A BILL

To amend sections 3313.60 and 3319.073 and to enact 1
sections 3314.0310 and 3326.091 of the Revised 2
Code with respect to age-appropriate student 3
instruction in child sexual abuse and sexual 4
violence prevention and in-service staff 5
training in child sexual abuse prevention. 6

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3313.60 and 3319.073 be amended 7
and sections 3314.0310 and 3326.091 of the Revised Code be 8
enacted to read as follows: 9

Sec. 3313.60. Notwithstanding division (D) of section 10
3311.52 of the Revised Code, divisions (A) to (E) of this 11
section do not apply to any cooperative education school 12
district established pursuant to divisions (A) to (C) of section 13
3311.52 of the Revised Code. 14

(A) The board of education of each city, exempted village, 15
and local school district and the board of each cooperative 16
education school district established, pursuant to section 17

3311.521 of the Revised Code, shall prescribe a curriculum for 18
all schools under its control. Except as provided in division 19
(E) of this section, in any such curriculum there shall be 20
included the study of the following subjects: 21

(1) The language arts, including reading, writing, 22
spelling, oral and written English, and literature; 23

(2) Geography, the history of the United States and of 24
Ohio, and national, state, and local government in the United 25
States, including a balanced presentation of the relevant 26
contributions to society of men and women of African, Mexican, 27
Puerto Rican, and American Indian descent as well as other 28
ethnic and racial groups in Ohio and the United States; 29

(3) Mathematics; 30

(4) Natural science, including instruction in the 31
conservation of natural resources; 32

(5) Health education, which shall include instruction in: 33

(a) The nutritive value of foods, including natural and 34
organically produced foods, the relation of nutrition to health, 35
and the use and effects of food additives; 36

(b) The harmful effects of and legal restrictions against 37
the use of drugs of abuse, alcoholic beverages, and tobacco; 38

(c) Venereal disease education, except that upon written 39
request of the student's parent or guardian, a student shall be 40
excused from taking instruction in venereal disease education; 41

(d) In grades kindergarten through six, annual age- 42
appropriate instruction in child sexual abuse prevention, 43
including information on available counseling and resources for 44
children who are sexually abused; 45

(e) In grades kindergarten through six, instruction in personal safety and assault prevention, except that upon written request of the student's parent or guardian, a student shall be excused from taking instruction in personal safety and assault prevention;

~~(e)~~ (f) In grades seven through twelve, age-appropriate instruction in dating violence prevention education and sexual violence prevention education, which shall include instruction in recognizing dating violence warning signs and characteristics of healthy relationships.

In order to assist school districts in developing a dating violence prevention education and sexual violence prevention education curriculum, the department of education shall provide on its web site links to free curricula addressing dating violence prevention and sexual violence prevention.

If the parent or legal guardian of a student less than eighteen years of age submits to the principal of the student's school a written request to examine the dating violence prevention and sexual violence prevention instruction materials used at that school, the principal, within a reasonable period of time after the request is made, shall allow the parent or guardian to examine those materials at that school.

~~(f)~~ (g) Prescription opioid abuse prevention, with an emphasis on the prescription drug epidemic and the connection between prescription opioid abuse and addiction to other drugs, such as heroin;

~~(g)~~ (h) The process of making an anatomical gift under Chapter 2108. of the Revised Code, with an emphasis on the life-saving and life-enhancing effects of organ and tissue donation.

(7) The fine arts, including music;	76
(8) First aid, including a training program in	77
cardiopulmonary resuscitation, which shall comply with section	78
3313.6021 of the Revised Code when offered in any of grades nine	79
through twelve, safety, and fire prevention. However, upon	80
written request of the student's parent or guardian, a student	81
shall be excused from taking instruction in cardiopulmonary	82
resuscitation.	83
(B) Except as provided in division (E) of this section,	84
every school or school district shall include in the	85
requirements for promotion from the eighth grade to the ninth	86
grade one year's course of study of American history. A board	87
may waive this requirement for academically accelerated students	88
who, in accordance with procedures adopted by the board, are	89
able to demonstrate mastery of essential concepts and skills of	90
the eighth grade American history course of study.	91
(C) As specified in divisions (B) (6) and (C) (6) of section	92
3313.603 of the Revised Code, except as provided in division (E)	93
of this section, every high school shall include in the	94
requirements for graduation from any curriculum one-half unit	95
each of American history and government.	96
(D) Except as provided in division (E) of this section,	97
basic instruction or demonstrated mastery in geography, United	98
States history, the government of the United States, the	99
government of the state of Ohio, local government in Ohio, the	100
Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution, and	101
the Constitution of the state of Ohio shall be required before	102
pupils may participate in courses involving the study of social	103

problems, economics, foreign affairs, United Nations, world 104
government, socialism, and communism. 105

(E) For each cooperative education school district 106
established pursuant to section 3311.521 of the Revised Code and 107
each city, exempted village, and local school district that has 108
territory within such a cooperative district, the curriculum 109
adopted pursuant to divisions (A) to (D) of this section shall 110
only include the study of the subjects that apply to the grades 111
operated by each such school district. The curriculums for such 112
schools, when combined, shall provide to each student of these 113
districts all of the subjects required under divisions (A) to 114
(D) of this section. 115

(F) The board of education of any cooperative education 116
school district established pursuant to divisions (A) to (C) of 117
section 3311.52 of the Revised Code shall prescribe a curriculum 118
for the subject areas and grade levels offered in any school 119
under its control. 120

(G) Upon the request of any parent or legal guardian of a 121
student, the board of education of any school district shall 122
permit the parent or guardian to promptly examine, with respect 123
to the parent's or guardian's own child: 124

(1) Any survey or questionnaire, prior to its 125
administration to the child; 126

(2) Any textbook, workbook, software, video, or other 127
instructional materials being used by the district in connection 128
with the instruction of the child; 129

(3) Any completed and graded test taken or survey or 130
questionnaire filled out by the child; 131

(4) Copies of the statewide academic standards and each 132

model curriculum developed pursuant to section 3301.079 of the Revised Code, which copies shall be available at all times during school hours in each district school building.

Sec. 3314.0310. (A) If a community school serves students in any of grades kindergarten through six, the school's curriculum for those grades shall include annual age-appropriate instruction in child sexual abuse prevention, including information on available counseling and resources for children who are sexually abused.

(B) (1) If a community school serves students in any of grades seven through twelve, the school's curriculum for those grades shall include age-appropriate instruction in sexual violence prevention education.

(2) If the parent or legal guardian of a student less than eighteen years of age who is attending a community school submits to the principal of the student's school a written request to examine the sexual violence prevention education instruction materials used at that school, the principal, within a reasonable period of time after the request is made, shall allow the parent or guardian to examine those materials at that school.

Sec. 3319.073. (A) The board of education of each city and exempted village school district and the governing board of each educational service center shall adopt or adapt the curriculum developed by the department of education for, or shall develop in consultation with public or private agencies or persons involved in child abuse prevention or intervention programs, a program of in-service training in the prevention of child abuse, violence, and substance abuse and the promotion of positive youth development. Each person employed by any school district

or service center to work in a school as a nurse, teacher, 163
counselor, school psychologist, or administrator shall complete 164
at least four hours of the in-service training within two years 165
of commencing employment with the district or center, and every 166
five years thereafter. A person who is employed by any school 167
district or service center to work in an elementary school as a 168
nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or administrator 169
on March 30, 2007, shall complete at least four hours of the in- 170
service training not later than March 30, 2009, and every five 171
years thereafter. A person who is employed by any school 172
district or service center to work in a middle or high school as 173
a nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or 174
administrator on October 16, 2009, shall complete at least four 175
hours of the in-service training not later than October 16, 176
2011, and every five years thereafter. 177

(B) Each board shall incorporate training in school safety 178
and violence prevention, including human trafficking content, 179
into the in-service training required by division (A) of this 180
section. For this purpose, the board shall adopt or adapt the 181
curriculum developed by the department or shall develop its own 182
curriculum in consultation with public or private agencies or 183
persons involved in school safety and violence prevention 184
programs. 185

(C) Each board shall incorporate training on the board's 186
harassment, intimidation, or bullying policy adopted under 187
section 3313.666 of the Revised Code into the in-service 188
training required by division (A) of this section. Each board 189
also shall incorporate training in the prevention of dating 190
violence into the in-service training required by that division 191
for middle and high school employees. The board shall develop 192
its own curricula for these purposes. 193

(D) Each board shall incorporate training in youth suicide awareness and prevention into the in-service training required by division (A) of this section for each person employed by a school district or service center to work in a school as a nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or administrator, and any other personnel that the board determines appropriate. The board shall require each such person to undergo training in youth suicide awareness and prevention programs once every two years. For this purpose, the board shall adopt or adapt the curriculum developed by the department or shall develop its own curriculum in consultation with public or private agencies or persons involved in youth suicide awareness and prevention programs.

The training completed under this division shall count toward the satisfaction of requirements for professional development required by the school district or service center board, and the training may be accomplished through self-review of suitable suicide prevention materials approved by the board.

(E) Each board shall incorporate training on child sexual abuse into the in-service training required by division (A) of this section. The training completed under this division shall count toward the satisfaction of requirements for professional development required by the school district or service center board.

Sec. 3326.091. (A) If a STEM school serves students in any of grades kindergarten through six, the school's curriculum for that grade shall include annual age-appropriate instruction in child sexual abuse prevention, including information on available counseling and resources for children who are sexually abused.

(B) (1) If a STEM school serves students in any of grades 224
seven through twelve, the school's curriculum for those grades 225
shall include age-appropriate instruction in sexual violence 226
prevention education. 227

(2) If the parent or legal guardian of a student less than 228
eighteen years of age who is attending a STEM school submits to 229
the principal of the student's school a written request to 230
examine the sexual violence prevention education instruction 231
materials used at that school, the principal, within a 232
reasonable period of time after the request is made, shall allow 233
the parent or guardian to examine those materials at that 234
school. 235

Section 2. That existing sections 3313.60 and 3319.073 of 236
the Revised Code are hereby repealed. 237
