### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3701.352, 3707.48, and 3709.211	6
be amended and sections 3701.353, 3707.481, and 3709.212 of the	7
Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	8
Sec. 3701.352. No Except as otherwise provided in section	9
3701.353 of the Revised Code, no person shall violate any rule	10
the director of health or department of health adopts or any	11

Sec. 3707.481. (A) A business that has been required to 47 cease or limit operations by order or regulation of the board of 48 health of a city or general health district, issued under this 49 chapter due to epidemic, threatened epidemic, or the unusual 50 prevalence of a dangerous communicable disease, may continue or 51 resume operations if it complies with all safety precautions 52 that the order or regulation requires of businesses that are 53 permitted to continue operations. 54

(B) No order or regulation of the board of health of a city or general health district issued under this chapter due to epidemic, threatened epidemic, or the unusual prevalence of a dangerous communicable disease shall be applied to require businesses or business locations to close, due to circumstances not uniquely present at those particular businesses or business locations, for more than fourteen days due to the same epidemic, threatened epidemic, or period of unusual prevalence of a dangerous communicable disease.

(C) Divisions (A) and (B) of this section only apply to 64 orders or regulations of the board of health of a city or 65 general health district, issued under this chapter due to 66 epidemic, threatened epidemic, or the unusual prevalence of a 67 dangerous communicable disease. Divisions (A) and (B) of this 68 section do not apply to orders or regulations of the board of 69 health of a city or general health district, issued under this 70 chapter, and applicable only to particular businesses or 71 business locations due to circumstances uniquely present at 72 those particular businesses or business locations. 73

Sec. 3709.211. When Except as otherwise provided in74section 3709.212 of the Revised Code, when an order of the board75

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of health of a city or general health district made pursuant to 76 section 3709.20 or 3709.21 of the Revised Code is not complied 77 with in whole or in part, the board may petition the court of 78 common pleas for injunctive or other appropriate relief 79 requiring all persons to whom such order of the board is 80 directed to comply with such order. The court of the county in 81 which such offense is alleged to be occurring may grant such 82 injunctive or other appropriate relief as the equities of the 83 case require. 84

Sec. 3709.212. (A) A business that has been required to 85 cease or limit operations by order or regulation of the board of 86 health of a city or general health district, issued under this 87 chapter, in the case of an emergency caused by an epidemic of 88 contagious or infectious disease, may continue or resume 89 operations if it complies with all safety precautions that the 90 order or regulation requires of businesses that are permitted to 91 continue operations. 92

(B) No order or regulation of the board of health of a 93 city or general health district issued under this chapter in the 94 case of an emergency caused by an epidemic of contagious or 95 infectious disease shall apply to require businesses or business 96 locations to close, due to circumstances not uniquely present at 97 those particular businesses or business locations, for more than 98 fourteen days due to the same epidemic of contagious or 99 infections disease. 100

(C) Divisions (A) and (B) of this section only apply to101orders or regulations of the board of health of a city or102general health district, issued under this chapter, in the case103of an emergency caused by an epidemic of contagious or104infectious disease. Divisions (A) and (B) of this section do not105

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apply to orders or regulations of the board of health of a city	106	
or general health district, issued under this chapter, and	107	
applicable only to particular businesses or business locations	108	
due to circumstances uniquely present at those particular

Section 2. That existing sections 3701.352, 3707.48, and	111	
3709.211 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	112	
Section 3. This act's amendment of sections 3701.352,	113	
3707.48, and 3709.211 of the Revised Code and enactment of	114	
sections 3701.353, 3707.481, and 3709.212 of the Revised Code	115	
shall be known as "The Business Fairness Act."		
Section 4. This act is hereby declared to be an emergency	117	
measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public	118	
peace, health, and safety. The reasons for such necessity are		
the economic effects of COVID-19. Therefore, this act shall go	120	
into immediate effect.	121	

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
