BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 5501.91 of the Revised Code be	4
enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 5501.91. (A) As used in this section, "port	6
authority" means a port authority created under Chapter 4582. of	7
the Revised Code.	8
(B) There is hereby established the Ohio maritime	9
assistance program, which the department of transportation shall	10
administer. Under the program, a port authority may apply to the	11
department for a grant to be used as prescribed in division (D)	12
of this section. In order to be eligible for a grant under this	13
section, a port authority is required to meet either of the	14
<pre>following requirements:</pre>	15
(1) At the time of application for a grant, the port	16
authority owns an active marine cargo terminal located on the	17
shore of Lake Erie or the Ohio river or on a Lake Erie	18

tributary.	
(2) The grant application is for the planning and	20
construction of a new marine cargo terminal located on the shore	21
of Lake Erie or the Ohio river or on a Lake Erie tributary.	22
(C)(1) Every applicant for a grant shall submit with its	23
application a written business justification for the investment	24
that indicates the operational and market need for the project	25
in a form the director of transportation shall prescribe.	26
(2) The department shall evaluate all grant applications	27
according to the following criteria:	28
(a) The degree to which the proposed project will increase	29
the efficiency or capacity of maritime cargo terminal	30
operations;	31
(b) Whether the project will result in the handling of new	32
types of cargo or an increase in cargo volume;	33
(c) Whether the project will meet an identified supply	34
chain need or benefit Ohio firms that export goods to foreign	35
markets, or import goods to Ohio for use in manufacturing or for	36
<pre>value-added distribution;</pre>	37
(d) Any other criteria the director determines to be	38
appropriate.	39
(3) If a grant application does not meet the criteria	40
specified in divisions (C)(2)(b) and (c) of this section, an	41
applicant is not eligible for a grant under this section.	42
(D) A port authority shall use a grant awarded under this	43
section only for any of the following purposes:	44
(1) Land acquisition and site development for marine cargo	45

terminal and associated uses, including demolition and	46
<pre>environmental remediation;</pre>	47
(2) Construction of wharves, quay walls, bulkheads,	48
jetties, revetments, breakwaters, shipping channels, dredge	49
disposal facilities, projects for the beneficial use of dredge	50
material, and other structures and improvements directly related	51
to maritime commerce and harbor infrastructure;	52
(3) Construction and repair of warehouses, transit sheds,	53
railroad tracks, roadways, gates and gatehouses, fencing,	54
bridges, offices, shipyards, and other improvements needed for	55
<pre>marine cargo terminal and associated uses, including shipyards;</pre>	56
(4) Acquisition of cargo handling equipment, including	57
mobile shore cranes, stationary cranes, tow motors, fork lifts,	58
yard tractors, craneways, conveyor and bulk material handling	59
equipment, and all types of ship loading and unloading	60
<pre>equipment;</pre>	61
(5) Planning and design services and other services	62
associated with construction.	63
(E) A port authority shall pay a matching amount of at	64
least one dollar for each grant dollar received for the proposed	65
project.	66
(F) The director of transportation, in accordance with	67
Chapter 119. of the Revised Code, shall adopt rules governing	68
the program established under this section, including the grant	69
application, evaluation, award processes, and how the grant	70
money may be spent by a port authority.	71
Section 2. All items in this section are hereby	72
appropriated as designated out of any moneys in the state	73
treasury to the credit of the designated fund. For all	74

appropriations made in this act, those in the first column are	75
for fiscal year 2020 and those in the second column are for	76
fiscal year 2021. The appropriations made in this act are in	77
addition to any other appropriations made for the FY 2020-FY	78
2021 biennium.	79
