# A BILL

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4501.21 and 4503.581 be amended	6
and section 4503.583 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	7
follows:	8
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	9
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	10
creasury the ricense prace contribution fund. The fund shari	ΤU
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	11
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	12
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	13
in division (B) of this section.	14
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	15
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	16
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	17

pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 37 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 38 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 39 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 40 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 41 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 42 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 43 directly to their clients. 44

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar45receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the46national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money47

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it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 50 receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 51 Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 52 contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 53 support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 54

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 55 receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 56 St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 57 its research and other programs. 58

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar59receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to60special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions61for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.62

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar63receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the64children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the65contributions for its research and other programs.66

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar67receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to68the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to69raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic70pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.71

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 72 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 73 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 74 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 75 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 76

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 77 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 78 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 79 contributions into its general account to be used for 80 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 81 America foundation. 82

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 83 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 84 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 85 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 86 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 87

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 88 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 89 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 90 scholarships and other educational activities. 91

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 92 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 93 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 94 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 95 that organization. 96

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar97receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to98Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for99scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or100events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.101

The registrar shall pay the contributions received102pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio103aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to104facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational105

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#### programming.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received107pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the108organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that109organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in110need.111

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar112receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a113kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the114Ohio chapters of a kid again.115

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar132receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to133Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes134

of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who135attend the university. The university shall not use any of the136funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship137program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements138with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such139funds as provided in this section.140

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 141 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 142 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 143 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 144 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 145 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 146 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 147 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 148 funds as provided in this section. 149

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 150 receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 151 Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 152 contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 154 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 155 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 156 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 157 cyclists of all ages. 158

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 159 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 160 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 161 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 162 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 163 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 164

educational, and cultural events at the monument.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 167 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 168 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 169 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 170

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar171receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the172Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the173contributions only to promote and support the football team of174Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.175

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron district seven which shall annually distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 184 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 185 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 186 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 187 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 188 activities. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 190 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 191 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 192 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 193

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its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services	194
to children, young adults, and families in this state.	195
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	196
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the	197
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it	198
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships	199

to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance	201

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	205
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the	206
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thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation207organized under the laws of this state, to assist that208organization in paying for the charitable activities and209programs it sponsors in support of United States military210personnel, veterans, and their families.211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 212 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 213 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 214 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 215 families. 216

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 217 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 218 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 219 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 220 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 221 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 222 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 223

destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 225 the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 226 to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 227 the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 228 programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 229

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 230 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 231 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 232 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 233 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 234 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 235 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 236 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 237 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 238 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 239 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 240

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar241receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the242rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.243

244 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 245 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 246 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 247 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 248 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 249 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 250 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 251 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 252 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 253

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 277 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 278 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 279 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 280 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 281 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 282

ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively283for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and284managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of285Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the286registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which287such payments are to be made.288

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 289 receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 290 Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 291 expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 292 river watershed. 293

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar302receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the303Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the304contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.305

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar306receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the307girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the308contributions to support the activities of the organization.309

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar310receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the311

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Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those312contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational313information about beekeeping, and to support other state and314local beekeeping programs.315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar316receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the317national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the318contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace319legends to inspire future leaders.320

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 321 receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 322 keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 323 contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 324 to take greater responsibility for improving the local 325 environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 326 greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 327

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 328 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 329 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 330 the contributions for educational purposes. 331

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar332receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the333Ohio sons of the American legionpast detachment commander's334club, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the335activities of the organization.336

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar337receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the338American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the339contributions to support the activities of the organization.340

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 341 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 342 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 343 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 344 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 345 commission and that is participating in the license plate 346 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 347 of the county of residence of an applicant. 348

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each349contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of350the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates351that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is352participating in the license plate program pursuant to division353(G) of that section.354

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 355 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 356 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 357 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 358 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 359 Ohio and for educational programs. 360

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 362 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 363 supporting cancer research. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar365receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the366Stan Hywet hall and gardens.367

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar368receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the369

Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 371 receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 373 contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 374 pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 375

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 376 receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 377 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 378 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 379 throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 380

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 381 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 382 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 383 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 384 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 385 scouts. 386

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 387 receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 388 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 389 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 390 throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 391

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 392 receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 393 charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 394 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 395

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 396 receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 397 Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 398

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which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 399

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 400 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 401 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 402 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 405 receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 406 Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose. 407

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 408 receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 409 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 410 deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 411 purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 412

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 413 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 414 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 415 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 416 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 417 418 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 419

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 420 pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 421 concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 422 contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 423 to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 424 in the line of duty. 425

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 426 pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 427

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Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 428 contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 429 the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 430

The registrar shall pay the contributions received431pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio432association of chiefs of police.433

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 434 receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 435 fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 436 to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 437 families. 438

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 443 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 444 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 445 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 446 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 447 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 448 449 administering a program to secure the proper representation in the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 450 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 451 participating in that program. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar453receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the454Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the455contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.456

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar457receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the458Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention,459which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and460advocacy purposes throughout the state.461

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 462 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 463 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 464 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 465 466 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 467 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 468 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 469 lives to the fullest. 470

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar471receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to472Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the473contributions into its general account to be used for purposes474of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.475

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar476receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the477Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to478commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in479Cleveland, Ohio.480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar481receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the482central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research483foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the484chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose485geographic territory the person who paid the contribution486

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resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 488 receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 489 Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 490 contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 491 law enforcement education and assistance. 492

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 493 receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 494 Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 495 moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 496 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 497 agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 498

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 499 receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 500 rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 501 Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 502 used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 503 rotary foundation. 504

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 505 receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 506 Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 507 contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 508 under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 509

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar510receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to511buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the512contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.513

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar514receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the515

The school principal or, in the school principal's 1056 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1057 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1058 services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1059 organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1060 subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1061

shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1062 purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1064receives pursuant to section 4503.956 of the Revised Code to the1065Liberty Center local school district, which shall use the1066contributions for its gifted programs and special education and1067related services.1068

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1069receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to1070John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school1071shall not use the contributions it receives for any political1072purpose.1073

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1074 receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1075 Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1076 Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1077 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1078 students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1079 arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1080 the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1081

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1082receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to1083Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal1084corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the1085contributions for any political purpose.1086

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1087receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to1088Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of1089Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for1090

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any political purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1092receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to1093Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The1094high school shall not use the contributions for any political1095purpose.1096

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1097receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the1098friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money1099to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free1100emergency medical first response throughout Israel.1101

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1102receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the1103Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and1104activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the1105city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park."1106

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1107 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1108 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1109 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1110 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1111 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1112 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1113 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1114

Sec. 4503.581. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1115 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1116 vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1117 may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1118 and issuance of "Ohio Sons of the American Legion" license 1119

"Ohio Sons of the American Legion" 1134 license plates shall display county identification stickers that 1135 identify the county of registration as required under section 1136 4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1137
