BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 5901.02 and 5901.03 of the	8
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	9
Sec. 5901.02. (A) In each county there shall be a	10
commission known as "the veterans service commission." Except as	11
provided in section 5901.021 of the Revised Code, the commission	12
shall be composed of five residents of the county appointed to	13
five-year terms -by a judge of the court of common pleas . At the	14
time of appointment or reappointment to the commission, no	15
commission member appointed under this section shall be an	16
employee of the commission or hold an elective or other	17
appointive office of the county served by the commission.	18
(B) Each member of the commission appointed under this	19

section shall be an honorably discharged or honorably separated	20
veteran. Within sixty days after the date of appointment, each	
such member shall file the member's form DD214 with the	
department of veterans services in accordance with guidelines	
established by the director of that department. Such	
appointments shall be made from lists of recommended persons, in	
the manner specified in the following paragraphthis section. One	
person shall be a representative recommended by the American	
Legion; one person shall be a representative recommended by the	28
Veterans of Foreign Wars; one person shall be a representative	29
recommended by the Disabled American Veterans; one person shall	30
be a representative recommended by the AMVETS; and one person	31
shall be a representative recommended by the Military Order of	32
the Purple Heart of the U.S.A., the Vietnam Veterans of America,	33
or the Korean War Veterans Association. If any such organization	34
has no post or chapter located in the county, the appointment	35
shall be made from lists of recommended persons submitted by	36
posts or chapters of any other congressionally chartered	
veterans organizations located in the county. If no such other	
organizations have posts or chapters located in the county, the	39
judge responsible for making appointments under this section-	40
appointing authority may appoint any qualified veteran to	41
represent the veteran community.	42
(C) On or before the fifteenth day of October of each	43
year, the appointing judge <u>authority</u> shall notify each post or	44
chapter of each organization within the county from which the	45
member may or must be appointed that it may submit a list	46
containing three recommendations of persons who are eligible for	
appointment. At least one of the persons recommended shall have	
commenced military service on or after September 11, 2001.

not later than January 15, 2024, at which time appointments	51
shall have been made under divisions (E)(4) and (5) of this	52
section for 2023 and 2024 respectively, a veterans service	53
commission shall consist of at least two members whose military	54
service commenced on or after September 11, 2001. The appointing	55
authority, before making an appointment, shall ascertain the	56
current composition of the commission to determine if	57
