BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4717.04 of the Revised Code be	7
amended to read as follows:	8
Sec. 4717.04. (A) The board of embalmers and funeral	9
directors shall adopt rules in accordance with Chapter 119. of	10
the Revised Code for the government, transaction of the	11
business, and the management of the affairs of the board of	12
embalmers and funeral directors and the crematory review board,	13
and for the administration and enforcement of this chapter.	14
These rules shall include all of the following:	15
(1) The nature, scope, content, and form of the	16
application that must be completed and license examination that	17
must be passed in order to receive an embalmer's license or a	18
funeral director's license under section 4717.05 of the Revised	19

Code. The rules shall ensure both of the following:	20
(a) That the embalmer's license examination tests the	21
applicant's knowledge through at least a comprehensive section	22
and an Ohio laws section;	23
(b) That the funeral director's license examination tests	24
the applicant's knowledge through at least a comprehensive	25
section, an Ohio laws section, and a sanitation section.	
(2) The minimum license examination score necessary to be	27
licensed under section 4717.05 of the Revised Code as an	28
embalmer or as a funeral director;	29
(3) Procedures for determining the dates of the embalmer's	30
and funeral director's license examinations, which shall be	31
administered at least once each year, the time and place of each	32
examination, and the supervision required for each examination;	33
(4) Procedures for determining whether the board shall	34
accept an applicant's compliance with the licensure,	35
registration, or certification requirements of another state as	36
grounds for granting the applicant a license under this chapter;	37
(5) A determination of whether completion of a nationally	38
recognized embalmer's or funeral director's examination	39
sufficiently meets the license requirements for the	40
comprehensive section of either the embalmer's or the funeral	41
director's license examination administered under this chapter;	42
(6) Continuing education requirements for licensed	43

(h) Failing to forward to the board on or before its due	77
date the annual report of preneed funeral sales required by	78
division (J) of section 4717.31 of the Revised Code. If the	79
annual report is sent to the board by United States mail, it	80
shall be postmarked on or before the due date for the submission	81
of the annual report in order to be timely filed with the board.	82
Mail that is not postmarked shall be considered filed on the	83
date it is received by the board.	84
Each instance of the commission of any of the types of	85
conduct described in division (A)(9) of this section is a	86
separate violation. The rules adopted under division (A)(9) of	87
this section shall establish the amount of the forfeiture for a	88
violation of each of those divisions. The forfeiture for a first	89
violation shall not exceed five thousand dollars, and the	90
forfeiture for a second or subsequent violation shall not exceed	91
ten thousand dollars. The amount of the forfeiture may differ	92
among the types of violations according to what the board	93
considers the seriousness of each violation.	94
(10) Requirements for the licensing and operation of	95
crematory facilities;	96
(11) Procedures for the board to take possession of and to	97
arrange the lawful disposition of unclaimed cremated remains	98
that were held or stored at a funeral home or crematory that has	99
been closed;	100
(12) Procedures for the issuance of duplicate licenses;	101
(13) Requirements for criminal records checks of	102
applicants under section 4776.03 of the Revised Code;	103
(14) The amount and content of corrective action courses	104

required by the board under section 4717.14 of the Revised Code.	
(B) The board may adopt rules governing the educational	106
standards for licensure as an embalmer or funeral director, or	107
obtaining a permit to be a crematory operator, and the standards	
of service and practice to be followed in embalming, funeral	
directing, and cremation, and in the operation of funeral homes,	110
embalming facilities, and crematory facilities in this state.	111
(C) Nothing in this chapter authorizes the board of	112
embalmers and funeral directors to regulate cemeteries, except	113
that the board shall license and regulate funeral homes,	114
embalming facilities, and crematory facilities located at	115
cemeteries in accordance with this chapter.	
(D) If the executive director of the board has knowledge	117
or notice of a violation of division (A)(1), (3), (5), or (6) of	118
section 4717.13 of the Revised Code or that a person is engaging	119
in the business or profession of funeral directing in violation	120
of division (A)(14) of that section, the executive director	
shall investigate the matter, and, upon probable cause	122
appearing, cause an attorney employed by or contracting with the	123
board to file a complaint and prosecute the offender. When	124
requested by the executive director, the prosecuting attorney of	125
the proper county or the attorney general shall take charge of	
and conduct such prosecution.	
Section 2. That existing section 4717.04 of the Revised	128
Code is hereby repealed.	129
