## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 2305.41, 2305.42, 2305.43,	6

Sec. 2305.42. (A) A person who suffers from epilepsy, 56
diabetes, a cardiac condition, or any other type of illness. 57
whether physical or mental, that causes temporary blackouts, 58
semiconscious periods, or complete unconsciousness, or who 59
suffers from a condition requiring specific medication or 60
medical treatment, is allergic to certain medications or items 61
used in medical treatment, wears contact lenses, has religious 62
objections to certain forms of medication or medical treatment, 63
or is unable to communicate coherently or effectively in the 64
English language, is authorized and encouraged to wear an 65

(B) Any person may carry an identification card. 67
(C) By wearing an identifying device $_{\boldsymbol{L}}$ a person gives his 68
consent for any <u>emergency medical service provider</u> , health care 69
practitioner, or law enforcement officer or medical practitioner 70
who finds <u>him_the person_in a disabled_an incapacitated</u> 71
condition to make do either or both of the following: 72

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or other effects for an identification card; 74 (2) Scan the person's identifying device, if it contains a 75 bar code or quick response code. 76 Sec. 2305.43. (A) A law enforcement officer shall make a 77 diligent effort to determine whether any disabled incapacitated 78 person he the officer finds is an epileptic or a diabetic, or 79 suffers from some other type of a physical or mental illness 80 that would cause the incapacitated condition. Whenever feasible, 81 this effort shall be made before the person is charged with a 82 crime or taken to a place of detention. 83 84 (B) In seeking to determine whether a disabled an incapacitated person suffers from an illness, a law enforcement 85 officer may make a prompt and reasonable search for an 86 identifying device and an-identification card-and examine them-87 for emergency information. The law enforcement officer may not 88 search for an identifying device or an-identification card in a 89 manner or to an extent that would appear to a reasonable person 90 in the circumstances to cause an unreasonable risk of worsening 91 the disabled incapacitated person's condition. 92 If an identifying device or identification card is found, 93 the law enforcement officer may scan or examine it for emergency 94 information. In doing so, the law enforcement officer may 95 inspect both sides of the device or card. 96 (C) A law enforcement officer who finds a disabled an 97 incapacitated person without an identifying device or 98 identification card is not relieved of his the duty to that 99 person to make a diligent effort to ascertain the existence of 100 any illness causing the disabled incapacitated condition.

(D) A cause of action against a law enforcement officer 102

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does not arise from his the officer's making a reasonable search103of the disabled incapacitated person to locate an identifying104device or identification card, even though the person is not105wearing an identifying device or carrying an identification106card.107

(E) A law enforcement officer who determines or has reason 108 to believe that a disabled an incapacitated person is suffering 109 from an illness causing his the person's condition shall 110 promptly notify the person's physician, if practicable. If the 111 officer is unable to ascertain the physician's identity or to 112 communicate with him the physician, the officer shall make a 113 reasonable effort to cause the disabled incapacitated person to 114 be transported immediately to a medical health care practitioner 115 or to a facility where medical treatment is available. If the 116 officer believes it unduly dangerous to move the disabled-117 incapacitated person, he the officer shall make a reasonable 118 effort to obtain the assistance of a medical an emergency 119 medical service provider or health care practitioner. 120

(A) - A medical practitioner or a trained-121 paramedic, in discharging his duty to a disabled person whom he-122 has undertaken to examine or treat, shall When examining or 123 treating an incapacitated person, an emergency medical service 124 provider or health care practitioner may make a prompt and 125 reasonable search for an identifying device or identification 126 card-and. If found, the emergency medical service provider or 127 health care practitioner may scan or examine them it for 128 emergency information, including by inspecting both sides of the 129 identifying device or identification card. 130
