A BILL

То	amend section 3717.05 and to enact section	1
	3717.14 of the Revised Code to generally allow	2
	the owner of a retail food establishment or food	3
	service operation to allow dogs in an outdoor	4
	dining area of the establishment or operation.	5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3717.05 be amended and section	6
3717.14 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 3717.05. (A) The director of agriculture and the	8
director of health shall adopt rules establishing standards for	9
safe food handling and sanitation in retail food establishments	10
and food service operations. The rules shall be compiled as the	11
Ohio uniform food safety code, which shall be used by the	12
licensors of retail food establishments and food service	13
operations in ensuring the safe handling of food in this state.	14
All scientific provisions of the Ohio uniform food safety code	15

that are relevant to both retail food establishments and food 16 service operations shall be adopted by the director of 17 agriculture and the director of health with each other's 18 19 concurrence. The Ohio uniform food safety code shall include the 20 following: 21 (1) Criteria for sanitation in retail food establishments 22 and food service operations; 23 24 (2) Criteria for equipment in retail food establishments and food service operations; 25 26 (3) Criteria for reviewing the facility layout and equipment specifications of retail food establishments and food 27 service operations; 28 (4) A definition of "potentially hazardous" as it pertains 29 to food in retail food establishments and to food in food 30 31 service operations; (5) Criteria to be used in evaluating the primary business 32 of a person or government entity for purposes of determining 33 whether the person or entity should be licensed as a retail food 34 establishment or food service operation. 35 (B) (1) Except as provided in division divisions (B) (2) and 36 (3) of this section, if a model food code is established by the 37 United States food and drug administration, the Ohio uniform 38 food safety code shall be based on the most current version of 39 the food and drug administration's model food code. If the food 40 and drug administration adopts, modifies, or rescinds a 41 provision in the model food code, not later than twelve months 42 after the administration's action, the director of agriculture 43 and director of health shall adopt, amend, or rescind provisions 44

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in the Ohio uniform food safety code to ensure that it continues 45 to conform with the model food code. 46 (2) The Ohio uniform food safety code may contain or omit 47 provisions that do not correspond to the food and drug 48 administration's model food code if the director of agriculture 49 or the director of health, with each other's concurrence, 50 determines either of the following: 51 (a) That rules can be adopted under this chapter that 52 provide protection at least as effective as that which would be 53 provided by basing the rules on the model food code; 54 55 (b) That local conditions warrant the adoption of standards that are different from the model food code. 56 (3) The Ohio uniform food safety code shall contain the 57 rules adopted under section 3717.14 of the Revised Code 58 notwithstanding the content of the United States food and drug 59 administration's model food code. 60 Sec. 3717.14. (A) (1) A retail food establishment or food 61 service operation may allow a person to bring a dog in an 62 outdoor dining area of the establishment or operation in 63 accordance with this section. However, if the dog is a service 64 animal, no establishment or operation shall refuse to allow the 65 dog in the outdoor dining area unless such refusal is authorized 66 under federal and state laws governing service animals. 67 (2) The director of agriculture and the director of health 68 shall adopt rules allowing dogs in an outdoor dining area of a 69 retail food establishment or food service operation. The rules 70 shall include authorization for the directors to prohibit dogs 71 in an outdoor dining area of an establishment or operation 72 during a public health emergency. 73

(B) If an establishment or operation allows a person to	74	
bring a dog in an outdoor dining area of the establishment or	75	
operation, the establishment or operation shall do all of the	76	
following:	77	
(1) Adopt a policy that requires patrons to control their	78	
dog, whether with a leash or otherwise, while the dog is in the	79	
outdoor dining area. The establishment or operation shall	80	
enforce the policy adopted under division (B)(1) of this	81	
section.	82	
(2) Not allow the person to take the dog into the outdoor	83	
dining area through any of the establishment's or operation's	84	
indoor areas;	85	
(3) Comply with both of the following:	86	
(a) All sanitation standards established in the Ohio	87	
uniform food safety code other than those standards that	88	
prohibit dogs in an outdoor dining area of an establishment or		
operation;	90	
(b) Any other standard established under this chapter.	91	
<u>(C) No person shall bring a dog in an outdoor dining area</u>	92	
of an establishment or operation if the dog is not properly	93	
vaccinated in accordance with all state and local laws.	94	
(D) As used in this section, "service animal" means any	95	
dog that is individually trained for the benefit of an	96	
individual with a disability to do work or perform tasks that	97	
are directly related to the individual's disability.	98	
Section 2. That existing section 3717.05 of the Revised	99	
Code is hereby repealed.	100
