A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1
4503.516 of the Revised Code to create the 2
"Marshall University" license plate. 3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4
4503.516 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 9
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 10
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911, 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 34
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 35

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 36
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 37
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 38
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 39
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 40
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 41
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 42
other abortion-related activities. 43

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 44
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 45
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 46
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 47
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 48

the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 49
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 50
other money in that fund. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 52
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 53
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 54
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 57
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 58
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 59
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 60
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 61
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 62
directly to their clients. 63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 65
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 66
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 67
pancreatic cancer and their families. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 70
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 71
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 72
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 75
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 76
its research and other programs. 77

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 107
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 108
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 109
scholarships and other educational activities. 110

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 111
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 112
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 113
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 114
that organization. 115

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 116
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 117
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 118
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 119
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 120

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 121
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 122
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 123
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 124
need. 125

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 126
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 127
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 128
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 129

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 130
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 131
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 132
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 133
section. A university or college that receives contributions 134
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 135

scholarship fund. 136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 137
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 138
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 139
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 140
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 141
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 142
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 143
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 144
funds as provided in this section. 145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 146
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 147
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 148
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 149
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 150
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 151
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 152
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 153
funds as provided in this section. 154

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 155
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 156
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 157
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 158
cyclists of all ages. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 161
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 162
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 163
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 164
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 165

educational, and cultural events at the monument. 166

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 167
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 168
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 169
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 170
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 171

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 172
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 173
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 174
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 175
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 176

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 177
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 178
United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 179
four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 180
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 181
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 182
sponsors within this state. 183

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 184
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 185
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 186
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 187
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 188
activities. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 190
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 191
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 192
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 193
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 194

to children, young adults, and families in this state. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 196
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 197
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 198
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 199
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 200
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 201
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 202
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 203
the improvement of patient outcomes. 204

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 205
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 206
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 207
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 208
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 209
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 210
personnel, veterans, and their families. 211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 212
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 213
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 214
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 215
families. 216

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 217
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 218
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 219
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 220
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 221
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 222
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 223
destination. 224

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 225
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 226
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 227
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 228
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 229

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 230
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 231
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 232
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 233
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 234
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 235
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 236
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 237
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 238
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 239
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 240

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 241
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 242
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 243

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 244
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 245
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 246
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 247
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 248
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 249
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 250
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 251
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 252
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 253
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 254

incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 255
under this section. 256

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 257
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 258
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 259
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 260
programs. 261

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 262
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 263
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 264
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 265

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 266
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 267
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 268
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 269
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 270

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 271
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 272
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 273
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 274
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 275
the person who paid the contribution resides. 276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 277
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 278
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 279
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 280
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 281
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 282
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 283

for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 284
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 285
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 286
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 287
such payments are to be made. 288

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 289
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 290
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 291
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 292
river watershed. 293

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 294
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 295
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 296
nature preserve. 297

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 298
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 299
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 300
the money in support of the park. 301

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 302
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 303
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 304
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 305

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 306
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 307
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 308
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 309

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 310
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 311
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 312

contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 313
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 314
local beekeeping programs. 315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 317
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 318
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 319
legends to inspire future leaders. 320

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 321
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 322
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 323
the contributions for educational purposes. 324

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 325
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 326
Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 327
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 328

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 329
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 330
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 331
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 332
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 333
commission and that is participating in the license plate 334
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 335
of the county of residence of an applicant. 336

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 337
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 338
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 339
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 340
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 341

(G) of that section. 342

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 343
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 344
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 345
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 346
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 347
Ohio and for educational programs. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 350
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 351
supporting cancer research. 352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 353
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 354
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 355

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 356
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 357
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 358

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 359
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 360
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 361
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 362
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 364
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 365
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 366
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 367
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 368
scouts. 369

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 370

receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 371
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 372
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 373
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 374

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 375
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 376
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 377
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 378

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 379
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 380
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 381
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 382

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 383
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 384
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 385
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 386
charitable purposes. 387

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 388
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 389
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 390
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 391
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 393
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 394
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 395
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 396
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 397
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 398
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 399

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 400
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 401
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 402
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 403
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 404
in the line of duty. 405

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 406
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 407
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 408
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 409
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 410

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 411
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 412
association of chiefs of police. 413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 415
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 416
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 417
families. 418

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 419
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 420
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 421
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 422

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 423
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 424
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 425
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 426
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 427
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 428

administering a program to secure the proper representation in 429
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 430
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 431
participating in that program. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 434
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 435
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 437
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 438
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 439
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 440
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 442
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 443
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 444
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 445
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 446
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 447
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 448
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 449
lives to the fullest. 450

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 451
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 452
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 453
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 454
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 455

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 456
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 457

Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 458
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 459
Cleveland, Ohio. 460

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 461
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 462
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 463
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 464
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 465
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 466
resides. 467

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 468
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 469
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 470
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 471
law enforcement education and assistance. 472

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 473
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 474
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 475
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 476
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 477
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 478

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 479
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 480
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 481
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 482
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 483
rotary foundation. 484

services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1034
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1035
subsection 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1036
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1037
purpose. 1038

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1039
receives pursuant to section 4503.956 of the Revised Code to the 1040
Liberty Center local school district, which shall use the 1041
contributions for its gifted programs and special education and 1042
related services. 1043

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1044
receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to 1045
John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school 1046
shall not use the contributions it receives for any political 1047
purpose. 1048

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1049
receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1050
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1051
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1052
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1053
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1054
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1055
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1056

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1057
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1058
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1059
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1060
contributions for any political purpose. 1061

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for any political purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The high school shall not use the contributions for any political purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free emergency medical first response throughout Israel.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park."

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this section the investment income the fund earned the previous calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity received from the fund during the previous calendar year.

Sec. 4503.516. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1090

car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1091
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1092
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1093
and issuance of "Marshall University" license plates. The 1094
application may be combined with a request for a special 1095
reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1096
Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1097
compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1098
section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1099
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Marshall 1100
University" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 1101
validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 1102
the Revised Code. 1103

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1104
inscribed on the license plates, "Marshall University" license 1105
plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that are 1106
selected by representatives of Marshall university and approved 1107
by the registrar. "Marshall University" license plates shall 1108
display county identification stickers that identify the county 1109
of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 1110
Code. 1111

(B) "Marshall University" license plates and a validation 1112
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 1113
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 1114
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 1115
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1116
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1117
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1118
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1119
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1120
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 1121

all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1122
vehicles. 1123

(C) (1) For each application for registration and 1124
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1125
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of thirty 1126
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1127
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1128
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1129

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1130
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1131
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1132
of "Marshall University" license plates, into the state treasury 1133
to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund 1134
created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1135

Section 2. That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 1136
Code is hereby repealed. 1137
