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**A BILL**

To amend sections 4501.21 and 4503.772 and to enact 1  
section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to create 2  
the "Padua Franciscan High School" license 3  
plate. 4

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That sections 4501.21 and 4503.772 be amended 5  
and section 4503.873 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as 6  
follows: 7

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 8  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 9  
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 10  
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 11  
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 12  
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.50, 4503.501, 13  
4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 4503.521, 4503.522, 14  
4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 4503.528, 4503.529, 15  
4503.531, 4503.534, 4503.545, 4503.55, 4503.551, 4503.552, 16  
4503.553, 4503.554, 4503.555, 4503.556, 4503.561, 4503.562, 17  
4503.564, 4503.565, 4503.576, 4503.577, 4503.591, 4503.592, 18  
4503.67, 4503.68, 4503.69, 4503.701, 4503.702, 4503.71, 19

4503.711, 4503.712, 4503.713, 4503.715, 4503.72, 4503.722, 20  
4503.73, 4503.732, 4503.733, 4503.74, 4503.75, 4503.751, 21  
4503.752, 4503.763, 4503.85, 4503.86, 4503.87, 4503.871, 22  
4503.873, 4503.874, 4503.877, 4503.89, 4503.90, 4503.901, 23

4503.98 of the Revised Code. 25

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 26  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 27

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 28  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 29  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 30  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 31  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 32  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 33  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 34  
other abortion-related activities. 35

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 36  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 37  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 38  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 39  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 40  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 41  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 42  
other money in that fund. 43

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 44  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 45  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 46  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 47

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 48

receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 49  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 50  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 51  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 52  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 53  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 54  
directly to their clients. 55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 57  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 58  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 59  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 60

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 61  
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 62  
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 63  
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 64  
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 65

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 66  
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 67  
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 68  
its research and other programs. 69

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 70  
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 71  
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 72  
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74  
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 75  
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 76  
contributions for its research and other programs. 77

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for scholarships and other educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those contributions for scholarships for students who are members of that organization.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the

university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 107  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 108  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 109  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 110  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 111  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 112  
funds as provided in this section. 113

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 114  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 115  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 116  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 117  
cyclists of all ages. 118

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 119  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 120  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial,  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 121  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 122  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 123  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 124  
125

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 126  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 127  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 128  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 129  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 130

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 131  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 132  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 133  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 134  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 135

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty-four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and the improvement of patient outcomes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 166  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 167  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 168  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 169  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 170  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 171

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 172  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 173  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 174  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 175  
families. 176

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 177  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 178  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 179  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 180  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 181  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 182  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 183  
destination. 184

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 185  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 186  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 187  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 188  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 189

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 190  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 191  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 192  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 193  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 194  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 195

section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 196  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 197  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 198  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 199  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 200

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 201  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 202  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 203

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 204  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 205  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 206  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 207  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 208  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 209  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 210  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 211  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 212  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 213  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 214  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 215  
under this section. 216

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 217  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 218  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 219  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 220  
programs. 221

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 222  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 223  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 224  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 225



The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace legends to inspire future leaders.

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each contribution the registrar receives under that section that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team located in the county of that sports commission and that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective of the county of residence of an applicant.

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (G) of that section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, which shall use the contributions for the protection and preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in

Ohio and for educational programs.	286
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.	287 288 289 290 291
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of America. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 317  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 318  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 319  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 320  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 321  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 322  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 323

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 324  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 325  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 326  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 327  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 328  
in the line of duty. 329

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 330  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 331  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 332  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 333  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 334

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 335  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 336  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 337  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 338  
families. 339

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 340  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 341  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 342  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 343

Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 344  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 345  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 346  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 347  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 348  
participating in that program. 349

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 350  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 351  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 352  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 353

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 354  
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 355  
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 356  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 357  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 358

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 359  
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 360  
Siegel & Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 361  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 362  
Cleveland, Ohio. 363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 364  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 365  
Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in 366  
whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 367  
resides. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 369  
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 370  
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 371  
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 372

4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 373  
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 374

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 375  
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 376  
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 377  
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 378  
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 379  
rotary foundation. 380

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 381  
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 382  
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 383  
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 384  
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 385

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 386  
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 387  
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 388  
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 389

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 390  
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 391  
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 392  
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 393  
connection. 394

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 395  
receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 396  
Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 397  
research projects. 398

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 399  
receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 400  
Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 401

contributions solely to promote and support the historical 402  
preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 403  
state. 404

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 405  
receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 406  
Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 407  
contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth 408  
baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 410  
receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 411  
Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 412  
contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 413  
providing services to the school district's students that assist 414  
in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 415  
of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 416  
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 417  
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 418  
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 419  
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 420  
superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 421  
discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 422  
school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 423  
that the school district hires to provide those services. The 424  
school district also may use the contributions it receives to 425  
pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 426  
training in providing such services to the students of the 427  
school district. The school district shall ensure that any 428  
charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 429  
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 430  
Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 431  
contributions it receives for any other purpose. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433  
receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to 434  
Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal 435  
corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 436  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 437  
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 438  
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 439  
students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 440  
emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 441  
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 442  
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 443  
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 444  
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 445  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 446  
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 447  
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 448  
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 449  
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 450  
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 451  
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 452  
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 456  
receives pursuant to section 4503.874 of the Revised Code to St. 457  
Edward high school located in the municipal corporation of 458  
Lakewood. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 459  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 460  
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 461  
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 462  
students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 463



emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 464  
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 465  
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 466  
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 467  
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 468  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 469  
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 470  
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 471  
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 472  
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 473

bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 486  
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 487  
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 488  
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school 489  
district superintendent or, in the school district 490  
superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 491  
appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 492  
organizations that the school district hires to provide those 493  
services. The school district also may use the contributions it 494

receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school 495  
district to receive training in providing such services to the 496  
students of the school district. The school district shall 497  
ensure that any charitable organization that is hired by the 498  
district is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 499  
501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school district 500  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 501  
purpose. 502

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 503  
receives pursuant to section 4503.89 of the Revised Code to the 504  
American red cross of greater Columbus on behalf of the Ohio 505  
chapters of the American red cross, which shall use the 506  
contributions for disaster readiness, preparedness, and response 507  
programs on a statewide basis. 508

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 509  
receives pursuant to section 4503.90 of the Revised Code to the 510  
nationwide children's hospital foundation. 511

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 512  
receives pursuant to section 4503.901 of the Revised Code to the 513  
Ohio association for pupil transportation, which shall use the 514  
money to support transportation programs, provide training to 515  
school transportation professionals, and support other 516  
initiatives for school transportation safety. 517

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 518  
receives pursuant to section 4503.902 of the Revised Code to St. 519  
Ignatius high school located in the municipal corporation of 520  
Cleveland. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 521  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 522  
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 523  
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 524

students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 525  
emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 526  
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 527  
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 528  
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 529  
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 530  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 531  
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 532  
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 533  
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 534  
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 535  
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 536  
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 537  
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 538  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 539  
purpose. 540

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 541  
receives pursuant to section 4503.903 of the Revised Code to the 542  
Brecksville-Broadview Heights city school district. The school 543  
district shall use the contributions it receives to pay the 544  
expenses it incurs in providing services to the school 545  
district's students that assist in developing or maintaining the 546  
mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services 547  
provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in 548  
defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the 549  
counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating 550  
violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. 551  
The school district superintendent or, in the school district 552  
superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 553  
appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 554  
organizations that the school district hires to provide those 555

services. The school district also may use the contributions it 556  
receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school 557  
district to receive training in providing such services to the 558  
students of the school district. The school district shall 559

district shall use the contributions it receives to pay the 568  
expenses it incurs in providing services to the school 569  
district's students that assist in developing or maintaining the 570  
mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services 571  
provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in 572  
defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the 573  
counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating 574  
violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. 575  
The school district superintendent or, in the school district 576  
superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 577

incorporation and for the benefit of servicemembers of the armed 593  
forces of the United States and their families when they are in 594  
financial need. 595

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 596  
receives pursuant to section 4503.94 of the Revised Code to the 597  
Michelle's leading star foundation, which shall use the money 598  
solely to fund the rental, lease, or purchase of the simulated 599  
driving curriculum of the Michelle's leading star foundation by 600  
boards of education of city, exempted village, local, and joint 601  
vocational school districts. 602

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 603  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 604  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 605  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 606  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 607

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 608  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 609  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 610  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 611  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 612

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 613  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 614  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 615

distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 616  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 617  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 618  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 619  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 620

**Sec. 4503.772.** (A) Each school or school district for 621  
which a license plate is established under section 4503.871, 622  
4503.873, 4503.874, 4503.877, 4503.902, 4503.903, or 4503.904 of 623  
the Revised Code shall produce an annual report containing all 624  
of the following information: 625

(1) The total amount received during the prior year from 626  
license plate contributions; 627

(2) An itemized list of each expenditure, and a 628  
description of each expenditure, made using funds received from 629  
license plate contributions during the prior year; 630

(3) The total percentage of spending that was used to 631  
provide services to students to assist in developing and 632  
maintaining mental and emotional well-being. 633

(B) (1) Not later than the first day of December of each 634  
year, the school or school district shall submit the report to 635  
the department of mental health and addiction services and to 636  
the registrar of motor vehicles. If a school or school district 637  
fails to submit the report by the thirty-first day of December 638  
of any year, the registrar shall begin transmitting the 639  
contribution for each registration involving the license plate 640  
for that school or school district to the treasurer of state for 641  
deposit into the general revenue fund, instead of for deposit in 642  
the license plate contribution fund created in section 4501.21 643  
of the Revised Code. 644

(2) Immediately after receiving a report from a school or school district for which contributions are being diverted under division (B)(1) of this section, the registrar shall resume transmitting the contributions received for that license plate to the treasurer of state for deposit into the license plate contribution fund and for later distribution to the school or school district.

Sec. 4503.873. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, motorcycle, cab-enclosed motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, motor scooter, or other vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle and issuance of "Padua Franciscan High School" license plates. The application may be combined with a request for a special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code.

Upon receipt of the completed application and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Padua Franciscan High School" license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code.

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily inscribed on the license plates, "Padua Franciscan High School" license plates shall display an appropriate logo and words selected by Padua Franciscan high school and that are approved by the registrar. "Padua Franciscan High School" license plates shall display county identification stickers that identify the county of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised Code.

(B) "Padua Franciscan High School" license plates and a validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle under this section; payment of the regular license tax as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as provided in division (C) (1) of this section; and compliance with all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor vehicles.

(C) (1) For each application for registration and registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of thirty dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code.

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing of "Padua Franciscan High School" license plates, into the state treasury to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code.

(D) Sections 4503.77 and 4503.78 of the Revised Code do not apply to license plates issued under this section.

**Section 2.** That existing sections 4501.21 and 4503.772 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.
