Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced in division (B) of this section.

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar collects in the fund as follows:

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 32 programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 38 receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 39 organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 40 deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 41 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 42 the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 43

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manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 44 other money in that fund. 45

The registrar shall pay the contributions received46pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism47society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs48and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.49

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 50 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 51 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 52 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 53 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 54 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 55 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 56 directly to their clients. 57

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 63 receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 64 Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 65 contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 66 support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 67

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar68receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the69St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for70its research and other programs.71

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 73 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 74 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 75

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 76 receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 77 children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 78 contributions for its research and other programs. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80 receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 81 the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 82 raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 83 pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 85 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 86 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 87 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 88 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 90 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 91 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 92 contributions into its general account to be used for 93 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 94 America foundation. 95

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 96 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 97 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 98 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 99 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 100

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 101

pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio102cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for103scholarships and other educational activities.104

The registrar shall pay the contributions received105pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the106organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those107contributions for scholarships for students who are members of108that organization.109

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar110receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to111Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for112scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or113events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.114

The registrar shall pay the contributions received115pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio116aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to117facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational118programming.119

The registrar shall pay the contributions received120pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the121organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that122organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in123need.124

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar125receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a126kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the127Ohio chapters of a kid again.128

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar129receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the130

university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 131 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 132 section. A university or college that receives contributions 133 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 134 scholarship fund. 135

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 145 receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 146 Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 147 of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 148 attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 149 funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 150 program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 151 with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 152 funds as provided in this section. 153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar154receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the155university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of156awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend157the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it158receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program.159The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the160
