A BILL

To amend section 5902.02 of the Revised Code to add	1
a member of the Paralyzed Veterans of America	2
organization to the Veterans Advisory Committee.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 5902.02 of the Revised Code be	4
amended to read as follows:	5
Sec. 5902.02. The duties of the director of veterans	6
services shall include the following:	7
(A) Furnishing the veterans service commissions of all	8
counties of the state copies of the state laws, rules, and	9
legislation relating to the operation of the commissions and	10
their offices;	11
(B) Upon application, assisting the general public in	12
obtaining records of vital statistics pertaining to veterans or	13
their dependents;	14

(C) Adopting rules pursuant to Chapter 119. of the Revised
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Code pertaining to minimum qualifications for hiring,
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certifying, and accrediting county veterans service officers,
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pertaining to their required duties, and pertaining to
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revocation of the certification of county veterans service
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officers;

(D) Adopting rules pursuant to Chapter 119. of the Revised Code for the education, training, certification, and duties of veterans service commissioners and for the revocation of the certification of a veterans service commissioner;

(E) Developing and monitoring programs and agreements
enhancing employment and training for veterans in single or
multiple county areas;
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(F) Developing and monitoring programs and agreements to
enable county veterans service commissions to address
homelessness, indigency, and other veteran-related issues
individually or jointly;

(G) Developing and monitoring programs and agreements to
enable state agencies, individually or jointly, that provide
services to veterans, including the veterans' homes operated
under Chapter 5907. of the Revised Code and the director of job
and family services, to address homelessness, indigency,
employment, and other veteran-related issues;

(H) Establishing and providing statistical reporting38formats and procedures for county veterans service commissions;39

(I) Publishing electronically a listing of county veterans
service offices and county veterans service commissioners. The
listing shall include the expiration dates of commission
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members' terms of office and the organizations they represent;
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the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of county veterans service offices; and the addresses and telephone numbers of the Ohio offices and headquarters of state and national veterans service organizations.

(J) Establishing a veterans advisory committee to advise 48 and assist the department of veterans services in its duties. 49 Members shall include a member of the national guard association 50 of the United States who is a resident of this state, <u>a member</u> 51 of the paralyzed veterans of America who is a resident of this 52 state, a member of the military officers association of America 53 54 who is a resident of this state, a state representative of congressionally chartered veterans organizations referred to in 55 section 5901.02 of the Revised Code, a representative of any 56 other congressionally chartered state veterans organization that 57 has at least one veterans service commissioner in the state, 58 three representatives of the Ohio state association of county 59 veterans service commissioners, who shall have a combined vote 60 of one, three representatives of the state association of county 61 veterans service officers, who shall have a combined vote of 62 one, one representative of the county commissioners association 63 of Ohio, who shall be a county commissioner not from the same 64 county as any of the other county representatives, a 65 representative of the advisory committee on women veterans, a 66 representative of a labor organization, and a representative of 67 the office of the attorney general. The department of veterans 68 services shall submit to the advisory committee proposed rules 69 for the committee's operation. The committee may review and 70 revise these proposed rules prior to submitting them to the 71 joint committee on agency rule review. 72

(K) Adopting, with the advice and assistance of theveterans advisory committee, policy and procedural guidelines74

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75 that the veterans service commissions shall adhere to in the 76 development and implementation of rules, policies, procedures, and guidelines for the administration of Chapter 5901. of the 77 Revised Code. The department of veterans services shall adopt no 78 guidelines or rules regulating the purposes, scope, duration, or 79 amounts of financial assistance provided to applicants pursuant 80 to sections 5901.01 to 5901.15 of the Revised Code. The director 81 of veterans services may obtain opinions from the office of the 82 attorney general regarding rules, policies, procedures, and 83 quidelines of the veterans service commissions and may enforce 84 compliance with Chapter 5901. of the Revised Code. 85

(L) Receiving copies of form DD214 filed in accordance
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with the director's guidelines adopted under division (L) of
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this section from members of veterans service commissions
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appointed under section 5901.02 and from county veterans service
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officers employed under section 5901.07 of the Revised Code;
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(M) Developing and maintaining and improving a resource, 91 such as a telephone answering point or a web site, by means of 92 which veterans and their dependents, through a single portal, 93 can access multiple sources of information and interaction with 94 regard to the rights of, and the benefits available to, veterans 95 and their dependents. The director of veterans services may 96 enter into agreements with state and federal agencies, with 97 agencies of political subdivisions, with state and local 98 instrumentalities, and with private entities as necessary to 99 make the resource as complete as is possible. 100

(N) Planning, organizing, advertising, and conducting
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 outreach efforts, such as conferences and fairs, at which
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 veterans and their dependents may meet, learn about the
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 organization and operation of the department of veterans
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services and of veterans service commissions, and obtain 105 information about the rights of, and the benefits and services 106 available to, veterans and their dependents; 107

(O) Advertising, in print, on radio and television, and
otherwise, the rights of, and the benefits and services
available to, veterans and their dependents;

(P) Developing and advocating improved benefits and
services for, and improved delivery of benefits and services to,
veterans and their dependents;

(Q) Searching for, identifying, and reviewing statutory 114 and administrative policies that relate to veterans and their 115 dependents and reporting to the general assembly statutory and 116 administrative policies that should be consolidated in whole or 117 in part within the organization of the department of veterans 118 services to unify funding, delivery, and accounting of statutory 119 and administrative policy expressions that relate particularly 120 to veterans and their dependents; 121

(R) Encouraging veterans service commissions to innovate
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and otherwise to improve efficiency in delivering benefits and
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services to veterans and their dependents and to report
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successful innovations and efficiencies to the director of
veterans services;

(S) Publishing and encouraging adoption of successful
innovations and efficiencies veterans service commissions have
achieved in delivering benefits and services to veterans and
their dependents;

(T) Establishing advisory committees, in addition to the
veterans advisory committee established under division (K) (J)
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of this section, on veterans issues;
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(U) Developing and maintaining a relationship with the
United States department of veterans affairs, seeking optimal
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federal benefits and services for Ohio veterans and their
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dependents, and encouraging veterans service commissions to
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maximize the federal benefits and services to which veterans and
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their dependents are entitled;

(V) Developing and maintaining relationships with the
several veterans organizations, encouraging the organizations in
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their efforts at assisting veterans and their dependents, and
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advocating for adequate state subsidization of the
organizations;

(W) Requiring the several veterans organizations that
receive funding from the state annually, not later than the
thirtieth day of July, to report to the director of veterans
services and prescribing the form and content of the report;

(X) Reviewing the reports submitted to the director under
division (W) of this section within thirty days of receipt and
informing the veterans organization of any deficiencies that
exist in the organization's report and that funding will not be
released until the deficiencies have been corrected and a
satisfactory report submitted;

(Y) Releasing funds and processing payments to veterans
organizations when a report submitted to the director under
division (W) of this section has been reviewed and determined to
be satisfactory;

(Z) Furnishing copies of all reports that the director of
veterans services has determined have been submitted
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satisfactorily under division (W) of this section to the
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chairperson of the finance committees of the general assembly;
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(AA) Investigating complaints against county veterans 163 services commissioners and county veterans service officers if 164 the director reasonably believes the investigation to be 165 166 appropriate and necessary; (BB) Developing and maintaining a web site that is 167 accessible by veterans and their dependents and provides a link 168 to the web site of each state agency that issues a license, 169 certificate, or other authorization permitting an individual to 170 engage in an occupation or occupational activity; 171 (CC) Encouraging state agencies to conduct outreach 172 efforts through which veterans and their dependents can learn 173 about available job and education benefits; 174 (DD) Informing state agencies about changes in statutes 175 and rules that affect veterans and their dependents; 176 (EE) Assisting licensing agencies in adopting rules under 177 section 5903.03 of the Revised Code; 178 (FF) Administering the provision of grants from the 179 military injury relief fund under section 5902.05 of the Revised 180 Code; 181 (GG) Taking any other actions required by this chapter. 182

Section 2. That existing section 5902.02 of the Revised183Code is hereby repealed.184

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
