A BILL<br>To amend section 3301.0712 of the Revised Code to<br>permit parents or guardians of a high school 2<br>student to opt the student out of taking a 3<br>nationally standardized college admissions 4<br>assessment.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3301.0712 of the Revised Code be 6 amended to read as follows: 7

Sec. 3301.0712. (A) The state board of education, the 8 superintendent of public instruction, and the chancellor of 9 higher education shall develop a system of college and work 10 ready assessments as described in division (B) of this section 11 to assess whether each student upon graduating from high school 12 is ready to enter college or the workforce. Beginning with 13 students who enter the ninth grade for the first time on or 14 after July 1, 2014, the system shall replace the Ohio graduation 15 tests prescribed in division (B)(1) of section 3301.0710 of the 16 Revised Code as a measure of student academic performance and 17 one determinant of eligibility for a high school diploma in the

manner prescribed by rule of the state board adopted under 19 division (D) of this section. 20
(B) The college and work ready assessment system shall consist of the following:
(1) (a) Except as provided in division (B) (1)
(b) of this section, nationally standardized assessments that
measure college and career readiness and are used for college admission. The assessments shall be selected jointly by the
state superintendent and the chancellor, and one of which shall
be selected by each school district or school to administer to
its students. The assessments prescribed under division (B) (1)
of this section shall be administered to all eleventh-grade students in the spring of the school year.
(b) Beqinning with students who enter the ninth grade for
the first time on or after the first day of July immediately
following the effective date of this amendment, the parent or guardian of a student may elect not to have a nationally standardized assessment administered to that student. In that event, the student's school district or school shall not administer the nationally standardized assessment to that student.39
