A BILL

To extend the renewal time period for A-1-A and 1
class D liquor permits. 2

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) Notwithstanding any section of the Revised 3
Code or any other law to the contrary, a person that holds a 4
valid A-1-A or class D permit issued under Chapter 4303. of the 5
Revised Code on the effective date of this section shall renew 6
the person's permit as follows: 7

(1) If the person is scheduled to renew the permit on 8
October 1, 2020, the person instead shall renew the permit not 9
later than January 4, 2021. Following the January 4, 2021, 10
renewal, the person shall subsequently renew the permit not 11
later than April 4, 2022. Following the April 4, 2022, renewal, 12
the person shall subsequently renew the permit in accordance 13
with section 4303.271 of the Revised Code pursuant to a schedule 14
established by the Division of Liquor Control. 15

(2) If the person is scheduled to renew the permit on 16

February 1, 2021, the person instead shall renew the permit not 17
later than May 1, 2021. Following the May 1, 2021, renewal, the 18
person shall subsequently renew the permit not later than August 19
1, 2022. Following the August 1, 2022, renewal, the person shall 20
subsequently renew the permit in accordance with section 21
4303.271 of the Revised Code pursuant to a schedule established 22
by the Division. 23

(3) If the person is scheduled to renew the permit on June 24
1, 2021, the person shall renew the permit not later than that 25
date. Following the June 1, 2021, renewal, the person shall 26
subsequently renew the permit not later than September 1, 2022. 27
Following the September 1, 2022, renewal, the person shall renew 28
the permit in accordance with section 4303.271 of the Revised 29
Code pursuant to a schedule established by the Division. 30

(B) Permits remain valid until the applicable renewal date 31
set forth in this section, unless suspended or revoked. 32

(C) The Division of Liquor Control shall adopt rules in 33
accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code necessary to 34
administer and enforce this section. 35

Section 2. (A) The Superintendent of Liquor Control shall 36
determine the amount of foregone revenue to the Undivided Liquor 37
Permit Fund (Fund 7066) and the subsequent amounts of foregone 38
revenue that would be distributed to other state funds and 39
political subdivisions from Fund 7066, pursuant to divisions 40
(B), (C), and (D) of section 4301.30 of the Revised Code, as a 41
result of Section 1 of this act. The Superintendent shall 42
certify the amounts to the Director of Budget and Management. 43

(B) Notwithstanding section 4301.30 of the Revised Code or 44
any other law to the contrary, when making distributions from 45

the Undivided Liquor Permit Fund (Fund 7066) to the State Liquor 46
Regulatory Fund (Fund 5LP0), political subdivisions in which 47
permitted premises are located, and the Statewide Treatment and 48
Prevention Fund (Fund 4750), the distributions shall include the 49
certified amounts of foregone revenue to political subdivisions 50
and Fund 4750 as described in division (A) of this section 51
during the duration of the permit renewal schedule as described 52
in Section 1 of this act. 53
