A BILL

То	amend sections 4743.04 and 5903.04 and to enact	1
	section 4743.041 of the Revised Code to require	2
	state occupational licensing agencies, under	3
	certain circumstances, to issue temporary	4
	licenses or certificates to members of the	5
	military and spouses who are licensed in another	6
	jurisdiction and have moved to Ohio for active	7
	duty.	8

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4743.04 and 5903.04 be amended	9
and section 4743.041 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	10
follows:	11
Sec. 4743.04. (A) The renewal of a license or other	12
authorization to practice a trade or profession issued under	13
Title XLVII of the Revised Code is subject to the provisions of	14
section 5903.10 of the Revised Code relating to service in the	15

armed forces.	16
(B) Continuing education requirements applicable to the	17
licensees under Title XLVII of the Revised Code are subject to	18
the provisions of section 5903.12 of the Revised Code relating	19
to active duty military service.	20
(C) A department, agency, or office of this state or of	21
any political subdivision of this state that issues a license or	22
certificate to practice a trade or profession may, pursuant to	23
rules adopted by the department, agency, or office, issue a	24
temporary license or certificate to practice the trade or	25
profession to a person whose spouse is on active military duty	26
in this state.	27
(D) A department, agency, or office of this state that	28
issues a license or certificate to practice a trade or	29
profession shall issue a temporary license or certificate to	30
practice the trade or profession as provided in section 4743.041	31
of the Revised Code.	32
(E) The issuance of a license or other authorization to	33
practice a trade or profession issued under Title XLVII of the	34
Revised Code is subject to the provisions of section 5903.03 of	35
the Revised Code relating to service in the armed forces.	36
Sec. 4743.041. (A) As used in this section, "uniformed	37
services" has the same meaning as in 10 U.S.C. 101.	38
(B) Pursuant to division (D) of section 4743.04 of the	39
Revised Code, a department, agency, or office of this state	40
shall issue a temporary license or certificate to practice a	41
trade or profession to an individual, provided that all of the	42
<pre>following qualifications are met:</pre>	43
(1) The individual holds a valid license or certificate to	4 4

practice the trade or profession issued by any other state or	
jurisdiction.	46
(2) The license or certificate is current, and the	47
individual is in good standing in the state or jurisdiction of	48
licensure or certification.	49
(3) The individual presents adequate proof to the	50
department, agency, or office that the individual or the	51
individual's spouse is a member of the uniformed services and is	52
on active military duty in this state, or is a military	53
technician dual status under 10 U.S.C. 10216 and was transferred	54
to duty in this state; and	55
(4) The individual presents adequate proof to the	56
department, agency, or office that the individual moved to this	57
state from the state or jurisdiction in which the individual	58
holds a current license or certificate.	59
(C) A department, agency, or office of this state shall,	60
in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code, deny an	61
individual a temporary license or certificate issued under this	62
section or revoke an individual's temporary license or	63
certificate issued under this section if any of the following	64
<pre>circumstances occur:</pre>	65
(1) The individual's license or certificate issued by	66
another state or jurisdiction expires, is revoked, or is not in	67
good standing.	68
(2) Six months have elapsed since the individual or the	69
individual's spouse was ordered to active military duty, or was	70
transferred to duty, in another state or jurisdiction, is	71
discharged from active military duty, or whose standing as a	72
military technician dual status has ended;	73

(3) Six years have elapsed since the individual or the	74
individual's spouse was ordered to serve in an active military	75
duty position, or was transferred to duty, in this state; or	76
(4) With respect to an individual who was eligible for a	77
temporary license under this section as the spouse of a member	78
of the uniformed services, or of a military technician dual	79
status, six months have elapsed since the divorce, dissolution,	80
or annulment of the marriage.	81
(D) A department, agency, or office shall, not less than	82
once per year, verify the standing of a license or certificate	83
that was issued by another state or jurisdiction for each	84
individual to whom it has issued a temporary license or	85
certificate under this section. The department, agency, or	86
office shall revoke the temporary license or certificate of any	87
individual whose license or certificate issued by another state	88
or jurisdiction is not in good standing, or if any of the	89
disqualifying circumstances under division (C) of this section	90
have occurred.	91
(E) An individual with a temporary license or certificate	92
issued under this section may practice the trade or profession	93
in this state only within the scope and practice that the	94
license or certificate from the other state permits, provided	95
that the practice is within the scope of practice allowable for	96
an individual who holds the applicable license or certificate	97
issued by this state.	98
(F) Notwithstanding any other provision of the Revised	99
Code, a department, agency, or office may charge a fee for a	100
temporary license or certificate issued under this section. The	101
fee shall be not more than one-third of the fee charged in this	102
state for the license or certificate, rounded up to the nearest	103

dollar.	
(G) Each department, agency, or office that issues a	105
license or certificate to practice a trade or profession shall	106
adopt rules under Chapter 119. of the Revised Code as necessary	107
to implement this section.	108
(H) Each department, agency, or office that issues a	109
license or certificate to practice a trade or profession, shall,	110
upon the conclusion of the state fiscal year, prepare a report	111
on the number and type of temporary licenses or certificates	112
that were issued during the fiscal year under this section. The	113
report shall be provided to the director of veterans services	114
not later than thirty days after the end of the fiscal year. The	115
director shall compile the reports and make them available to	116
the public.	117
Sec. 5903.04. Each licensing agency shall adopt rules	118
under Chapter 119. of the Revised Code to establish and	119
implement all of the following:	120
(A) A process to obtain from each applicant documentation	121
and additional information necessary to determine if the	122
applicant is a service member or veteran, or the spouse or	123
surviving spouse of a service member or veteran;	124
(B) A process to record, track, and monitor applications	125
that have been received from a service member, veteran, or the	126
spouse or surviving spouse of a service member or veteran; and	127
(C) A process to prioritize and expedite certification or	128
licensing for each applicant who is a service member, veteran,	129
or the spouse or a surviving spouse of a service member or	130
veteran.	131
In establishing these processes, the licensing agency	132

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shall include any special accommodations that may be appropriate	133
for applicants facing imminent deployment, and for applicants	134
for a temporary license or certificate under division (D) of	135
section 4743.04 of the Revised Code.	136
Section 2. That existing sections 4743.04 and 5903.04 of	137
the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	138
