Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 34 treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 35 consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 36 by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 37 motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 38 in division (B) of this section. 39

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the40registrar collects in the fund as follows:41

The registrar shall pay the contributions received42pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast43cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for44

programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast45cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to46quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of47the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or48other abortion-related activities.49

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 75 receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 76 Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 77 contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 78 support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar92receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to93the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to94raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic95pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.96

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 97 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 98 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 99 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 100 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 101

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar102receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the103

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future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the104contributions into its general account to be used for105educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of106America foundation.107

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 108 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 109 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 110 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 111 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 112

The registrar shall pay the contributions received113pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio114cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for115scholarships and other educational activities.116

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 117 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 118 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 119 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 120 that organization. 121

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar122receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to123Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for124scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or125events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.126

The registrar shall pay the contributions received127pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio128aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to129facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational130programming.131

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 132

pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the133organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that134organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in135need.136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the Ohio chapters of a kid again.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 141 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 142 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 143 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 144 section. A university or college that receives contributions 145 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 146 scholarship fund. 147

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar157receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to158Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes159of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who160attend the university. The university shall not use any of the161funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship162

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program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements163with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such164funds as provided in this section.165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 167 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 168 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 169 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 170 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 171 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 172 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 173 funds as provided in this section. 174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 175 receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 176 Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 177 contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 178

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar179receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code180equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of181Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen182advocates for addiction recovery).183

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio cyclists of all ages.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 189 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 190 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 191

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incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 192
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 193
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 194
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 196 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 197 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 198 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 199 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 200

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 201 receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 202 Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 203 contributions only to promote and support the football team of 204 Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 205

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 206 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 207 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 208 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 209 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 210 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 211 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 212 sponsors within this state. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 215 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 216 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 217 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 218 activities. 219

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 221 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 222 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 223 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 224 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 225

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 226 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 227 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 228 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 229 230 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 231 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 232 233 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and the improvement of patient outcomes. 234

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 235 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 236 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 237 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 238 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 239 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 240 personnel, veterans, and their families. 241

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar246receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the247nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry248health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to249further the nonprofit's mission.250

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 251 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 252 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 253 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 254 families. 255

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 269 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 270 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 271 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 272 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 273 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 274 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 275 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 276 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 277 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 278 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 280

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receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 281 rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 282

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 283 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 284 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 285 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 286 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 287 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 288 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 289 290 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 291 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 292 293 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 294 under this section. 295

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar301receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the302western reserve historical society, which shall use the303contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.304

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar305receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the306Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple307negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the308contributions for charitable and educational purposes.309

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The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 310 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 311 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 312 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 313 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 314 the person who paid the contribution resides. 315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar316receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to317playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use318the contributions to further its mission of presenting and319producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing320arts education, and creating a superior destination for321entertainment, business, and residential living.322

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 323 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 324 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 325 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 326 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 327 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 328 329 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 330 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 331 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 332 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 333 such payments are to be made. 334

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 335 receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 336 Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 337 expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 338 river watershed. 339 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 340 receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 341 Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 342 nature preserve. 343

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar348receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the349Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the350contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.351

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar352receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the353girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the354contributions to support the activities of the organization.355
