To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.885 of the Revised Code to create the	2
Bishop Hartley High School license plate.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.885 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	10
in division (B) of this section.	11
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	12
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	13
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	17

cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18 quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19 the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20 other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 47 receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 48 Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 49 contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 50 support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75

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future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the76contributions into its general account to be used for77educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of78America foundation.79The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar80receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the814-H youth development program of the Ohio state university82

extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87 scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92 that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94 receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95 Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96 scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97 events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received99pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the100organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that101organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in102need.103

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 104

receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 105 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 106 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 107

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 108 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 109 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 110 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 111 section. A university or college that receives contributions 112 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 113 scholarship fund. 114

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 115 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 116 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 117 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 118 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 119 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 120 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 121 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 124 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 125 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 126 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 127 cyclists of all ages. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 130 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 131 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 132 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 133 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 134

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educational, and cultural events at the monument.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 136 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 137 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 138 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 139 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 140

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar141receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the142Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the143contributions only to promote and support the football team of144Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron district seven which shall annually distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 154 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 155 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 156 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 157 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 158 activities. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 161 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 162 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 163

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its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 164 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 167 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 168 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 169 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 170 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 171 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 172 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 173 the improvement of patient outcomes. 174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 175 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 176 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 177 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 178 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 179 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 180 personnel, veterans, and their families. 181

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 182 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 183 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 184 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 185 families. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 188 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 189 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 190 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 191 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 192 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 193

destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 195 the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 196 to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 197 the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 198 programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 199

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 200 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 201 202 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 203 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 204 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 205 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 206 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 207 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 208 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 209 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 210

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar211receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the212rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 215 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 216 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 217 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 218 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 219 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 220 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 221 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 222 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 223

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promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 224 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 225 under this section. 226

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 227 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 228 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 229 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 230 programs. 231

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar232receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the233western reserve historical society, which shall use the234contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.235

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 236 receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 237 Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 238 negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 239 contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 240

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 241 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 242 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 243 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 244 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 245 the person who paid the contribution resides. 246

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 247 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 248 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 249 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 250 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 251 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 252

ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively253for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and254managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of255Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the256registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which257such payments are to be made.258

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 259 receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 260 Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 261 expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 262 river watershed. 263

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar272receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the273Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the274contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.275

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar276receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the277girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the278contributions to support the activities of the organization.279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar280receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the281

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Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those282contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational283information about beekeeping, and to support other state and284local beekeeping programs.285

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar286receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the287national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the288contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace289legends to inspire future leaders.290

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use the contributions for educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar295receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the296Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the297contributions to support the activities of the organization.298

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 299 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 300 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 301 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 302 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 303 commission and that is participating in the license plate 304 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 305 of the county of residence of an applicant. 306

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each307contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of308the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates309that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is310

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participating in the license plate program pursuant to division	311
(G) of that section.	312
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	313
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to	314

which shall use the contributions for the protection and	316

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 340 receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 341 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 342 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 343 throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 344

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 345 receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 346 charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 347 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349 receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 350 Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 351 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 353 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 354 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 355 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 358 receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 359 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 360 deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 361 purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 362

363 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 364 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 365 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 366 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 367 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 368

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methods, and teaching respect for law and order.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 370 pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 371 concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 372 contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 373 to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 374 in the line of duty. 375

The registrar shall pay the contributions received376pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater377Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those378contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in379the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.380

The registrar shall pay the contributions received381pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio382association of chiefs of police.383

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 384 receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 385 fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 386 to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 387 families. 388

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar389receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the390fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall391use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar393receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the394organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL395association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under396Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association397

shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in398administering a program to secure the proper representation in399the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent400children, and for the training and supervision of persons401participating in that program.402

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar403receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the404Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the405contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.406

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar407receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the408Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention,409which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and410advocacy purposes throughout the state.411

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 412 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 413 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 414 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 415 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 416 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 417 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 418 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 419 lives to the fullest. 420

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar421receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to422Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the423contributions into its general account to be used for purposes424of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.425

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 427 Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 428 commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 429 Cleveland, Ohio. 430

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 431 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 432 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 433 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 434 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 435 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 436 resides. 437

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 438 receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 439 Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 440 contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 441 law enforcement education and assistance. 442

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 443 receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 444 Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 445 moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 446 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 447 agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 448

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar449receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the450rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston,451Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and452used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the453rotary foundation.454

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 456 Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 457 contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 458 under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 459

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar460receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to461buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the462contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.463

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 464 receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the 465 municipal corporation of Twinsburg. 466

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 467 receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 468 Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 469 maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 470 connection. 471

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar472receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the473Medina county historical society, which shall use those474contributions to distribute between the various historical475societies and museums in Medina county.476

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar477receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the478Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the479contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and480scholarship purposes.481

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar482receives pursuant to section 4503.767 of the Revised Code to483folds of honor of central Ohio, which shall use the484

contributions to provide scholarships to spouses and children485either of disabled veterans or of members of any branch of the486armed forces who died during their service.487

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 488 receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 489 Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 490 research projects. 491

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 492 receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 493 Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 494 contributions solely to promote and support the historical 495 preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 496 state. 497

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar498receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the499Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those500contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth501baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City.502

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 503 receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 504 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 505 506 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school district's students that assist 507 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 508 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 509 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 510 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 511 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 512 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 513 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 514

discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 515 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 516 that the school district hires to provide those services. The 517 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 518 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 519 training in providing such services to the students of the 520 school district. The school district shall ensure that any 521 charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 522 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 523 Internal Revenue Code. 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section the investment income the fund earned the previous1061calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an1062entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity1063received from the fund during the previous calendar year.1064

Sec. 4503.885. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger_ 1065 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1066 vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1067 may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1068 and issuance of "Bishop Hartley High School" license plates. The 1069 application may be combined with a request for a special 1070 reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1071 Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1072 compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1073 section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1074 appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Bishop Hartley 1075 High School" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 1076 validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 1077 the Revised Code. 1078

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1079 inscribed on the license plates, "Bishop Hartley High School" 1080 license plates shall display an appropriate logo and words 1081 selected by representatives of Bishop Hartley high school and 1082 that are approved by the registrar. "Bishop Hartley High School" 1083 license plates shall display county identification stickers that 1084 identify the county of registration as required under section 1085 4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1086

(B) "Bishop Hartley High School" license plates and a1087validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued1088upon receipt of an application for registration of a motor1089vehicle under this section; payment of the regular license tax1090
