## A BILL

To amend sections 4511.092 and 4511.093 of the	1
Revised Code to prohibit a municipal corporation	2
or township that does not operate either a fire	3
department or an emergency medical services	4
organization from utilizing traffic law photo-	5
monitoring devices.	6

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4511.092 and 4511.093 of the	7
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	8
Sec. 4511.092. As used in sections 4511.092 to 4511.0914	9
of the Revised Code:	10
(A) "Designated party" means the person whom the	11
registered owner of a motor vehicle, upon receipt of a ticket	12
based upon images recorded by a traffic law photo-monitoring	
device that indicate a traffic law violation, identifies as the	14
person who was operating the vehicle of the registered owner at	
the time of the violation.	16
(B) "Law enforcement officer" means a sheriff, deputy	17
sheriff, marshal, deputy marshal, police officer of a police	18
department of any municipal corporation, police constable of any	19

township, or police officer of a township or joint police20district, who is employed on a permanent, full-time basis by the21law enforcement agency of a local authority that assigns such22person to the location of a traffic law photo-monitoring device.23

(C) (1) "Local authority" means a municipal corporation, county, or township, except that "local authority" does not include any municipal corporation that does not operate either a municipal fire department or a municipal emergency medical service organization or any township that does not operate either a township fire department or a township emergency medical service organization.

(2) As used in division (C)(1) of this section, "emergency medical service organization" means an organization operated by the municipal corporation or township that uses first responders, EMTs-basic, EMTs-I, or paramedics, or a combination of first responders, EMTs-basic, EMTs-I, and paramedics to provide emergency medical services.

(3) As used in division (C)(1) of this section, "fire department" means a fire department of a municipal corporation or township, as applicable, but does not include a volunteer fire department.

(D) "Motor vehicle leasing dealer" has the same meaning as in section 4517.01 of the Revised Code.

(E) "Motor vehicle renting dealer" has the same meaning as43in section 4549.65 of the Revised Code.44

(F) "Recorded images" means any of the following images
recorded by a traffic law photo-monitoring device that show, on
at least one image or on a portion of the videotape, the rear of
a motor vehicle and the letters and numerals on the rear license

plate of the vehicle: 49 (1) Two or more photographs, microphotographs, electronic 50 images, or digital images; 51 (2) Videotape. 52 (G) "Registered owner" means all of the following: 53 (1) Any person or entity identified by the bureau of motor 54 vehicles or any other state motor vehicle registration bureau, 55 department, or office as the owner of a motor vehicle; 56 (2) The lessee of a motor vehicle under a lease of six 57 months or longer; 58 (3) The renter of a motor vehicle pursuant to a written 59 rental agreement with a motor vehicle renting dealer. 60 (H) "System location" means the approach to an 61 intersection or area of roadway toward which a traffic law 62 photo-monitoring device is directed and is in operation. 63 (I) "Ticket" means any traffic ticket, citation, summons, 64 or other ticket issued in response to an alleged traffic law 65 violation detected by a traffic law photo-monitoring device, 66 that represents a civil violation. 67 (J) "Traffic law photo-monitoring device" means an 68 electronic system consisting of a photographic, video, or 69 electronic camera and a means of sensing the presence of a motor 70 vehicle that automatically produces recorded images. 71 (K) "Traffic law violation" means either of the following: 72 (1) A violation of section 4511.12 of the Revised Code 73 based on the failure to comply with section 4511.13 of the 74

Revised Code or a substantially equivalent municipal ordinance 75

that occurs at an intersection due to failure to obey a traffic 76 77 control signal; (2) A violation of section 4511.21 or 4511.211 of the 78 Revised Code or a substantially equivalent municipal ordinance 79 due to failure to observe the applicable speed limit. 80 Sec. 4511.093. (A) A local authority may utilize a traffic 81 law photo-monitoring device for the purpose of detecting traffic 82 law violations. If the local authority is a county or township, 83 the board of county commissioners or the board of township 84 85 trustees may adopt such resolutions as may be necessary to enable the county or township to utilize traffic law photo-86 monitoring devices. 87 (B) The use of a traffic law photo-monitoring device is 88 subject to the following conditions: 89 (1) A local authority shall use a traffic law photo-90 monitoring device to detect and enforce traffic law violations 91 only if a law enforcement officer is present at the location of 92 the device at all times during the operation of the device and 93 if the local authority complies with sections 4511.094 and 94

(2) A law enforcement officer who is present at the

location of any traffic law photo-monitoring device and who
97
personally witnesses a traffic law violation may issue a ticket

for the violation. Such a ticket shall be issued in accordance

with section 2935.26 of the Revised Code and is not subject to

sections 4511.096 to 4511.0910 and section 4511.912 of the
Revised Code.

(3) If a traffic law photo-monitoring device records atraffic law violation and the law enforcement officer who was

present at the location of the traffic law photo-monitoring105device does not issue a ticket as provided under division (B)(2)106of this section, the local authority may only issue a ticket in107accordance with sections 4511.096 to 4511.0912 of the Revised108Code.109

(C) No township constable appointed under section 509.01
of the Revised Code, member of a police force of a township or
joint police district created under section 505.48 or 505.482 of
the Revised Code, or other representative of a township shall
utilize a traffic law photo-monitoring device to detect and

enforce traffic law violations on an interstate highway.

(D) No municipal corporation or township that is not a116local authority as defined in section 4511.092 of the Revised117Code shall utilize any traffic law photo-monitoring device.118

Section 2. That existing sections 4511.092 and 4511.093 of 119 the Revised Code are hereby repealed. 120
