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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.59 of the Revised Code to create the 2  
"Equality Ohio" license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.59 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 8  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 9  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 10  
in division (B) of this section. 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 12  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 13

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 14  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 15  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 16  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 17

cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20  
other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28  
other money in that fund. 29

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40  
directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 42  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 43  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 44  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 45  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the

future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76  
contributions into its general account to be used for 77  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78  
America foundation. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87  
scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92  
that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 99  
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 100  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 101  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 102  
need. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 104

receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 105  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 106  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 107

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 108  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 109  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 110  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 111  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 112  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 113  
scholarship fund. 114

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 115  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 116  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 117  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 118  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 119  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 120  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 121  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 122  
funds as provided in this section. 123

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 124  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 125  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 126  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 127  
cyclists of all ages. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 130  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 131  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 132  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 133  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 134

educational, and cultural events at the monument. 135

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 136  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 137  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 138  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 139  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 140

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 141  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 142  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 143  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 144  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 146  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 147  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 148  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 149  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 150  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 151  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 152  
sponsors within this state. 153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 154  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 155  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 156  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 157  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 158  
activities. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 161  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 162  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 163

its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 164  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 167  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 168  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 169  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 170  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 171  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 172  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 173  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 175  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 176  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 177  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 178  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 179  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 180  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 181

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 182  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 183  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 184  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 185  
families. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 188  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 189  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 190  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 191  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 192  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 193

destination. 194

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 195  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 196  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 197  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 198  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 199

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 200  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 201  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 202  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 203  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 204  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 205  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 206  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 207  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 208  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 209  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 210

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 211  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 212  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 215  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 216  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 217  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 218  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 219  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 220  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 221  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 222  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 223

promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 224  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 225  
under this section. 226

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 227  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 228  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 229  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 230  
programs. 231

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 232  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 233  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 234  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 235

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 236  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 237  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 238  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 239  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 240

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 241  
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 242  
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 243  
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 244  
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 245  
the person who paid the contribution resides. 246

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 247  
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 248  
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 249  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 250  
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 251  
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 252

ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 253  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 254  
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 255  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 256  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 257  
such payments are to be made. 258

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 259  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 260  
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 261  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 262  
river watershed. 263

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 264  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 265  
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 266  
nature preserve. 267

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 268  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 269  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 270  
the money in support of the park. 271

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 272  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 273  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 274  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 275

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 276  
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 277  
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 278  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 280  
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 281

Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 282  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 283  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 284  
local beekeeping programs. 285

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 286  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 287  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 288  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 289  
legends to inspire future leaders. 290

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 291  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 292  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 293  
the contributions for educational purposes. 294

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 295  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 296  
Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 297  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 298

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 299  
receives pursuant to section 4503.59 of the Revised Code to 300  
equality Ohio, which shall use the contributions to support the 301  
activities of the organization and advancing its mission, 302  
including lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and others 303  
(LGBTQ+) visibility and education. 304

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 305  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 306  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 307  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 308  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 309  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 310

program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 311  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 312

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 313  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 314  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 315  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 316  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 317  
(G) of that section. 318

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 319  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 320  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 321  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 322  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 323  
Ohio and for educational programs. 324

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 325  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 326  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 327  
supporting cancer research. 328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 329  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 330  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 331

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 332  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 333  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 334

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 335  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 336  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 337  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 338  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 339

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the fees into its general account to be used for purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement methods, and teaching respect for law and order.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio concerns of police survivors, which shall use those contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed in the line of duty.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of chiefs of police.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall

use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 398

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 399  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 400  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 401  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 402  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 403  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 404  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 405  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 406  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 407  
participating in that program. 408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 409  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 410  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 411  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 412

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 413  
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 414  
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 415  
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 416  
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 417

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 418  
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 419  
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 420  
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 421  
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 422  
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 423  
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 424  
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 425  
lives to the fullest. 426

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 427  
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 428  
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 429  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 430  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 431

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 432  
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 433  
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 434  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 435  
Cleveland, Ohio. 436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 437  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 438  
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 439  
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 440  
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 441  
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 442  
resides. 443

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 444  
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 445  
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 446  
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 447  
law enforcement education and assistance. 448

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 449  
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 450  
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 451  
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 452  
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 453  
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 454

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 455

receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 456  
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 457  
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 458  
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 459  
rotary foundation. 460

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 461  
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 462  
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 463  
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 464  
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 465

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 466  
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 467  
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 468  
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 469

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 470  
receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the 471  
municipal corporation of Twinsburg. 472

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 473  
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 474  
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 475  
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 476  
connection. 477

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 478  
receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 479  
Medina county historical society, which shall use those 480  
contributions to distribute between the various historical 481  
societies and museums in Medina county. 482

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 483  
receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the 484

Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the 485  
contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and 486  
scholarship purposes. 487

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 488  
receives pursuant to section 4503.767 of the Revised Code to 489  
folds of honor of central Ohio, which shall use the 490  
contributions to provide scholarships to spouses and children 491  
either of disabled veterans or of members of any branch of the 492  
armed forces who died during their service. 493

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 494

receives pursuant to section 4503.956 of the Revised Code to the 1016  
Liberty Center local school district, which shall use the 1017  
contributions for its gifted programs and special education and 1018  
related services. 1019

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1020  
receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to 1021  
John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school 1022  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any political 1023  
purpose. 1024

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1025  
receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1026  
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1027  
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1028  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1029  
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1030  
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1031

the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1032

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1033  
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1034  
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1035  
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1036  
contributions for any political purpose. 1037

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1038  
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1039  
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1040  
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1041  
any political purpose. 1042

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1043  
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1044  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1045  
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1046  
purpose. 1047

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1048  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1049  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1050  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1051  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1052

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1053  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1054  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1055  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1056  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1057

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1058  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1059  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1060

distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1061  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1062  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1063  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1064  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1065

Sec. 4503.59. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1066  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1067  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1068  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1069  
and issuance of "Equality Ohio" license plates. The application 1070  
may be combined with a request for a special reserved license 1071  
plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon 1072  
receipt of the completed application and compliance by the 1073  
applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the 1074  
registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle 1075  
registration and a set of "Equality Ohio" license plates and a 1076  
validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required 1077  
by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1078

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1079  
inscribed on the license plates, "Equality Ohio" license plates 1080  
shall display an appropriate logo and words that are selected by 1081  
representatives of the equality Ohio and approved by the 1082  
registrar. "Equality Ohio" license plates shall display county 1083  
identification stickers that identify the county of registration 1084  
as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1085

(B) "Equality Ohio" license plates and a validation 1086  
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 1087  
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 1088  
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 1089  
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1090

applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1091  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1092  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1093  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1094  
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 1095  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1096  
vehicles. 1097

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 1098  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1099  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of fifteen 1100  
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1101  
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1102  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1103

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1104  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1105  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1106  
of "Equality Ohio" license plates, into the state treasury to 1107  
the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created 1108  
in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1109

**Section 2.** That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 1110  
Code is hereby repealed. 1111
