Honorable Chairman Roemer, Vice Chair Lorenz, and Ranking Member Troy,

My name is Adam Bernon. I am a licensed Lead Risk Assessor, actively engaged with the City of Cleveland's Lead Safe program for over two years. In my role, I encounter numerous challenges, from gaining access to units due to uncooperative tenants to aiding landlords in meeting compliance requirements.

I am here to advocate for House Bill 280, a measure that addresses critical barriers in our fight against lead hazards. Currently, there is a significant shortage of RRP-licensed window installers, and the necessary materials are often delayed, sometimes for months, exacerbating the issue. Extending the resubmission deadline to 180 days from the receipt of a deficiency notice would align more realistically with these logistical challenges.

Furthermore, the expansion and modification of the existing tax credit program are crucial. The \$5 million in non-refundable tax credits, if made fully refundable and accessible to various business entities, would markedly propel our efforts.

It is my ambition to see Cleveland not only excel as a state leader but to set a national precedent for creating lead-safe living environments. Your support for HB 280 is pivotal in this pursuit.
