# A BILL

То	amend section 2307.382 of the Revised Code to	1

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

<b>Section 1.</b> That section 2307.382 of the Revised Code be	6	
amended to read as follows:	7	
Sec. 2307.382. (A) A court may exercise personal	8	
jurisdiction over a person who acts directly or by an agent, as	9	
to a cause of action arising from the person's:	10	
(1) Transacting any business in this state;	11	
(2) Contracting to supply services or goods in this state;	12	
(3) Causing tortious injury by an act or omission in this	13	
state;		

- (4) Causing tortious injury in this state by an act or
  omission outside this state if he the person regularly does or
  solicits business, or engages in any other persistent course of
  conduct, or derives substantial revenue from goods used or
  consumed or services rendered in this state;

- (5) Causing injury in this state to any person by breach of warranty expressly or impliedly made in the sale of goods outside this state when he the person might reasonably have expected such person to use, consume, or be affected by the goods in this state, provided that he the person also regularly does or solicits business, or engages in any other persistent course of conduct, or derives substantial revenue from goods used or consumed or services rendered in this state;
- (6) Causing tortious injury in this state to any person by an act outside this state committed with the purpose of injuring persons, when he the person might reasonably have expected that some person would be injured thereby in this state;
- (7) Causing tortious injury to any person by a criminal act, any element of which takes place in this state, which the person commits or in the commission of which the person is guilty of complicity.
- (8) Having an interest in, using, or possessing real property in this state;
- (9) Contracting to insure any person, property, or risk located within this state at the time of contracting.
- (B) For purposes of this section, a person who enters into

  an agreement, as a principal, with a sales representative for

  the solicitation of orders in this state is transacting business

(C) When In addition to a court's exercise of personal	46
jurisdiction under division (A) of this section, a court may	47
exercise personal jurisdiction over a person is based solely	48
upon this section, only a cause of action arising from acts-	49
enumerated in this section may be asserted against him on any	50
basis consistent with the Ohio Constitution and the United	51
States Constitution.
