A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.532 of the Revised Code to create the "Paul	2
Laurence Dunbar" license plate.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.532 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	10
in division (B) of this section.	11
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	12
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	13
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	17

cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18 quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19 the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20 other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 47 receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 48 Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 49 contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 50 support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75

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future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76 contributions into its general account to be used for 77 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78 America foundation. 79 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82

extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87 scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92 that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94 receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95 Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96 scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97 events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received99pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the100organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that101organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in102need.103

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 104

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receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 105 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 106 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 107

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 108 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 109 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 110 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 111 section. A university or college that receives contributions 112 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 113 scholarship fund. 114

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 124 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 125 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 126 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 127 cyclists of all ages. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 130 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 131 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 132 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 133 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 134

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educational, and cultural events at the monument.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 136 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 137 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 138 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 139 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 140

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar141receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the142Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the143contributions only to promote and support the football team of144Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron district seven which shall annually distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 154 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 155 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 156 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 157 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 158 activities. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 161 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 162 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 163

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its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services	164
to children, young adults, and families in this state.	165
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	166
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the	167
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it	168
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships	169
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession,	170
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance	171
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing	172
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and	173
the improvement of patient outcomes.	174
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	175
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the	176
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation	177
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that	178

programs it sponsors in support of United States military	180
personnel, veterans, and their families.	181
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	182
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the	183
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for	184
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house.	185
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	186
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the	187
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for	188
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their	189
families.	190

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 191 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 192

pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions193into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall194be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football195hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose196of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel197destination.198

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 204 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 205 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 206 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 207 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 208 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 209 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 210 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 211 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 212 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 213 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar218receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the219Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit220corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section,221the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the222

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members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 223 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 224 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 225 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 226 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 227 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 228 229 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received under this section. 230

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 236 receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 237 western reserve historical society, which shall use the 238 contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 239

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar240receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the241Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple242negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the243contributions for charitable and educational purposes.244

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 245 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 246 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 247 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 248 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 249 the person who paid the contribution resides. 250

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 252 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 253 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 254 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 255 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 256 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 257 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 258 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 259 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 260 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 261 such payments are to be made. 262

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar276receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the277Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the278contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 280

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receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 281 girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 282 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 283

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 284 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 285 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 286 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 287 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 288 local beekeeping programs. 289

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 290 receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 291 national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 292 contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 293 legends to inspire future leaders. 294

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use the contributions for educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar299receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the300Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the301contributions to support the activities of the organization.302

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 303 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 304 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 305 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 306 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 307 commission and that is participating in the license plate 308 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 309

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of the county of residence of an applicant. 310

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (G) of that section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 317 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 318 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 319 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 320 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 321 Ohio and for educational programs. 322

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar323receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to324pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of325supporting cancer research.326

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar327receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the328Stan Hywet hall and gardens.329

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar330receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the331Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.332

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar333receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the334Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council335shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner336throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 338

receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 339 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 340 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 341 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 342 scouts. 343

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar344receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the345Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council346shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner347throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349 receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 350 charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 351 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar353receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the354Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,355which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 357 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 358 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 359 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 360 charitable purposes. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar362receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the363fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall364deposit the fees into its general account to be used for365purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.366

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 367

receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 368 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 369 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 370 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 371 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 372 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 373

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 374 pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 375 concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 376 contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 377 to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 378 in the line of duty. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions received380pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater381Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those382contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in383the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.384

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of chiefs of police.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar393receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the394fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall395use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.396

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 397 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 398 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 399 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 400 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 401 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 402 403 administering a program to secure the proper representation in the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 404 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 405 406 participating in that program.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar407receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the408Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the409contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.410

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 411 receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 412 Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 413 which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 414 advocacy purposes throughout the state. 415

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 416 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 417 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 418 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 419 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 420 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 421 422 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 423 lives to the fullest. 424

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar425receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to426

contributions into its general account to be used for purposes	428

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	430

receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 431 Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 432 commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 433 Cleveland, Ohio. 434

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 435 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 436 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 437 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 438 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 439 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 440 resides. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 443 Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 444 contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 445 law enforcement education and assistance.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 447 receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 448 Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 449 moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 450 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 451 agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 453 receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 454 rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 455 Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and456used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the457rotary foundation.458The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar459receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the460

Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the461contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained462under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.463

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar464receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to465buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the466contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.467

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar468receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the469municipal corporation of Twinsburg.470

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 471 receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 472 Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 473 maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 474 connection. 475

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar476receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the477Medina county historical society, which shall use those478contributions to distribute between the various historical479societies and museums in Medina county.480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar481receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the482Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the483contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and484

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scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar486receives pursuant to section 4503.767 of the Revised Code to487folds of honor of central Ohio, which shall use the488contributions to provide scholarships to spouses and children489either of disabled veterans or of members of any branch of the490armed forces who died during their service.491

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar492receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the493Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area494research projects.495

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those contributions solely to promote and support the historical preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar502receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the503Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those504contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth505baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City.506

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 507 receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 508 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 509 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 510 providing services to the school district's students that assist 511 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 512 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 513

counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 514 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 515 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 516 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 517 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 518 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 519 520 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations that the school district hires to provide those services. The 521 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 522 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 523 training in providing such services to the students of the 524 school district. The school district shall ensure that any 525 charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 526 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 527 Internal Revenue Code.
