Sec. 113.60. As used in sections 113.60 to 113.69 of the Revised Code:	9 10
(A) "Expenditure" means a payment, distribution, loan,	11
advance, reimbursement, deposit, or gift of money from a state	12
entity to any vendor and that is processed through the Ohio	13
administrative knowledge system.	14
(B) "Political subdivision" means a county, city, village,	15

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(2) Receives reimbursement from a state entity for any	45

Sec. 113.61. The treasurer of state shall establish and	47
maintain the Ohio state government expenditure database. The	48
database shall be available on the web site of the treasurer of	49
state and shall include information about expenditures made in	50
each fiscal year that commences after the effective date of this	51
section.	52
The database shall be accessible by members of the public	53
without charge.	54
State entities shall assist the treasurer of state in the	55
development, establishment, operation, storage, hosting, and	56
support of the database at no cost to the treasurer of state.	57
State entities shall comply with sections 113.60 to 113.69 of	58
the Revised Code using existing resources. No state entity shall	59
charge the treasurer of state for any costs arising from	60
compliance with those sections.	61
