A BILL

To enact section 123.29 of the Revised Code and to	1
amend Sections 369.10 and 369.314 of Am. Sub.	2
H.B. 64 of the 131st General Assembly, as	3
subsequently amended, to require the Chancellor	4
of Higher Education to create the SmartOhio	5
Financial Literacy Pilot Program at the	6
University of Cincinnati to operate for the	7
2016-2017 school year, to establish the Task	8
Force for Creating Opportunities for Shared	9
Governance on Co-Located Campuses, to provide	10
support for the Ohio Youth Entrepreneur Program	11
at Youngstown State University, to rename the	12
Capitol Theatre of the Vern Riffe Center for	13
Government and the Arts as the Speaker Jo Ann	14
Davidson Theatre, and to make an appropriation.	15

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 123.29 of the Revised Code be 16
enacted to read as follows: 17

Sec. 123.29. The theater in the Vern Riffe center for 18
government and the arts in Columbus, formerly known as the 19
capitol theatre, shall be known as the Speaker Jo Ann Davidson 20
theatre. 21

Section 2. The Speaker Jo Ann Davidson Theatre is 22
successor to, assumes the obligations and authority of, and 23
otherwise continues the Capitol Theatre in the Vern Riffe Center 24
for Government and the Arts. No right, privilege, or remedy, and 25
no duty, liability, or obligation, accrued under the Capitol 26
Theatre is impaired or lost by reason of the renaming and shall 27
be recognized, administered, performed, or enforced by the 28
Speaker Jo Ann Davidson Theatre. 29

Except as otherwise provided in law, whenever the Capitol 30
Theatre of the Vern Riffe Center for Government and the Arts is 31
referred to in a statute, rule, contract, or other instrument, 32
the reference is deemed to refer to the Speaker Jo Ann Davidson 33
Theatre. 34

Section 3. (A) The Chancellor of Higher Education shall 35
create the SmartOhio Financial Literacy Pilot Program at the 36
University of Cincinnati to operate for the 2016-2017 school 37
year. Under the pilot program, the Chancellor shall provide 38
funding, as appropriated by the General Assembly for this 39
purpose, for the development and implementation of regional 40
financial education programs with the goal of increasing 41
financial literacy for students in grades kindergarten through 42

eight. 43

(B) The regional financial education programs shall be 44
operated by the University of Cincinnati and delivered through a 45
joint partnership between the Ohio Council on Economic Education 46
and OSU Extension. 47

The partnership shall do both of the following with regard 48
to the programs: 49

(1) Develop curricula and instructional materials that do 50
all of the following: 51

(a) Provide age-appropriate education to students in 52
grades kindergarten through eight to promote financial literacy 53
at an early age; 54

(b) Enable students to develop the skills necessary to 55
develop and maintain a budget, understand credit and 56
investments, and use the banking system; 57

(c) Integrate financial literacy education into the 58
existing curriculum on mathematics and English language arts. 59

(2) Provide teacher training and professional development 60
opportunities on these curricula and instructional materials to 61
enable teachers across the state to provide financial literacy 62
education to students in grades kindergarten through eight. 63

Section 4. (A) There is hereby established the Task Force 64
for Creating Opportunities for Shared Governance on Co-Located 65
Campuses. The Task Force is charged with creating a model for 66
shared governance for co-located campuses. A co-located campus 67
is one in which a community college and regional branch of a 68
four-year institution of higher education are located on the 69
same or adjoining campuses. The model created by the Task Force 70

is to emphasize shared administration, student services, 71
maintenance, facility usage, and other shared governance to 72
better serve the students while preserving the individual 73
academic missions of the college and institution. 74

(B) The Task Force shall consist of nine members as 75
follows: 76

(1) A member of the Senate appointed by the President of 77
the Senate; 78

(2) A member of the House of Representatives appointed by 79
the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 80

(3) A member of the Ohio Board of Regents appointed by the 81
Governor, which member shall serve as chairperson of the Task 82
Force; 83

(4) A board member of a four-year institution of higher 84
education that has a co-located branch campus, appointed by the 85
President of the Senate; 86

(5) A board member of a two-year community college that is 87
located on a co-located campus, appointed by the Speaker of the 88
House of Representatives; 89

(6) An administrator of a four-year institution of higher 90
education that has a co-located branch campus, appointed by the 91
President of the Senate; 92

(7) An administrator of a two-year community college that 93
is located on a co-located campus, appointed by the Speaker of 94
the House of Representatives; 95

(8) One representative of small businesses, appointed by 96
the President of the Senate; 97

(9) One representative of large businesses, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.	98 99
(C) (1) Members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation, but actual expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties, including mileage, may be reimbursed by the Department of Higher Education.	100 101 102 103
(2) Vacancies on the Task Force shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.	104 105
(D) The Department of Higher Education shall provide necessary staff, facilities, supplies, and services to the Task Force.	106 107 108
(E) The Task Force shall submit its recommended model to the Governor, the President and Minority Leader of the Senate, and the Speaker and Minority Leader of the House of Representatives not later than November 1, 2016. Upon submission of the model, the Task Force shall cease to exist.	109 110 111 112 113

Of the foregoing appropriation item 235533, Higher Education Program Support, \$250,000 in each fiscal year shall be used by The Ohio State University to support its hosting of the annual Special Olympics Ohio Summer Games.

Of the foregoing appropriation item 235533, Higher Education Program Support, \$100,000 in each fiscal year shall be used to support program development and equipment purchase expenses for the Cores + Connections program at the Cleveland Institute of Art.

Of the foregoing appropriation item 235533, Higher Education Program Support, \$100,000 in each fiscal year shall be

used by Eastern Gateway Community College to establish and 284
provide scholarships under the Energy Sector Scholarship Pilot 285
Program. The program shall seek to incentivize and connect high 286
school students with scholarship opportunities to pursue careers 287
in the oil and gas industry in Ohio. Staff from Eastern Gateway 288
Community College shall provide administration, outreach, and 289
marketing for the program. 290

Of the foregoing appropriation item 235533, Higher 291
Education Program Support, \$75,000 in each fiscal year shall be 292
distributed to the Ohio University Leadership Project. 293

Of the foregoing appropriation item 235533, Higher 294
Education Program Support, \$75,000 in each fiscal year shall be 295
used to establish the Customized Employee Recruitment Workforce 296
Program at Sinclair Community College. 297

Of the foregoing appropriation item 235533, Higher 298
Education Program Support, \$220,000 in fiscal year 2016 shall be 299
used by Wright State University for security upgrades necessary 300
for hosting the presidential debate in the fall of 2016. 301

Of the foregoing appropriation item 235533, Higher 302
Education Program Support, \$318,000 in fiscal year 2017 shall be 303
used to support the SmartOhio Financial Literacy Pilot Program 304
at the University of Cincinnati. 305

Of the foregoing appropriation item 235533, Higher 306
Education Program Support, \$500,000 in fiscal year 2017 shall be 307
used to support the Ohio Youth Entrepreneur Program at 308
Youngstown State University. 309
