# BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4501.21 and 4503.715 be amended	9
and sections 4503.519, 4503.582, 4503.704, 4503.741, 4503.885,	10
4503.886, 5534.417, 5534.434, 5534.435, 5534.54, 5534.608,	11
5534.641, 5534.836, 5534.845, 5534.889, 5534.915, 5534.921, and	12
5534.924 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	13
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	14
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	15
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	16
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	17

in division (B) of this section.

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the20registrar collects in the fund as follows:21

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 38 pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 39 society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 40 and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar42receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the43national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal44amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley45chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These46chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to47

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assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 50 receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 51 national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 52 it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 53 pancreatic cancer and their families. 54

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar60receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the61St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for62its research and other programs.63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to65special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions66for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.67

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 68 receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 69 children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 70 contributions for its research and other programs. 71

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar72receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to73the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to74raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic75pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.76

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 77 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 78 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 79 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 80 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 81

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 93 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 94 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 95 scholarships and other educational activities. 96

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 97 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 98 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 99 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 100 that organization. 101

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar102receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to103Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for104scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or105

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events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 106

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational programming.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received112pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the113organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that114organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in115need.116

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the Ohio chapters of a kid again.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 121 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 122 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 123 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 124 section. A university or college that receives contributions 125 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 126 scholarship fund. 127

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 128 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 129 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 130 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 131 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 132 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 133 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 134

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university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 135 funds as provided in this section. 136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 137 receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 138 Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 139 of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 140 attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 141 funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 142 program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 143 with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 144 funds as provided in this section. 145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar155receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the156Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the157contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign.158

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar159receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code160equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of161Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen162advocates for addiction recovery).163

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 164 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 165 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 166 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 167 cyclists of all ages. 168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 169 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 170 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 171 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 172 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 173 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 174 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 175

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar176receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the177fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for178the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the179lighthouses of fairport harbor.180

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar181receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the182Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the183contributions only to promote and support the football team of184Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.185

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 186 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 187 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 188 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 189 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 190 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 191 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 192 sponsors within this state. 193

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 194 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 195 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 196 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 197 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 198 activities. 199

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 200 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 201 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 202 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 203 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 204 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 205

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 206 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 207 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 208 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 209 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 210 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 211 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 212 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 213 the improvement of patient outcomes. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 216 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 217 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 218 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 219 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 220 personnel, veterans, and their families. 221

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar222receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the223

disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 224 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 225 families. 226

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 227 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 228 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 229 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 230 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 231 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 232 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 233 destination. 234

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

240 The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 241 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 242 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 243 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 244 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 245 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 246 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 247 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 248 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 249 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 250

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar251receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the252rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.253

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 254 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 255 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 256 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 257 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 2.58 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 259 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 260 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 261 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 262 263 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 264 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 265 under this section. 266

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar272receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the273western reserve historical society, which shall use the274contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.275

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar276receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the277Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple278negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the279contributions for charitable and educational purposes.280

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar281receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the282central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities,283

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which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the284Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory285the person who paid the contribution resides.286

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 287 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 288 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 289 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 290 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 291 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 292 293 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 294 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 295 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 296 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 297 such payments are to be made. 298

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 304 receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 305 Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 306 nature preserve. 307

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 308 receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 309 conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 310 the money in support of the park. 311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 313 Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 314 contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar316receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the317girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the318contributions to support the activities of the organization.319

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 320 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 321 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 322 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 323 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 324 local beekeeping programs. 325

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar326receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the327national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the328contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace329legends to inspire future leaders.330

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 331 receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 332 keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 333 contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 334 to take greater responsibility for improving the local 335 environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 336 greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 338 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 339 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 340 the contributions for educational purposes. 341

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar342receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the343Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the344contributions to support the activities of the organization.345

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar346receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the347progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which348shall use the contributions to support the activities of the349center.350

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 351 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 352 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 353 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 354 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 355 commission and that is participating in the license plate 356 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 357 of the county of residence of an applicant. 358

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each359contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of360the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates361that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is362participating in the license plate program pursuant to division363(G) of that section.364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 365 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 366 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 367 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 368 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 369 Ohio and for educational programs. 370

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 371 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 372 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 373 supporting cancer research. 374

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the Stan Hywet hall and gardens.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar378receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the379Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.380

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 381 receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 382 Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 383 contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 384 pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 385

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar386receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the387Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council388shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner389throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.390

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 391 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 392 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 393 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 394 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 395 scouts. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar397receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the398Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council399

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shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner400throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.401

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar402receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the403charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m.,404which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.405

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar406receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the407Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,408which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 410 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 411 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 412 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 413 charitable purposes. 414

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar418receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the419Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation420of Dayton.421

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar422receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the423fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall424deposit the fees into its general account to be used for425purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.426

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar427receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the428

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fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall429deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be430used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law431enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement432methods, and teaching respect for law and order.433

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 434 pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 435 concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 436 contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 437 to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 438 in the line of duty. 439

The registrar shall pay the contributions received440pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater441Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those442contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in443the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.444

The registrar shall pay the contributions received445pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio446association of chiefs of police.447

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar448receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the449fallen linemen organizationcommunity foundation of Ohio's450electric cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to451recognize and memorialize fallen linemen or injured lineworkers452and support their families.453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar454receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the455fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall456use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.457

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 458 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 459 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 460 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 461 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 462 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 463 464 administering a program to secure the proper representation in the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 465 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 466 467 participating in that program.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar468receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the469Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the470contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.471

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar472receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the473Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention,474which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and475advocacy purposes throughout the state.476

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 477 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 478 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 479 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 480 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 481 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 482 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 483 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 484 lives to the fullest. 485

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar486receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to487

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Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the	488
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes	489

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	491

receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 492 Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 493 commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 494 Cleveland, Ohio.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 496 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 497 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 498 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 499 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 500 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 501 resides. 502

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 503 receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 504 Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 505 contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 506 law enforcement education and assistance. 507
