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**A BILL**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That sections 4501.21, 4503.551, 4503.553, 21  
4503.581, 4503.715, 5533.34, and 5534.45 be amended and sections 22  
4503.519, 4503.532, 4503.533, 4503.559, 4503.569, 4503.582, 23  
4503.583, 4503.584, 4503.704, 4503.741, 4503.885, 4503.886, 24  
4503.887, 4503.933, 4503.964, 5534.153, 5534.161, 5534.181, 25  
5534.417, 5534.421, 5534.422, 5534.434, 5534.435, 5534.436, 26  
5534.437, 5534.438, 5534.439, 5534.483, 5534.484, 5534.495, 27  
5534.496, 5534.498, 5534.513, 5534.515, 5534.518, 5534.54, 28

be enacted to read as follows: 33

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 34  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 35  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 36  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 37  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 38  
in division (B) of this section. 39

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 40  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 42  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 43  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 44

programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 45  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 46  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 47  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 48  
other abortion-related activities. 49

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 50  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 51  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 52  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 53  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 54  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 55  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 56  
other money in that fund. 57

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 58  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 59  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 60  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 61

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 62  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 63  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 64  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 65  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 66  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 67  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 68  
directly to their clients. 69

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 70  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 71  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 72  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 73  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 74

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the

future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 104  
contributions into its general account to be used for 105  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 106  
America foundation. 107

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 108  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 109  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 110  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 111  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 112

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 113  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 114  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 115  
scholarships and other educational activities. 116

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 117  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 118  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 119  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 120  
that organization. 121

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 122  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 123  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 124  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 125  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 126

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 127  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 128  
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 129  
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 130  
programming. 131

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 132

pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 133  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 134  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 135  
need. 136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 137  
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 138  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 139  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 140

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 141  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 142  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 143  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 144  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 145  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 146  
scholarship fund. 147

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 148  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 149  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 150  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 151  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 152  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 153  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 154  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 155  
funds as provided in this section. 156

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 157  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 158  
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 159  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 160  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 161  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 162

program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 163  
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 164  
funds as provided in this section. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 167  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 168  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 169  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 170  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 171  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 172  
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 173  
funds as provided in this section. 174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 175  
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 176  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 177  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 178

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 179  
receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 180  
equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 181  
Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 182  
advocates for addiction recovery). 183

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 184  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 185  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 186  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 187  
cyclists of all ages. 188

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 189  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 190  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 191

incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 192  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 193  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 194  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 196  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 197  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 198  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 199  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 200

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 201  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 202  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 203  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 204  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 205

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 206  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 207  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 208  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 209  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 210  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 211  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 212  
sponsors within this state. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 215  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 216  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 217  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 218  
activities. 219

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 220



receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 221  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 222  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 223  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 224  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 225

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 226  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 227  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 228  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 229  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 230  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 231  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 232  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 233  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 234

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 235  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 236  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 237  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 238  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 239  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 240  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 241

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 242  
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 243  
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 244  
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 245

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 246  
receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 247  
nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 248  
health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 249  
further the nonprofit's mission. 250

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and cats and for educational programs concerning the proper veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 281  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 282

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 283  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 284  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 285  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 286  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 287  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 288  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 289  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 290  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 291  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 292  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 293  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 294  
under this section. 295

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 296  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 297  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 298  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 299  
programs. 300

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 301  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 302  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 303  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 304

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 305  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 306  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 307  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 308  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 309

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use the contributions to further its mission of presenting and producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing arts education, and creating a superior destination for entertainment, business, and residential living.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and rehabilitation, and educational programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the

national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 369  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 370  
legends to inspire future leaders. 371

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 372  
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 373  
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 374  
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 375  
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 376  
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 377  
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 378

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 379  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 380  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 381  
the contributions for educational purposes. 382

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 383  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 384  
Ohio ~~sons of the American legion~~past detachment commander's 385  
club, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the 386  
activities of the organization. 387

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 388  
receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 389  
progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 390  
shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 391  
center. 392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 393  
receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 394  
American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 395  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 397

receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the 398  
Ohio oil and gas energy education foundation to fund 399  
scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and 400  
natural gas industry. 401

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 402  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 403  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 404  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 405  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 406  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 407  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 408  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 409

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 410  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 411  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 412  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 413  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 414  
(G) of that section. 415

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 416  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 417  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 418  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 419  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 420  
Ohio and for educational programs. 421

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 422  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 423  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 424  
supporting cancer research. 425

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 426

receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 427  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 428

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 429  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 430  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 431

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 432  
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 433  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 434  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 435  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 437  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 438  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 439  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 440  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 442  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 443  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 444  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 445  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 446  
scouts. 447

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 448  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 449  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 450  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 451  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 453  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 454  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 455



which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 456

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 457  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 458  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 459  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 460

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 461  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 462  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 463  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 464  
charitable purposes. 465

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 466  
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 467  
Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose. 468

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 469  
receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the 470  
Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation 471  
of Dayton. 472

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 473  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 474  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 475  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 476  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 477
