(A) There is hereby created in the state 20 treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 21 consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 22 by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 23 motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 24 in division (B) of this section. 25 (B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 26 registrar collects in the fund as follows: 27 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 2.8 pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 29 cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 30 programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 31 cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 32 quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 33 the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 34 other abortion-related activities. 35 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 36 receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 37 organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 38 deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 39 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 40 the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 41 manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 42 other money in that fund. 43

The registrar shall pay the contributions received44pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism45society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs46

and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 48 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 49 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 50 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 51 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 52 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 53 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 54 directly to their clients. 55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar66receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the67St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for68its research and other programs.69

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar70receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to71special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions72for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 75

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 78 receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 79 the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 80 raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 81 pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 82

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 83 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 84 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 85 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 86 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 87

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 88 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 89 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 90 contributions into its general account to be used for 91 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 92 America foundation. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received99pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio100cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for101scholarships and other educational activities.102

The registrar shall pay the contributions received103pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the104

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organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 105 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 106 that organization. 107 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 108 receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 109 Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 110 scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 111 events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 112 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 113 pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 114 organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 115 organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 116 need. 117 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 118 pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 119 aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 120 facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 121 programming. 122 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 123

receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 124 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 125 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 126

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 127 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 128 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 129 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 130 section. A university or college that receives contributions 131 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 132 scholarship fund. 133

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 134 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 135 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 136 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 137 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 1.38 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 139 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 140 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 141 funds as provided in this section. 142

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 152 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 153 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 154 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 155 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 156 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 157 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 158 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 159 funds as provided in this section. 160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar161receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the162Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying163

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for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 164 cyclists of all ages. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 167 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 168 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 169 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 170 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 171 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar173receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the174fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for175the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the176lighthouses of fairport harbor.177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178 receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 179 Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 180 contributions only to promote and support the football team of 181 Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 182

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 183 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 184 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twentyfour, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 186 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 187 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 188 sponsors within this state. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar190receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the191Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis192

international, which shall use the money it receives under this 193
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 194
activities. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 196 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 197 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 198 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 199 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 200 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 201

202 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 203 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 204 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 205 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 206 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 207 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 208 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 209 the improvement of patient outcomes. 210

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 211 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 212 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 213 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 214 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 215 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 216 personnel, veterans, and their families. 217

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 218 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 219 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 220 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 221 families. 222

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 223 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 224 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 225 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 226 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 227 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 228 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 229 destination. 230

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 236 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 237 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 238 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 239 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 240 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 241 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 242 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 243 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 244 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 245 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 246

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar247receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the248rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.249

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar250receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the251Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit252

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corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 253 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 254 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 255 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 256 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 2.57 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 258 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 259 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 260 261 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received under this section. 262

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 263 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 264 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 265 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 266 programs. 267

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the western reserve historical society, which shall use the contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar272receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the273Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple274negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the275contributions for charitable and educational purposes.276

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 277 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 278 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 279 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 280 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 281 the person who paid the contribution resides. 282

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 283 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 284 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 285 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 286 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 2.87 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 288 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 289 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 290 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 291 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 292 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 293 such payments are to be made. 294

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar308receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the309Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the310contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 335 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 336 the contributions for educational purposes. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar338receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the339Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the340

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contributions to support the activities of the organization.	341
