A BILL

To enact section 3770.23 of the Revised Code to	1
prohibit the state from conducting a lottery	2
dependent on an individual's COVID-19	3
vaccination status, to name the act the	4
"Taxpayer Protection Against the Frivolous	5
Vaccine Lottery Act," to make an appropriation,	6
and to declare an emergency.	7

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3770.23 of the Revised Code be	8
enacted to read as follows:	9
Sec. 3770.23. (A) As used in this section:	10
"Administrative department" means a department listed	11
under section 121.02 of the Revised Code.	12
"Administrative department head" means a department head	13
listed under section 121.03 of the Revised Code.	14
"Event" means a contest, competition, drawing, lottery,	15

sweepstakes, raffle, promotion, or random selection, for which	16
the winner is an individual who receives a prize.	17
"State" means the state of Ohio, including a statewide	18
elected officer, administrative department, administrative	19
department head, or state agency.	20
"State agency" means any organized body, office, agency,	21
commission, board, institution, or other entity established by	22
the laws of the state for the exercise of any function of state	23
government.	24
"Statewide elected officer" means the governor, lieutenant	25
governor, secretary of state, auditor of state, attorney	26
general, and treasurer of state.	27
(B) The state shall not conduct an event for which	28
participation, or eligibility to receive a prize, is dependent	29
on an individual's COVID-19 vaccination status.	30

Any appropriation from appropriation item 440674,	33
Coronavirus Relief - DOH, that the Department of Health has	34
encumbered or set aside for an event described in section	35
3770.23 of the Revised Code in which a winner receives a prize,	36
shall instead be used for the Early Childhood Mental Health	37
initiative within the Department of Mental Health and Addictions	38
Services and the Small Business Grant Relief Program within the	39

item 440674, Coronavirus Relief - DOH, is hereby reduced in	41

Of the amount encumbered or set aside, fifty per cent is	44
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hereby appropriated to appropriation item 336647, Early
Childhood Mental Health, in fiscal year 2021. The remaining
fifty per cent is hereby appropriated to appropriation item

195631, Coronavirus Relief - Small Business Grant, in fiscal

year 2021.

Section 3. Within the limits set forth in this act, the 50 Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts 51 indicating the source and amount of funds for each appropriation 52 made in this act, and shall determine the form and manner in 53 54 which appropriation accounts shall be maintained. Expenditures 55 from operating appropriations contained in this act shall be accounted for as though made in H.B. 166 of the 133rd General 56 Assembly. The operating appropriations made in this act are 57 subject to all provisions of H.B. 166 of the 133rd General 58 Assembly that are generally applicable to such appropriations. 59

Section 4. This act shall be known as the "Taxpayer60Protection Against the Frivolous Vaccine Lottery Act."61

Section 5. This act is hereby declared to be an emergency62measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public63peace, health, and safety. The reason for such necessity is to64prevent the COVID-19 vaccination lottery from taking place.65Therefore, this act shall go into immediate effect.66
