To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.578 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants	8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to	9
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495,	10
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911,	11

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cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	31
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	32
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	33
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of	34
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or	35
other abortion-related activities.	36
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	37
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the	38
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall	39
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that	40
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend	41
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same	42
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends	43

The registrar shall pay the contributions received45pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism46society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs47and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.48

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 49 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 50 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 51 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 52 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 53 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 54 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 55 directly to their clients. 56

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar67receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the68St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for69its research and other programs.70

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 71 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 72 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 73 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 74

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 75 receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 76 children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 77

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contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 79 receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 80 the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 81 raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 82 pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 83

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 84 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 85 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 86 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 87 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 95 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 96 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 97 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 98 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 100 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 101 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 102 scholarships and other educational activities. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received104pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the105organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those106

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contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 107 that organization. 108

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 109 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 110 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 111 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 112 section. A university or college that receives contributions 113 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 114 scholarship fund. 115

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 116 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 117 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 118 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 119 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 120 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 121 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 122 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 123 funds as provided in this section. 124

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 125 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 126 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 127 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 128 cyclists of all ages. 129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 130 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 131 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 132 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 133 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 134 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 135 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 137 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 138 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 139 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 140 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 141

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar142receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the143Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the144contributions only to promote and support the football team of145Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.146

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 147 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 148 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 149 four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 150 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 151 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 152 sponsors within this state. 153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 154 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 155 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 156 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 157 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 158 activities. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 161 Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the 162 money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it 163 incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the 164 provision of services to children, young adults, and families in 165 this state. 166

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 167 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 168 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 169 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 170 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 171 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 172 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 173 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 174 the improvement of patient outcomes. 175

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 176 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 177 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 178 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 179 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 180 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 181 personnel, veterans, and their families. 182

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 183 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 184 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 185 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 186 families. 187

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 188 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 189 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 190 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 191 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 192 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 193 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 194 destination. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 196

the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code197to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use198the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and199programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.200

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 201 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 202 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 203 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 204 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 205 206 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 207 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 208 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 209 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 210 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 216 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 217 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 218 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 219 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 220 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 221 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 222 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 223 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 224 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 225 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 226

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under this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar233receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the234western reserve historical society, which shall use the235contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.236

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar237receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the238Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple239negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the240contributions for charitable and educational purposes.241

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 242 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 243 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 244 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 245 246 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 247 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 248 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 249 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 250 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 251 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 252 such payments are to be made. 253

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar254receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the255

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Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the256expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning257river watershed.258

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar259receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to260Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute261to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.262

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 263 receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 264 conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 265 the money in support of the park. 266

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar267receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the268Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the269contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.270

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 271 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 272 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 273 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 274 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 275 local beekeeping programs. 276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar277receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the278national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the279contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace280legends to inspire future leaders.281

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar282receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to283keep Ohio beautiful, which shall use the contributions towards284

its mission of empowering Ohio communities to take greater	285
responsibility for improving the local environment through	286

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 318 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 319 great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 320 America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 321 equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 322 the girl scouts. 323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar324receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the325Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council326shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner327throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 333 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 334 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 335 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 336 charitable purposes. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar338receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the339fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall340deposit the fees into its general account to be used for341purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.342

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 343 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 344 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 345 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 346 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 347 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 348 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 349

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 350 pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 351 concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 352 contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 353 to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 354 in the line of duty. 355

The registrar shall pay the contributions received356pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater357Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those358contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in359the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.360

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361 receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 362 fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 363 to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 364 families. 365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 366 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 367 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 368 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 369 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 370 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 371 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 372 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent373children, and for the training and supervision of persons374participating in that program.375

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 376 receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 377 Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 378 contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 380 receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 381 Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 382 contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 383 of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 384

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 385 receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 386 Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 387 commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 388 Cleveland, Ohio. 389

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 390 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 391 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 392 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 393 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 394 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 395 resides. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar397receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the398Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the399moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section4004503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written401

agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar403receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the404rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston,405Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and406used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the407rotary foundation.408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar409receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the410Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the411contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained412under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar414receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to415buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the416contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.417

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 418 receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 419 Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 420 maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 421 connection. 422

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar423receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the424Medina county historical society, which shall use those425contributions to distribute between the various historical426societies and museums in Medina county.427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar428receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the429Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area430

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 433 Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 434 contributions solely to promote and support the historical 435 preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 438 receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 439 Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 440 contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth 441 baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 442

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 443 receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 444 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 445 446 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school district's students that assist 447 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 448 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 449 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 450 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 451 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 452 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 453 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 454 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 455 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 456 that the school district hires to provide those services. The 457 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 458 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 459 training in providing such services to the students of the 460

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school district. The school district shall ensure that any461charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt462from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the463Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the464contributions it receives for any other purpose.465

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 466 receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to 467 Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal 468 corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 469 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 470 students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 471 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 472 473 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 474 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 475 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 476 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 477 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 478 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 479 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 480 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 481 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 482 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 483 services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 484 organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 485 subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 486 shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 487 purpose. 488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar489receives pursuant to section 4503.874 of the Revised Code to St.490Edward high school located in the municipal corporation of491

Lakewood. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 492 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 493 students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 494 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 495 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 496 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 497 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 498 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 499 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 500 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 501 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 502 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 503 services. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger805car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other806vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles807may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle808and issuance of "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license plates.809

The application may be combined with a request for a 810 special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 811 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application 812 and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of 813 this section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 814 appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Keep Ohio 815 Beautiful" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 816 validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 817 the Revised Code. 818

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 819 inscribed on the license plates, "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license 820 plates shall display an appropriate logo and words selected by 821 representatives of keep Ohio beautiful and that are approved by 822 the registrar. "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license plates shall 823 display county identification stickers that identify the county 824 of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 825 Code. 826
