BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 317.24 and 317.241 of the Revised	8
Code be amended to read as follows:	9
Sec. 317.24. (A) As used in this section:	10
(1) "Authorized party" means any of the following:	11
(a) The person who is the subject of the record of	12
discharge;	13
(b) A county veterans service officer who is certified by	14
the department of veterans services;	15
(c) An attorney-in-fact, agent, or other representative of	16

the person who is the subject of the record of discharge, if17authorized to inspect or copy the record of discharge by that18person in a power of attorney or other document;19

(d) A person authorized, for good cause shown, by a court20 of record to inspect or copy the record of discharge;21

(e) If the person who is the subject of the record of
discharge is deceased, the executor or administrator, or an
heir, legatee, or devisee, of the person's estate or a funeral
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director who is to perform the funeral for the deceased person.

(2) "Separation code" or "separation program number" means
(2) the coded number or numbers used to specify the reasons for a
(2) person's separation from active duty, as contained in one of the
(2) following:

(a) Regarding a separation code, as contained in line 23
 or 26 of a veteran's discharge paper, United States department
 of defense form DD-214;

(b) Regarding a separation program number, as contained in
11 (c) of a veteran's discharge paper, under
prior versions of United States department of defense form DD214.

(3) "Service-related document" means any United States
department of defense form DD-215 or DD-220, or any National
Guard Bureau form NGB-22 or NGB-22A.
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(4) "Armed forces of the United States" means the army,40navy, air force, marine corps, space force, coast guard, the41national guard of any state, or any other reserve components of42those forces.43

(5) "Uniformed services" means the armed forces of the

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United States; the commissioned corps of the national oceanic	45
and atmospheric administration; the commissioned corps of the	46
public health service; or any reserve components of those	
forces; and such other service as may be designated by congress.	
(B)(1) Upon request of any discharged member of the armed-	49
forces of the United States uniformed services and presentation	50
of the member's discharge, the county recorder shall record the	51
discharge in a book to be furnished by the board of county	52
commissioners for that purpose. There shall be no fee for the	53
recording. The record of discharge, or a certified copy of the	54
record, shall be received in evidence in all cases where the	
original discharge would be received.	56
(2)(a) A discharge recorded under division (B)(1) or (D)	57

of this section is not a public record under section 149.43 of 58 the Revised Code for a period of seventy-five years after the 59 date of the recording. During that period, the county recorder's 60 office shall make the record of discharge available only to an 61 authorized party or to a person other than an authorized party 62 as provided by division (B)(2)(b) of this section. Except as 63 provided in section 317.27 of the Revised Code, the authorized 64 party shall pay the reasonable costs of copying the record of 65 discharge. 66

(b) A person other than an authorized party may request to 67 view or receive a copy of a discharge record recorded under 68 division (B)(1) or (D) of this section. Upon such a person's 69 request, the county recorder's office shall provide a copy of 70 the discharged record to the person that shall be redacted to 71 contain only the name, rank, date of birth, date of discharge, 72 and type of discharge of the person who is the subject of the 73 discharge record. Except as provided in section 317.27 of the 74

Revised Code, a person other than an authorized party shall pay 75 the reasonable costs of copying the record of discharge. 76 (3) A county veterans service officer, who is an 77 authorized party, may request to receive, from a county 78 recorder's office, a record of discharge if the veterans service 79 officer has a need for access to the record of discharge for the 80 purpose of supporting a veteran's claim for benefits, and the 81 county recorder's office shall make the record available to the 82 county veterans service officer. 83 (C) Upon application by a person whose discharge has been 84 recorded pursuant to this section, the county recorder shall, 85 without fee, expunge the person's record of discharge, expunge 86 the person's separation program number or separation code from 87 the person's record of discharge and from any of the person's 88 other service-related documents that have been recorded, or 89 expunge the person's social security number from the person's 90 record of discharge and from any of the person's other service-91 related documents that have been recorded. (D) Upon the request of any person who served during World	111
War I or World War II as a member of any armed force of the	112
government of Poland or Czechoslovakia and participated while so	113
serving in armed conflict with an enemy of the United States and	114
who has been a citizen of the United States for at least ten	115
years, and the presentation of the person's discharge, the	116
county recorder shall record the person's discharge in a book to	117
be furnished by the board of county commissioners for that	118

(3) Paid a fee, if a fee has been established by the133county.

A board of county commissioners may, by resolution, 135 authorize a county recorder or county veterans service office to 136 collect a fee from individuals requesting a veterans 137 identification card. The fee may not exceed two dollars. 138

If a county veterans service office maintains access to 139 the state and federal military service verification system, the 140 county veterans service office or county recorder, by consulting 141 the county veterans service office, shall confirm before issuing 142 a veterans identification card that the individual's armed 143 forces uniformed services discharge record exists in the 144 system's database and does not indicate the individual was 145 dishonorably discharged. 146

(B) A county recorder or county veterans service office 147 who has in operation, before the effective date of this section 148 <u>September 8, 2016</u>, a program to issue veterans identification 149 cards may continue to issue veterans identification cards 150 without a resolution of the board of county commissioners, if 151 the county recorder or county veterans service office conforms 152 the program, as necessary, so that it otherwise is in compliance 153 with this section. 154

(C) An Ohio veterans identification card expires ten years
after the date of issuance. A veteran whose identification card
has expired may apply to a county recorder or county veterans
service office for the issuance of a new identification card,
and a veteran whose current card has been lost or damaged may
apply to a county recorder or county veterans service office for
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a replacement identification card, by meeting the requirements described in this section.

(F)(1) An Ohio veterans identification card shall conform to the material and design standards established by the Ohio recorders association in consultation with the county	185 186 187

commissioners' association of Ohio and Ohio state association of188county veterans service officers. All issuing entities shall189follow the design standards established pursuant to Sec. section190317.242 of the Revised Code.191

(2) An applicant for an Ohio veterans identification card 192 shall be photographed in color at the time the application for 193 the card is made. A county recorder or county veterans service 194 office that issues identification cards shall provide the 195 necessary equipment to take a color photograph of an applicant 196 for an Ohio veterans identification card. Photographic records 197 of a county recorder's office or county veterans service office 198 that are obtained under this section are the property of the 199 county recorder's office or county veterans service office. 200

(G) All application materials, including applications,
photographs, documents, or other information submitted with an
application or obtained by a county recorder or county veterans
service office are not public records under section 149.43 of
the Revised Code. The county recorder or county veterans service
office may only release application materials as follows:

(1) To a state, local, or federal governmental agency for
criminal justice purposes or to a court for any purpose arising
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in the court;

(2) To the department of veterans services, but only if210the veteran gives prior signed written approval;211

(3) To a county veterans service commission, but only if212the veteran gives prior signed written approval.213

A governmental agency, a court, the department of veterans 214 services, or a county veterans service commission to which 215 application materials have been released shall maintain the 216

confidentiality of those materials.	217
(H) A county recorder or county veterans service office	218
may contract with any other political subdivision of the state	219
for Ohio veterans identification card production services.	220

may accept donations, in the form of supplies and equipment, to	222
