To amend sections 4729.281 and 4729.283	and to	1

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4729.281 and 4729.283 be amended	4
and section 3902.70 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	5
follows:	6
Sec. 3902.70. (A) As used in this section:	7
(1) "Cost-sharing requirement" means the cost to a covered	8
person under a health benefit plan according to any coverage	9
limit, copayment, coinsurance, deductible, or other out-of-	10
pocket expense requirement.	11
(2) "Covered person," "health benefit plan," and "health	12
plan issuer" have the same meanings as in section 3922.01 of the	13
Revised Code.	14
(3) "Licensed health professional authorized to prescribe	15
drugs" has the same meaning as in section 4729.01 of the Revised	16
<u>Code.</u>	17

(B) Notwithstanding section 3901.71 of the Revised Code,	18
if a health plan issuer covers a prescription drug under a	19
health benefit plan, the health plan issuer shall also provide	20
coverage for that drug at least once during any twelve-month	21
period when it is dispensed by a pharmacist to a covered person	22
in accordance with section 4729.281 of the Revised Code.	23
<u>A health benefit plan shall not impose cost-sharing</u>	24
requirements for a drug dispensed in accordance with section	25
4729.281 of the Revised Code that are greater than those imposed	26
when that drug is dispensed in accordance with a prescription	27
issued by a licensed health professional authorized to prescribe	28
<u>drugs.</u>	29
Sec. 4729.281. (A) A pharmacist may dispense or sell-a	30
dangerous drug, other than a schedule II controlled substance as	31
defined in section 3719.01 of the Revised Code, without a	32
written or oral prescription from a licensed health professional	33
authorized to prescribe drugs if all of the following conditions	34
are met:	35
(1) The pharmacy at which the pharmacist works practices	36
has a record of a prescription for the drug in the name of the	37
patient who is requesting it, but the prescription does not	38
provide for a refill or the time permitted by rules adopted by	39
the state board of pharmacy for providing refills has elapsed.	40
(2) The pharmacist is unable to obtain authorization to	41
refill the prescription from the health care professional	42
prescriber who issued the prescription or another health	43
professional prescriber responsible for the patient's care.	44
(3) In the exercise of the pharmacist's professional	45
judgment, the pharmacist determines that both of the following	46

are the case:	47
(a) The drug is essential to sustain the life of the	48
patient or continue therapy for a chronic condition of the	49
patient.	50
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(b) Failure to dispense or sell the drug to the patient	51
could result in harm to the health of the patient.	52
(4) (a) (B) With respect to the amount of a drug that may	53
be dispensed under this section, all of the following apply:	54
<u>(1)</u> Except as provided in division (A)(4)(b) (B)(2) of	55
this section, the amount of the drug that is dispensed or sold	56
under this section does shall not exceed a seventy-two-hour	57
supply as provided in based on the original prescription.	58
(b)(i) Subject to division (A)(4)(b)(ii) of this section,	59
if (2) If the drug dispensed or sold under this section is not a	60
controlled substance and the patient has been on a consistent	61
drug therapy as demonstrated by records maintained by a	62

this section shall do all of the following:	76
(1) For one year after the date of dispensing or sale ,	77
maintain a record in accordance with this chapter of the drug	78
dispensed or sold, including the <u>amount dispensed, the original</u>	79
prescription number, the name and address of the patient and the	80
individual receiving the drug, and, if the individual receiving	81
the drug is not the patient, the amount dispensed or sold, and	82
the original prescription number name and address of that	83
individual;	84
(2) Notify the health professional prescriber who issued	85
the <u>original</u> prescription described in division (A)(1) of this	86
section or another health professional prescriber responsible	87
for the patient's care not later than seventy-two hours after	88
the drug is sold or dispensed;	89
(3) If applicable, obtain authorization for additional	90
dispensing from one of the health professionals prescribers	91
described in division $\frac{(B)(2)}{(C)(2)}$ of this section.	92
$\frac{(C)}{A}$ (D) With respect to the number of times that a	93
pharmacist who dispenses or sells <u>may dispense</u> a drug under this	94
section may do so once f or each <u>a</u> patient based on the original	95
prescription described in division (A)(1) of this section, both	96
of the following apply:	97
(1) In the case of a drug that is dispensed in the amount	98
described in division (B)(2) of this section, not more than	99
three times in any twelve-month period;	100
(2) In the case of any other drug that is dispensed under	101
this section, not more than once.	102
Sec. 4729.283. (A) A pharmacist may dispense naltrexone	103

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without a written or oral prescription from a licensed health	104
professional authorized to prescribe drugs if all of the	105
following conditions are met:	106
(1) The pharmacist is able to verify a record of a	107
prescription for the injectable long-acting or extended-release	108
form of naltrexone in the name of the patient who is requesting	109
the drug, but the prescription does not provide for a refill or	110
the time permitted by rules adopted by the state board of	111
pharmacy for providing refills has elapsed.	112
(2) The pharmacist is unable to obtain authorization to	113
refill the prescription from the prescriber who issued it or	114
another prescriber responsible for the patient's care.	115
(3) In the exercise of the pharmacist's professional	116
judgment, the pharmacist determines that both of the following	117
are the case:	118
(a) The drug is necessary to continue the patient's	119
therapy for substance use disorder.	120
(b) Failure to dispense the drug to the patient could	121
result in harm to the health of the patient.	122
(B) Before dispensing naltrexone under this section, the	123
pharmacist shall offer the patient the choice of receiving	123

(E) A pharmacist shall exercise professional judgment in	155
determining the number of times naltrexone may be dispensed	156

Section 2. That existing sections 4729.281 and 4729.283 of 161
the Revised Code are hereby repealed. 162
Section 3. This act applies to health benefit plans, as 163
defined in section 3922.01 of the Revised Code, delivered, 164
issued for delivery, modified, or renewed on or after the 165
effective date of this section. 166

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
