HB33 Creating Consistency for Caretakers

A bill to allow child support to follow the child

HB33

Ensures that child support follow the child and reaches the person caring for the child



Enables support to be redirected back to a parent when circumstances change



Provides notice and opportunity to be heard for all parties



Creates a consistent process to address child support when a caretaker is involved



CURRENT LAW



Different outcomes cause confusion and delay for all involved



Support orders are not redirected or established in all cases where it would be proper



In some counties, appellate case law prevents child support from reaching the person caring for the child



Caretakers are treated inconsistently across the state
