Section 1. That sections 2903.02 and 2903.04 of the	9

Sec. 2903.02. (A) No person shall purposely cause the	11
death of another or the unlawful termination of another's	12
pregnancy.	13
(B) No person who is eighteen years of age or older shall	14
cause the death of another as a proximate result of the	15
offender's committing or attempting to commit an offense of	16
violence that is a felony of the first or second degree and that	17
is not a violation of section 2903.03 or 2903.04 of the Revised	18
Code.	19

(C) Division (B) of this section does not apply to an	20
offense that becomes a felony of the first or second degree only	21
if the offender previously has been convicted of that offense or	22

(D) Whoever violates this section is guilty of murder, and	24

or older shall cause the death of another or the unlawful	28
termination of another's pregnancy as a proximate result of the	29

another's pregnancy as a proximate result of the offender's	33
