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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact sections 1  
4503.703 and 4503.704 of the Revised Code to 2  
create the "West High School Alumni Association" 3  
license plate and the "Central High School 4  
Alumni Association" license plate. 5

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and sections 6  
4503.703 and 4503.704 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as 7  
follows: 8

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 9  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 10  
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 11  
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 12  
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 13  
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911, 14  
4503.50, 4503.501, 4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 15  
4503.521, 4503.522, 4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 16  
4503.528, 4503.529, 4503.531, 4503.534, 4503.545, 4503.55, 17  
4503.551, 4503.552, 4503.553, 4503.554, 4503.555, 4503.556, 18

4503.561, 4503.562, 4503.564, 4503.565, 4503.566, 4503.576, 19  
4503.577, 4503.591, 4503.592, 4503.594, 4503.67, 4503.68, 20  
4503.69, 4503.701, 4503.702, 4503.703, 4503.704, 4503.71, 21

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 30  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 31

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 32  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 33  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 34  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 35  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 36  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 37  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 38  
other abortion-related activities. 39

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 40  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 41  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 42  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 43  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 44  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 45  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 46  
other money in that fund. 47

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 48

pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for scholarships and other educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 107  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 108  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 109  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 110  
that organization. 111

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 112  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 113  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 114  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 115  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 116  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 117  
scholarship fund. 118

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 119  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 120  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 121  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 122  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 123  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 124  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 125  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 126  
funds as provided in this section. 127

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 128  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 129  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 130  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 131  
cyclists of all ages. 132

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 133  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 134  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 135  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 136

of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 137  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 138  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 139

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 140  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 141  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 142  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 143  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 144

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 145  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 146  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 147  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 148  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 149

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 150  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 151  
United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 152  
four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 153  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 154  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 155  
sponsors within this state. 156

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 157  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 158  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 159  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 160  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 161  
activities. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 164  
Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the 165

money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it 166  
incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the 167  
provision of services to children, young adults, and families in 168  
this state. 169

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 170  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 171  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 172  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 173  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 174  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 175  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 176  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 177  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 178

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 179  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 180  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 181  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 182  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 183  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 184  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 185

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 186  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 187  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 188  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 189  
families. 190

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 191  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 192  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 193  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 194  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 195

hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 196  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 197  
destination. 198

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 199  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 200  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 201  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 202  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 203

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 204  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 205  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 206  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 207  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 208  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 209  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 210  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 211  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 212  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 213  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 216  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 217

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 218  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 219  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 220  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 221  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 222  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 223  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 224  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 225



Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 226  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 227  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 228  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 229  
under this section. 230

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 231  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 232  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 233  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 234  
programs. 235

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 236  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 237  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 238  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 239

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 240  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 241  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 242  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 243  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 244

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 245  
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 246  
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 247  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 248  
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 249  
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 250  
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 251  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 252  
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 253  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 254  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 255

such payments are to be made. 256

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 257  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 258  
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 259  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 260  
river watershed. 261

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 262  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to 263  
Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute 264  
to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve. 265

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 266  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 267  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 268  
the money in support of the park. 269

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 270  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 271  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 272  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 273

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 274  
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 275  
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 276  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 277  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 278  
local beekeeping programs. 279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 280  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 281  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 282  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 283  
legends to inspire future leaders. 284

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 285  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 286  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 287  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 288  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 289  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 290  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 291  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 292

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 293  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 294  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 295  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 296  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 297  
(G) of that section. 298

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 299  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 300  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 301  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 302  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 303  
Ohio and for educational programs. 304

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 305  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 306  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 307  
supporting cancer research. 308

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 309  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 310  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 311  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 312  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 313

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the west high school alumni association, which shall use the contributions in furtherance of the association's mission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the central high school alumni association, which shall use the contributions in furtherance of the association's mission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 343  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 344  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 345  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 346

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 347  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 348  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 349  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 350  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 351  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 352  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 353

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 354  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 355  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 356  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 357  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 358  
in the line of duty. 359

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 360  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 361  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 362  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 363  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 365  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 366  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 367  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 368  
families. 369

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 370  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 371

organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 372  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 373  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 374  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 375  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 376  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 377  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 378  
participating in that program. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 380  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 381  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 382  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 383

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 384  
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 385  
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 386  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 387  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 388

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 389  
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 390  
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 391  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 392  
Cleveland, Ohio. 393

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 394  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 395  
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 396  
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 397  
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 398  
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 399  
resides. 400

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the rotary foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history connection.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the Medina county historical society, which shall use those

contributions to distribute between the various historical 430  
societies and museums in Medina county. 431

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 432  
receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 433  
Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 434  
research projects. 435

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 436  
receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 437  
Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 438  
contributions solely to promote and support the historical 439  
preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 440  
state. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 442  
receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 443  
Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 444  
contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth 445  
baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 446

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 447  
receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 448  
Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 449  
contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 450  
providing services to the school district's students that assist 451  
in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 452  
of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 453  
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 454  
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 455  
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 456  
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 457  
superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 458  
discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 459



school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 460  
that the school district hires to provide those services. The 461  
school district also may use the contributions it receives to 462  
pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 463  
training in providing such services to the students of the 464  
school district. The school district shall ensure that any 465  
charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 466  
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 467  
Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 468  
contributions it receives for any other purpose. 469

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 470  
receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to 471  
Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal 472  
corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 473  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 474  
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 475  
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 476  
students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 477  
emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 478  
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 479  
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 480  
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 481  
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 482  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 483  
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 484  
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 485  
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 486  
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 487  
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 488  
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 489  
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 490

Not later than the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this section the investment income the fund earned the previous calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity received from the fund during the previous calendar year.

Sec. 4503.703. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle and issuance of "West High School Alumni Association" license plates. The application may be combined with a request for a special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code.
