial or other driver's license.

R.C. 4798.01(A). Whereas "'Personal qualifications' mean criteria related to an individual's personal background and characteristics including completion of an approved educational program, satisfactory performance on an examination, work experience, other evidence of attainment of requisite skills or knowledge, moral standing, criminal history, and completion of continuing education." *Id.*

First, neither boiler contractor registration or bedding and stuffed toy registration require a registrant meet any "personal qualifications," and, therefore, neither constitute an "occupational regulation." For example, boiler contractors are required to register by submitting a registration form and applicable registration processing fee. See R.C. 4104.101(A); O.A.C. 4101:4-7-01(A). There is, however, no independent obligation that the registrant demonstrates any particular "personal qualification" in order to register as a boiler contractor. While the Boiler Code and "Accepted engineering practice and approved standards" adopted under rule 4101:4-3-01 of the Administrative Code by the Board of Building Standards may arguably contain personal qualification requirements, such as requiring individuals performing modifications and alterations of "R" stamped vessels to be "R" stamp holders, this requirement

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As for those seeking to register as importers, manufacturers, renovators, wholesalers, or reupholsterers of stuffed toys and articles of bedding, section 3713.05 of the Revised Code merely requires such parties to submit a registration form and the required fee in order to register with the Division's Bedding Section. See R.C. 3713.05(A)-(B). The application includes no "personal qualification" requirement in order to register. Bedding and stuffed toy registration, therefore, is not an occupational regulation.

Second, as identified in the attached letter from Kelly Bomba (an attorney with the Legislative Services Commission) to Travis Ricketts, section 4798.01 of the Revised Code excludes "business licenses" from the definition of "occupational regulations." One factor used in determining whether a regulation concerned an occupation as opposed to a business included whether the regulation was "portable," meaning a business could continue to operate under a license or registration in spite of any particular individual leaving employment with the entity. In this case, bedding registrations may be obtained by business entities and there is no requirement that any particular individual maintain employment with the entity in order for the registration to remain in effect for the business.

Another factor considered when evaluating whether a regulation concerned an occupation or a business included what was being evaluated in obtaining the license or registration. For example, if a regulation concerned an individual's skill and knowledge, it would be considered an occupational regulation a not a business license. As stated above, no personal qualifications are tested or needed in order to register as a bedding or stuffed toy registrant. As such, bedding and stuffed toy registrations constitute business regulations and not occupational regulations.

We welcome any questions you may have regarding the Division's oversight of the business regulations dealing with bedding and stuffed toy registrations under section 3713.05 of the Revised Code and boiler contractor registration under 4104.101 of the Revised Code.

We were notified by your office that pursuant to O.R.C. 101.63, the Division of Real Estate and Professional Licensing within the Ohio Department of Commerce was requested to appear before the House State and Local Government Committee for the General Assembly's Occupational Licensure Review. The Division prepared and provided questionnaires for the Ohio Real Estate Commission and the Ohio Real Estate Appraiser Board. A questionnaire was not completed, however, related to Manufactured housing dealers, manufactured housing brokers, and salesperson licenses.

Information related to Manufactured housing dealers, brokers and salespersons was not included because these are not occupational licenses. Occupational license is defined within Chapter 4798 of the Ohio Revised Code. An occupational license means nontransferable authorization in law that an individual must possess in order to perform a lawful occupation for compensation based on meeting personal qualifications established by statute, or by a rule authorized by statute. "Occupational license" does not include a commercial or other driver's license issued under the Revised Code.¹ The definition of occupational license states that to possess such a license that a person must meet personal qualifications. Personal qualifications are also defined in Chapter 4798 and means criteria related to an individual's personal background and characteristics including <u>completion of an approved educational program</u>, satisfactory performance on an examination, work experience, other evidence of attainment of requisite skills or knowledge, moral standing, criminal history, and <u>completion of continuing education</u>.²

An applicant for a manufactured housing dealers, brokers or salesperson license is not required to take any pre-licensure education, not required to take an examination, or demonstrate any work experience. Additionally, there is no requirement to complete any continuing education requirements to maintain a license. For these reasons, we assert that manufactured housing dealers, brokers and salespersons are not, by definition, occupational licenses.

Likewise, oil and gas land professionals are not granted an occupational license. Rather, oil and gas land professionals must register with the Division of Real Estate to satisfy an *exemption* to licensure pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 4735.01(I)(1)(h). Like manufactured housing dealers, brokers, or salespersons there are no pre-licensure education, examination or continuing education requirements. While a landman must be in good standing with a national,

state, or local professional organization, this is not an authorization but an exception to having a license.

For the foregoing reasons, neither oil and gas land professional registrations or manufactured housing dealers, brokers or salesperson license meet the definition established in Ohio Revised Code section 4798.01 and therefore are not subject to the review outlined in Ohio Revised Code sections 101.62 and 101.63.

Dear Chairwoman John:

We were notified by your office that pursuant to O.R.C. 101.63, the Secretary of State's office was requested to appear before the House State and Local Government Committee for the General Assembly's Occupational Licensure Review. The Secretary of State's office is not required to complete the Occupational License questionnaire as part of the Occupational Licensing board. An occupational licensing board, as defined by section 4798.01 of the Revised Code, issues an occupational license which an individual must possess to perform a lawful occupation. The Secretary of State is not responsible or involved in the professions listed in Title 47 of the Revised Code.

Further, a notary commission is not an occupational license. Rather, a notary commission is a term of office for a notary public. A notary public is appointed and commissioned by the Secretary of State to act as an officer of the state. The role of a notary public is to serve the public as an impartial witness in performing acts related to the signing of important documents. A notary public is a role and duty for the officer of the state, but not an occupation. A notary public may notarize signatures in the scope of their employment such as a paralegal, bank teller, car dealer or court reporter. Title 47 of the Ohio Revised Code governs occupations and professions. These occupations and professions include accountants, attorneys, real estate brokers, athlete agents, and private investigators, but it does not include a notary public or other appointments such as special police officers, judges, or other officers of the state.
