	to require health benefit plans to cover drugs	5
	dispensed in those situations.	6

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4729.281 be amended and section	7
3902.50 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	8
Sec. 3902.50. (A) As used in this section:	9
(1) "Cost-sharing requirement" means the cost to a covered	10
person under a health benefit plan according to any coverage	11
limit, copayment, coinsurance, deductible, or other out-of-	12
pocket expense requirement.	13
(2) "Covered person," "health benefit plan," and "health	14
plan issuer" have the same meanings as in section 3922.01 of the	15
Revised Code.	
(3) "Licensed health professional authorized to prescribe	17
drugs" has the same meaning as in section 4729.01 of the Revised	18

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Code.	19
(B) Notwithstanding section 3901.71 of the Revised Code,	20
if a health plan issuer covers a prescription drug under a	21
health benefit plan, the health plan issuer shall also provide	22
coverage for that drug at least once during any twelve-month	23
period when it is dispensed by a pharmacist to a covered person	24
in accordance with section 4729.281 of the Revised Code.	25
A health benefit plan shall not impose cost-sharing	26
requirements for a drug dispensed in accordance with section	27
4729.281 of the Revised Code that are greater than those imposed	28
when that drug is dispensed in accordance with a prescription	29
issued by a licensed health professional authorized to prescribe	30
drugs.	31
Sec. 4729.281. (A) A pharmacist may dispense or sell a	32
dangerous drug, other than a schedule II controlled substance as	33
defined in section 3719.01 of the Revised Code, without a	34
written or oral prescription from a licensed health professional	35
authorized to prescribe drugs if all of the following conditions	36
are met:	37
(1) The pharmacy at which the pharmacist works has a	38
record of a prescription for the drug in the name of the patient	39
who is requesting it, but the prescription does not provide for	40
a refill or the time permitted by rules adopted by the state	41
board of pharmacy for providing refills has elapsed.	42
(2) The pharmacist is unable to obtain authorization to	43
refill the prescription from the health care professional who	44
issued the prescription or another health professional	45
responsible for the patient's care.	46
(3) In the exercise of the pharmacist's professional	47

judgment:	
(a) The drug is essential to sustain the life of the	49
patient or continue therapy for a chronic condition of the	50
patient.	51
(b) Failure to dispense or sell the drug to the patient	52
could result in harm to the health of the patient.	53
$\frac{(4)(a)-(B)(1)}{(B)(B)}$ Except as provided in division $\frac{(A)(4)(b)-(B)}{(B)}$	54
(2) of this section, the amount of the drug that is dispensed or	55
sold under <u>division (A)</u> this section <u>does shall</u> not exceed a	56
seventy-two-hour supply as provided in the prescription.	57
(b) (i) Subject to division (A) (4) (b) (ii) of this section,	58
if (2) If the drug dispensed or sold under division (A) of this	59
section is not a controlled substance and the patient has been	60
on a consistent drug therapy as demonstrated by records	61
maintained by a pharmacy, the amount of the drug dispensed or	62
sold does shall not exceed a thirty-day supply as provided in	63
the prescription or, if the standard unit of dispensing for the	64
drug exceeds a thirty-day supply, the amount of the drug	65
dispensed or sold <u>does</u> <u>shall</u> not exceed the standard unit of	66

(ii) A pharmacist shall not dispense or sell a particular	69
drug to the same patient in an amount described in division (A)	70

(B)(C) A pharmacist who dispenses or sells a drug under	73
this section shall do all of the following:	74
(1) For one year after the date of dispensing or sale,	75
maintain a record in accordance with this chapter of the drug	76

dispensed or sold, including the name and address of the patient	77
and the individual receiving the drug, if the individual	78
receiving the drug is not the patient, the amount dispensed or	79
sold, and the original prescription number;	80
(2) Notify the health professional who issued the	81
prescription described in division (A)(1) of this section or	82
another health professional responsible for the patient's care	83
not later than seventy-two hours after the drug is sold or	84
dispensed;	85
(3) If applicable, obtain authorization for additional	86
dispensing from one of the health professionals described in	87
division $\frac{(B)(2)}{(C)(2)}$ of this section.	88
(C) (D) A pharmacist who dispenses or sells a drug under	89
this section may do so-once for each prescription described in-	90
division (A) (1) of this section as follows:	91
(1) For a drug described in division (B)(2) of this	92
section, not more than three times in any twelve-month period;	93

(2) For any other drug described in this section, not more	94
than once for each prescription.	95
Section 2. That existing section 4729.281 of the Revised	96
Code is hereby repealed.	97
Section 3. This act shall apply to health benefit plans,	98
as defined in section 3922.01 of the Revised Code, delivered,	99
issued for delivery, modified, or renewed on or after the	100
effective date of this act.	101
