

## SENATE GOVERNMENT OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE – Proponent Testimony SB 23, February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023

Chair Roegner, Vice Chair Antani, Ranking Member Hicks-Hudson, and members of the committee, thank you for holding this hearing and for the opportunity to provide testimony.

My name is Jeff Dillon, and I am the Ohio Legislative Director for Americans for Prosperity (AFP). As one of the largest grassroots organizations in the country, AFP is driving long-term solutions to some of the country's biggest problems. Our organization, and its thousands of activists across Ohio, are dedicated to breaking barriers that stand in the way of people realizing their full potential. Removing or reducing these barriers, in whatever forms they take, helps move our society toward one of mutual benefit, where people succeed by helping others improve their lives and by transforming their communities. Accordingly, I urge you to support and favorably report Senate Bill 23, sponsored by Senator Lang, which would permissively expand political subdivision joint purchasing authority to expressly include purchases for construction services.

As mentioned by Senator Lang during his sponsor testimony, SB 23 will eliminate and reduce barriers by adding clarity to the ORC in light of a 2019 opinion by the Attorney General that has led to uncertainty among some local governments regarding what are permissible uses of joint purchasing authority and what are not. AFP – Ohio supports this legislation because the administration of government functions should be as efficient and cost-effective as possible, and granting local governments the option to essentially pool their resources to maximize capability will allow for optimized fiscal stewardship.

Thank you again, Madame Chair, for the opportunity to offer testimony today. AFP – Ohio supports SB 23, and on behalf of my organization and our affiliated activists, I urge the members of the committee to favorably report this bill. Thank you.
