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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.532 of the Revised Code to create the "Paul 2  
Laurence Dunbar" license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.532 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 8  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 9  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 10  
in division (B) of this section. 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 12  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 13

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 14  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 15  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 16  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 17

cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20  
other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28  
other money in that fund. 29

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40  
directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 42  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 43  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 44  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 45  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the

future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76  
contributions into its general account to be used for 77  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78  
America foundation. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87  
scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92  
that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 99  
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 100  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 101  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 102  
need. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 104

receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 105  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 106  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 107

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 108  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 109  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 110  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 111  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 112  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 113  
scholarship fund. 114

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 115  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 116  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 117  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 118  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 119  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 120  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 121  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 122  
funds as provided in this section. 123

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 124  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 125  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 126  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 127  
cyclists of all ages. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 130  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 131  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 132  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 133  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 134

educational, and cultural events at the monument. 135

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 136  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 137  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 138  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 139  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 140

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 141  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 142  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 143  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 144  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 146  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 147  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 148  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 149  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 150  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 151  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 152  
sponsors within this state. 153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 154  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 155  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 156  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 157  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 158  
activities. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 161  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 162  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 163

its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 164  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 167  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 168  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 169  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 170  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 171  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 172  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 173  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 175  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 176  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 177  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 178  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 179  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 180  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 181

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 182  
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 183  
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 184  
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 185

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 186  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 187  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 188  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 189  
families. 190

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 191  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 192

pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 193  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 194  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 195  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 196  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 197  
destination. 198

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 199  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 200  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 201  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 202  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 203

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 204  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 205  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 206  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 207  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 208  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 209  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 210  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 211  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 212  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 213  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 216  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 217

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 218  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 219  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 220  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 221  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 222



members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 223  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 224  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 225  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 226  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 227  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 228  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 229  
under this section. 230

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 231  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 232  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 233  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 234  
programs. 235

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 236  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 237  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 238  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 239

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 240  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 241  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 242  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 243  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 244

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 245  
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 246  
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 247  
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 248  
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 249  
the person who paid the contribution resides. 250

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 251

receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 252  
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 253  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 254  
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 255  
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 256  
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 257  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 258  
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 259  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 260  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 261  
such payments are to be made. 262

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 263  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 264  
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 265  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 266  
river watershed. 267

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 268  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 269  
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 270  
nature preserve. 271

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 272  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 273  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 274  
the money in support of the park. 275

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 276  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 277  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 278  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 280

receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 281  
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 282  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 283

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 284  
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 285  
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 286  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 287  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 288  
local beekeeping programs. 289

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 290  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 291  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 292  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 293  
legends to inspire future leaders. 294

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 295  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 296  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 297  
the contributions for educational purposes. 298

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 299  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 300  
Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 301  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 302

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 303  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 304  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 305  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 306  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 307  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 308  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 309

of the county of residence of an applicant. 310

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 311  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 312  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 313  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 314  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 315  
(G) of that section. 316

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 317  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 318  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 319  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 320  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 321  
Ohio and for educational programs. 322

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 323  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 324  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 325  
supporting cancer research. 326

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 327  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 328  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 329

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 330  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 331  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 332

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 333  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 334  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 335  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 336  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 338

receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 339  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 340  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 341  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 342  
scouts. 343

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 344  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 345  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 346  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 347  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 350  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 351  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 353  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 354  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 355  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 357  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 358  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 359  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 360  
charitable purposes. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 362  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 363  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 364  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 365  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 366

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 367

receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 368  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 369  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 370  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 371  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 372  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 373

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 374  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 375  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 376  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 377  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 378  
in the line of duty. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 380  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 381  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 382  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 383  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 384

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 385  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 386  
association of chiefs of police. 387

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 388  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 389  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 390  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 391  
families. 392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 393  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 394  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 395  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in administering a program to secure the proper representation in the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent children, and for the training and supervision of persons participating in that program.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their lives to the fullest.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to

Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 427  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 428  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 429

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 430  
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 431  
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 432  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 433  
Cleveland, Ohio. 434

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 435  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 436  
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 437  
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 438  
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 439  
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 440  
resides. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 442  
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 443  
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 444  
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 445  
law enforcement education and assistance. 446

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 447  
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 448  
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 449  
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 450  
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 451  
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 453  
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 454  
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 455



Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 456  
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 457  
rotary foundation. 458

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 459  
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 460  
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 461  
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 462  
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 463

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 464  
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 465  
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 466  
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 467

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 468  
receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the 469  
municipal corporation of Twinsburg. 470

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 471  
receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 472  
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 473  
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 474  
connection. 475

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 476  
receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 477  
Medina county historical society, which shall use those 478  
contributions to distribute between the various historical 479  
societies and museums in Medina county. 480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 481  
receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the 482  
Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the 483  
contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and 484

scholarship purposes. 485

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 486  
receives pursuant to section 4503.767 of the Revised Code to 487  
folds of honor of central Ohio, which shall use the 488

subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1010  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1011  
purpose. 1012

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1013  
receives pursuant to section 4503.956 of the Revised Code to the 1014  
Liberty Center local school district, which shall use the 1015  
contributions for its gifted programs and special education and 1016  
related services. 1017

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1018  
receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to 1019  
John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school 1020  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any political 1021  
purpose. 1022

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1023  
receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1024  
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1025  
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1026  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1027  
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1028  
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1029  
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1030

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1031

receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1032  
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1033  
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1034  
contributions for any political purpose. 1035

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1036  
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1037  
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1038  
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1039  
any political purpose. 1040

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1041  
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1042  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1043  
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1044  
purpose. 1045

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1046  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1047  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1048  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1049  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1050

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1051  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1052  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1053  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1054  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1055

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1056  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1057  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1058  
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1059  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1060

calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1061  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1062  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1063

Sec. 4503.532. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1064  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1065  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1066  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1067  
and issuance of "Paul Laurence Dunbar" license plates. The 1068  
application may be combined with a request for a special 1069  
reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1070  
Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1071  
compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1072  
section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1073  
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Paul Laurence 1074  
Dunbar" license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation 1075  
sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised 1076  
Code. 1077

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1078  
inscribed on the license plates, "Paul Laurence Dunbar" license 1079  
plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that are 1080  
selected by representatives of the Ohio history connection and 1081  
approved by the registrar. "Paul Laurence Dunbar" license plates 1082  
shall display county identification stickers that identify the 1083  
county of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the 1084  
Revised Code. 1085

(B) "Paul Laurence Dunbar" license plates and a validation 1086  
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 1087  
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 1088  
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 1089  
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1090

applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1091  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1092  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1093  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1094  
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 1095  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1096  
vehicles. 1097

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 1098  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1099  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of ten 1100  
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1101  
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1102  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1103

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1104  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1105  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1106  
of "Paul Laurence Dunbar" license plates, into the state 1107  
treasury to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes 1108  
fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1109

**Section 2.** That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 1110  
Code is hereby repealed. 1111
