**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.964 of the Revised Code to create the 2  
"Chardon High School State Champs" license 3  
plate. 4

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 5  
4503.964 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 6

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 7  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 8  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 9  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 10  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 11  
in division (B) of this section. 12

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 13  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 14

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 15  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 16  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 17  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 18

cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 19  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 20  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 21  
other abortion-related activities. 22

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 23  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 24  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 25  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 26  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 27  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 28  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 29  
other money in that fund. 30

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 31  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 32  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 33  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 34

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 35  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 36  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 37  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 38  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 39  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 40  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 41  
directly to their clients. 42

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 43  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 44  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 45  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 46  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 47

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the

future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 77  
contributions into its general account to be used for 78  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 79  
America foundation. 80

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 81  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 82  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 83  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 84  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 86  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 87  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 88  
scholarships and other educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 90  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 91  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 92  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 93  
that organization. 94

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 95  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 96  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 97  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 98  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 100  
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 101  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 102  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 103  
need. 104

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 105

receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 106  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 107  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 108

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 109  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 110  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 111  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 112  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 113  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 114  
scholarship fund. 115

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 116  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 117  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 118  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 119  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 120  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 121  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 122  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 123  
funds as provided in this section. 124

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 125  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 126  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 127  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 128  
cyclists of all ages. 129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 130  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 131  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 132  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 133  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 134  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 135

educational, and cultural events at the monument. 136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 137  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 138  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 139  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 140  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 141

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 142  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 143  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 144  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 145  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 146

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 147  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 148  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 149  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 150  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 151  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 152  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 153  
sponsors within this state. 154

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 155  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 156  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 157  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 158  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 159  
activities. 160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 161  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 162  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 163  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 164

its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 165  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 166

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 167  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 168  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 169  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 170  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 171  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 172  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 173  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 174  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 175

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 176  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 177  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 178  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 179  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 180  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 181  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 182

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 183  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 184  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 185  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 186  
families. 187

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 188  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 189  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 190  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 191  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 192  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 193  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 194

destination. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 196  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 197  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 198  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 199  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 200

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 201  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 202  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 203  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 204  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 205  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 206  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 207  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 208  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 209  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 210  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 212  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 213  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 216  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 217  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 218  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 219  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 220  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 221  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 222  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 223  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 224



promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 225  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 226  
under this section. 227

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 228  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 229  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 230  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 231  
programs. 232

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 233  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 234  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 235  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 236

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 237  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 238  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 239  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 240  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 241

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 242  
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 243  
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 244  
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 245  
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 246  
the person who paid the contribution resides. 247

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 248  
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 249  
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 250  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 251  
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 252  
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 253

ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 254  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 255  
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 256  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 257  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 258  
such payments are to be made. 259

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 260  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 261  
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 262  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 263  
river watershed. 264

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 265  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 266  
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 267  
nature preserve. 268

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 269  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 270  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 271  
the money in support of the park. 272

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 273  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 274  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 275  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 277  
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 278  
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 279  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 280

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 281  
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 282

Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 283  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 284  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 285  
local beekeeping programs. 286

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 287  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 288  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 289  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 290  
legends to inspire future leaders. 291

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 292  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 293  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 294  
the contributions for educational purposes. 295

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 296  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 297  
Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 298  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 299

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 300  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 301  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 302  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 303  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 304  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 305  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 306  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 307

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 308  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 309  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 310  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 311

participating in the license plate program pursuant to division	312
(G) of that section.	313
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	314
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to	315
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program,	316
which shall use the contributions for the protection and	317
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in	318
Ohio and for educational programs.	319
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	320
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to	321
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of	322
supporting cancer research.	323
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	324
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the	325
Stan Hywet hall and gardens.	326
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	327
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the	328
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.	329
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	330
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the	331
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council	332
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner	333
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.	334
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	335
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the	336
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's	337
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable	338
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl	339
scouts.	340

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 341  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 342  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 343  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 344  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 345

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 346  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 347  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 348  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 349

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 350  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 351  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 352  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 353

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 354  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 355  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 356  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 357  
charitable purposes. 358

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 359  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 360  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 361  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 362  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 364  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 365  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 366  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 367  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 368  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 369

methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 370

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 371  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 372  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 373  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 374  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 375  
in the line of duty. 376

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 377  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 378  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 379  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 380  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 381

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 382  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 383  
association of chiefs of police. 384

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 385  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 386  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 387  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 388  
families. 389

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 390  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 391  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 392  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 393

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 394  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 395  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 396  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 397  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 398

shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 399  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 400  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 401  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 402  
participating in that program. 403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 404  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 405  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 406  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 407

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 408  
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 409  
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 410  
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 411  
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 412

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 413  
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 414  
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 415  
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 416  
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 417  
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 418  
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 419  
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 420  
lives to the fullest. 421

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 422  
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 423  
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 424  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 425  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 426

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 427

receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 428  
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 429  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 430  
Cleveland, Ohio. 431

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 432  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 433  
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 434  
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 435  
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 436  
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 437  
resides. 438

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 439  
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 440  
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 441  
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 442  
law enforcement education and assistance. 443

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 444  
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 445  
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 446  
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 447  
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 448  
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 449

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 450  
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 451  
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 452  
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 453  
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 454  
rotary foundation. 455

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 456



receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 457  
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 458  
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 459  
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 460

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 461  
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 462  
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 463  
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 464

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 465  
receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the 466  
municipal corporation of Twinsburg. 467

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 468  
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 469  
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 470  
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 471  
connection. 472

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 473  
receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 474  
Medina county historical society, which shall use those 475  
contributions to distribute between the various historical 476  
societies and museums in Medina county. 477

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 478  
receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the 479  
Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the 480  
contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and 481  
scholarship purposes. 482

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 483  
receives pursuant to section 4503.767 of the Revised Code to 484  
folds of honor of central Ohio, which shall use the 485

contributions to provide scholarships to spouses and children 486  
either of disabled veterans or of members of any branch of the 487

charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1004  
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1005  
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1006  
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1007  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1008  
purpose. 1009

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1010  
receives pursuant to section 4503.956 of the Revised Code to the 1011  
Liberty Center local school district, which shall use the 1012  
contributions for its gifted programs and special education and 1013  
related services. 1014

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1015  
receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to 1016  
John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school 1017  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any political 1018  
purpose. 1019

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1020  
receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1021  
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1022  
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1023  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1024  
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1025  
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1026  
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1027

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1028  
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1029  
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1030  
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1031

contributions for any political purpose. 1032

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1033  
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1034  
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1035  
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1036  
any political purpose. 1037

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1038  
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1039  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1040  
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1041  
purpose. 1042

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1043  
receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to 1044  
Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use 1045  
contributions to fund college and career technical training 1046  
scholarships for students. 1047

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1048  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1049  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1050  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1051  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1052

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1053  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1054  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1055  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1056  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1057

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1058  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1059  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1060

distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1061  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1062  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1063  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1064  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1065

Sec. 4503.964. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1066  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1067  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1068  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1069  
and issuance of "Chardon High School State Football Champs" 1070  
license plates. The application may be combined with a request 1071  
for a special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 1072  
4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed 1073  
application and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) 1074  
and (C) of this section, the registrar shall issue to the 1075  
applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set of 1076  
"Chardon High School State Football Champs" license plates and a 1077  
validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required 1078  
by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1079

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1080  
inscribed on the license plates, "Chardon High School State 1081  
Football Champs" license plates shall display an appropriate 1082  
logo and words that are selected by representatives of Chardon 1083  
high school and approved by the registrar. "Chardon High School 1084  
State Football Champs" license plates shall display county 1085  
identification stickers that identify the county of registration 1086  
as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1087

(B) "Chardon High School State Football Champs" license 1088  
plates and a validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, 1089  
shall be issued upon receipt of an application for registration 1090

of a motor vehicle under this section; payment of the regular 1091  
license tax as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised 1092  
Code, any applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under 1093  
Chapter 4504. of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee 1094  
prescribed by section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an 1095  
additional administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution 1096  
as provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance 1097  
with all other applicable laws relating to the registration of 1098  
motor vehicles. 1099

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 1100  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1101  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty 1102  
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1103  
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1104  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1105

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1106  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1107  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1108  
of "Chardon High School State Football Champs" license plates, 1109  
into the state treasury to the credit of the public safety - 1110  
highway purposes fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised 1111  
Code. 1112

**Section 2.** That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 1113  
Code is hereby repealed. 1114
