A BILL

To amend section 3313.534 of the Revised Code with	1
respect to school district policies for violent,	2
disruptive, or inappropriate behavior.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3313.534 of the Revised Code be	4
amended to read as follows:	5
Sec. 3313.534. No later than July 1, 1998, the (A) The	6
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board of education of each city, exempted village, and local	7
school district shall adopt a <u>e</u>liminate any p olicy of zero	8
tolerance for violent, disruptive, or inappropriate behavior,	9
including excessive truancy, and establish strategies to address	10
such behavior that range from prevention to intervention adopted	11
under this section as it existed prior to the effective date of	12
this amendment. Thereafter, no board shall adopt or readopt any	13
policy of zero tolerance for such behavior. Each board shall	14
instead adopt a policy that allows for many factors to be	15
considered prior to the suspension or expulsion of a student.	16
The policy shall establish alternative strategies, including	17
prevention, intervention, restorative justice, peer mediation,	18
and counseling, to address both of the following:	19

(1) Discipline for student behavioral problems; 20 (2) Harassment, intimidation, and bullying, as defined by 21 section 3313.666 of the Revised Code. 22 (B) No later than July 1, 1999, each of the big eight 23 school districts, as defined in section 3314.02 of the Revised 24 Code, shall establish under section 3313.533 of the Revised Code 25 at least one alternative school to meet the educational needs of 26 students with severe discipline problems, including, but not 27 limited to, excessive truancy, excessive disruption in the 28 classroom, and multiple suspensions or expulsions. Any other 29 school district that attains after that date a significantly 30 substandard graduation rate, as defined by the department of 31 education, shall also establish such an alternative school under 32 that section. 33 34

Section 2. That existing section 3313.534 of the Revised Code is hereby repealed.

Section 3. Zero tolerance policies often punish a student 36 with a behavioral problem twice by both expelling that student 37 and preventing that student's education during the expulsion. 38 Therefore, in passing this act, it is the intent of the General 39 Assembly to provide support for students with behavioral 40 problems and to ensure that such students remain in school. 41

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
