## A BILL

То	amend section 4729.44 of the Revised Code to	1
	require the State Board of Pharmacy to educate	2
	license holders about the law authorizing	3
	naloxone dispensing without a prescription.	4

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4729.44 of the Revised Code be	5
amended to read as follows:	
Sec. 4729.44. (A) As used in this section:	7
(1) "Board of health" means a board of health of a city or	8
general health district or an authority having the duties of a	9
board of health under section 3709.05 of the Revised Code.	
(2) "Physician" means an individual authorized under	11
Chapter 4731. of the Revised Code to practice medicine and	12
surgery, osteopathic medicine and surgery, or podiatric medicine	13
and surgery.	14
(B) If use of the protocol developed pursuant to rules	15
adopted under division (G) of this section has been authorized	16

under section 3707.56 or 4731.942 of the Revised Code, a	17
pharmacist or pharmacy intern may dispense naloxone without a	18
prescription to either of the following in accordance with that	19
protocol:	20
(1) An individual who there is reason to believe is	21
experiencing or at risk of experiencing an opioid-related	
overdose;	23
(2) A family member, friend, or other individual in a	24
position to assist an individual who there is reason to believe	25
is at risk of experiencing an opioid-related overdose.	26
(C) A pharmacist or pharmacy intern who dispenses naloxone	27
under this section shall instruct the individual to whom	28
naloxone is dispensed to summon emergency services as soon as	29
practicable either before or after administering naloxone.	30
(D) A pharmacist may document on a prescription form the	31
dispensing of naloxone by the pharmacist or a pharmacy intern	32
supervised by the pharmacist. The form may be assigned a number	33
for record-keeping purposes.	34
(E) This section does not affect the authority of a	35
pharmacist or pharmacy intern to fill or refill a prescription	36
for naloxone.	37
(F) A board of health that in good faith authorizes a	38
pharmacist or pharmacy intern to dispense naloxone without a	39
prescription in accordance with a protocol developed pursuant to	40
rules adopted under division (G) of this section is not liable	41
for or subject to any of the following for any action or	42
omission of the individual to whom the naloxone is dispensed:	43
damages in any civil action, prosecution in any criminal	44
proceeding, or professional disciplinary action.	45

A physician who in good faith authorizes a pharmacist or	46
pharmacy intern to dispense naloxone without a prescription in	47
accordance with a protocol developed pursuant to rules adopted	48
under division (G) of this section is not liable for or subject	49
to any of the following for any action or omission of the	50
individual to whom the naloxone is dispensed: damages in any	51
civil action, prosecution in any criminal proceeding, or	52
professional disciplinary action.	53
A pharmacist or pharmacy intern authorized under this	54
section to dispense naloxone without a prescription who does so	55
in good faith is not liable for or subject to any of the	56
following for any action or omission of the individual to whom	57
the naloxone is dispensed: damages in any civil action,	58
prosecution in any criminal proceeding, or professional	59
disciplinary action.	60
(G) The state board of pharmacy shall, after consulting	61
with the department of health and state medical board, adopt	62
rules to implement this section. The rules shall specify a	63
protocol under which pharmacists or pharmacy interns may	64
dispense naloxone without a prescription.	65
All rules adopted under this section shall be adopted in	66
accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code.	67
(H) (1) The state board of pharmacy shall develop a program	68
to educate all of the following about the authority of a	69
pharmacist or pharmacy intern to dispense naloxone without a	70
<pre>prescription:</pre>	71
(a) Holders of licenses issued under this chapter;	72
(b) Registered pharmacy technicians and certified pharmacy	73
technicians registered under section 4729.90 of the Revised	74

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<u>Code;</u>	75
(c) Individuals who are not licensed or registered under	76
this chapter but are employed by license holders.	77
(2) As part of the program, the board also shall educate	78
license holders, pharmacy technicians, and employees of license	79
holders about maintaining at all times an adequate supply of	80
naloxone and methods for determining a pharmacy's stock of the	81
drug.	82
(3) The board may use its web site to share information	83
under the program.	84

Section 2. That existing section 4729.44 of the Revised

Code is hereby repealed.

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
