A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1
4503.578 of the Revised Code to create the "Keep 2
Ohio Beautiful" license plate. 3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4
4503.578 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 9
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 10
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911, 11
4503.50, 4503.501, 4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 12
4503.521, 4503.522, 4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 13
4503.528, 4503.529, 4503.531, 4503.534, 4503.545, 4503.55, 14
4503.551, 4503.552, 4503.553, 4503.554, 4503.555, 4503.556, 15

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 27
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 28

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 29
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 30
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 31
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 32
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 33
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 34
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 35
other abortion-related activities. 36

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 37
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 38
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 39
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 40
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 41
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 42
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 43
other money in that fund. 44

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 45
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 46
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 47
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 48

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the

contributions for its research and other programs. 78

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 79
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 80
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 81
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 82
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 83

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 84
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 85
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 86
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 87
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 89
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 90
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 91
contributions into its general account to be used for 92
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 93
America foundation. 94

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 95
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 96
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 97
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 98
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 100
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 101
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 102
scholarships and other educational activities. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 105
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 106

contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 107
that organization. 108

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 109
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 110
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 111
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 112
section. A university or college that receives contributions 113
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 114
scholarship fund. 115

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 116
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 117
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 118
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 119
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 120
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 121
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 122
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 123
funds as provided in this section. 124

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 125
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 126
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 127
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 128
cyclists of all ages. 129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 130
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 131
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 132
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 133
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 134
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 135
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the lighthouses of fairport harbor.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the contributions only to promote and support the football team of Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty-four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and the improvement of patient outcomes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state, to assist that organization in paying for the charitable activities and programs it sponsors in support of United States military personnel, veterans, and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to

the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 197
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 198
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 199
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 200

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 201
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 202
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 203
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 204
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 205
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 206
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 207
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 208
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 209
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 210
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 212
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 213
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 216
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 217
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 218
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 219
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 220
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 221
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 222
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 223
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 224
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 225
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 226

under this section. 227

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 228
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 229
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 230
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 231
programs. 232

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 233
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 234
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 235
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 236

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 237
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 238
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 239
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 240
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 241

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 242
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 243
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 244
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 245
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 246
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 247
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 248
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 249
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 250
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 251
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 252
such payments are to be made. 253

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 254
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 255

Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 256
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 257
river watershed. 258

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 259
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to 260
Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute 261
to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve. 262

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 263
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 264
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 265
the money in support of the park. 266

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 267
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 268
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 269
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 270

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 271
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 272
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 273
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 274
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 275
local beekeeping programs. 276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 277
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 278
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 279
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 280
legends to inspire future leaders. 281

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 282
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 283
keep Ohio beautiful, which shall use the contributions towards 284

its mission of empowering Ohio communities to take greater 285
responsibility for improving the local environment through 286
litter prevention, beautification, community greening, waste 287
reduction, and recycling. 288

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 289
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 290
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 291
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 292
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 293
commission and that is participating in the license plate 294
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 295
of the county of residence of an applicant. 296

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 297
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 298
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 299
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 300
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 301
(G) of that section. 302

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 303
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 304
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 305
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 306
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 307
Ohio and for educational programs. 308

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 309
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 310
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 311
supporting cancer research. 312

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 313

receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 314
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 315
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 316
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 317

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 318
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 319
great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 320
America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 321
equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 322
the girl scouts. 323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 324
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 325
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 326
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 327
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 329
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 330
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 331
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 332

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 333
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 334
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 335
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 336
charitable purposes. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 338
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 339
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 340
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 341
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 342

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 343
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 344
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 345
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 346
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 347
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 348
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 349

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 350
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 351
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 352
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 353
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 354
in the line of duty. 355

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 356
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 357
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 358
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 359
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 360

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 362
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 363
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 364
families. 365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 366
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 367
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 368
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 369
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 370
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 371
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 372

the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 373
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 374
participating in that program. 375

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 376
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 377
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 378
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 380
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 381
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 382
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 383
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 384

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 385
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 386
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 387
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 388
Cleveland, Ohio. 389

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 390
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 391
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 392
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 393
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 394
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 395
resides. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 397
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 398
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 399
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 400
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 401

agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 402

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 403
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 404
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 405
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 406
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 407
rotary foundation. 408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 409
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 410
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 411
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 412
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 415
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 416
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 417

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 418
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 419
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 420
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 421
connection. 422

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 423
receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 424
Medina county historical society, which shall use those 425
contributions to distribute between the various historical 426
societies and museums in Medina county. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 428
receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 429
Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 430

research projects. 431

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 432
receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 433
Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 434
contributions solely to promote and support the historical 435
preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 436
state. 437

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 438
receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 439
Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 440
contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth 441
baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 442

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 443
receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 444
Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 445
contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 446
providing services to the school district's students that assist 447
in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 448
of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 449
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 450
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 451
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 452
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 453
superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 454
discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 455
school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 456
that the school district hires to provide those services. The 457
school district also may use the contributions it receives to 458
pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 459
training in providing such services to the students of the 460

school district. The school district shall ensure that any 461
charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 462
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 463
Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 464
contributions it receives for any other purpose. 465

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 466
receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to 467
Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal 468
corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 469
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 470
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 471
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 472
students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 473
emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 474
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 475
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 476
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 477
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 478
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 479
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 480
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 481
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 482
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 483
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 484
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 485
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 486
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 487
purpose. 488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 489
receives pursuant to section 4503.874 of the Revised Code to St. 490
Edward high school located in the municipal corporation of 491

Lakewood. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 492
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 493
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 494
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 495
students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 496
emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 497
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 498
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 499
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 500
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 501
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 502
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 503
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 504
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 505

The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to receive training in providing those services. (C) All investment earnings of the license plate 797

Sec. 4503.578. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 805
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 806
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 807
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 808
and issuance of "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license plates. 809

The application may be combined with a request for a 810
special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 811
of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application 812
and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of 813
this section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 814
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Keep Ohio 815
Beautiful" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 816
validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 817
the Revised Code. 818

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 819
inscribed on the license plates, "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license 820
plates shall display an appropriate logo and words selected by 821
representatives of keep Ohio beautiful and that are approved by 822
the registrar. "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license plates shall 823
display county identification stickers that identify the county 824
of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 825
Code. 826

(B) "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license plates and a validation 827

sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 828
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 829
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 830
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 831
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 832
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 833
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 834
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 835
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 836
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 837
vehicles. 838

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 839
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 840
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty 841
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 842
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 843
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 844

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 845
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 846
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 847
of "Keep Ohio Beautiful" license plates, into the state treasury 848
to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund 849
created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 850
