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To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.559 of the Revised Code to create the	2
Playhouse Square license plate.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.559 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	10
in division (B) of this section.	11
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	12
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	13
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	17
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	18

quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of19the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or20other abortion-related activities.21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40 directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 48 Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 49 contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 50 support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar60receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the61children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the62contributions for its research and other programs.63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76

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contributions into its general account to be used for77educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of78America foundation.79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87 scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92 that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar94receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to95Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for96scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or97events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received99pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the100organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that101organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in102need.103

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 104 receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 105

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kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 106 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 107

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 108 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 109 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 110 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 111 section. A university or college that receives contributions 112 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 113 scholarship fund. 114

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 115 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 116 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 117 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 118 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 119 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 120 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 121 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 122 funds as provided in this section. 123

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 124 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 125 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 126 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 127 cyclists of all ages. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 130 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 131 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 132 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 133 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 134 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 135

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 136 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 137 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 138 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 139 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 140

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar141receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the142Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the143contributions only to promote and support the football team of144Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 146 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 147 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 148 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 149 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 150 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 151 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 152 sponsors within this state. 153

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 161 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 162 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 163 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 164 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 165

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 167 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 168 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 169 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 170 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 171 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 172 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 173 the improvement of patient outcomes. 174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 175 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 176 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 177 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 178 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 179 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 180 personnel, veterans, and their families. 181

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 182 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 183 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 184 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 185 families. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 188 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 189 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 190 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 191 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 192 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 193 destination. 194

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 195

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the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 196 to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 197 the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 198 programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 199

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 200 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 201 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 202 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 203 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 204 205 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 206 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 207 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 208 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 209 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 210

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 215 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 216 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 217 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 218 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 219 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 220 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 221 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 222 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 223 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 224 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 225

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under this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar232receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the233western reserve historical society, which shall use the234contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.235

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar236receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the237Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple238negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the239contributions for charitable and educational purposes.240

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 241 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 242 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 243 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 244 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 245 the person who paid the contribution resides. 246

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar247receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to248playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use249the contributions to further its mission of presenting and250producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing251arts education, and creating a superior destination for252entertainment, business, and residential living.253

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 254

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receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 255 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 256 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 257 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 258 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 259 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 260 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 261 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 262 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 263 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 264 such payments are to be made. 265

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar279receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the280Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the281contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.282

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 284 girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 285 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 286

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 287 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 288 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 289 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 290 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 291 local beekeeping programs. 292

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar293receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the294national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the295contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace296legends to inspire future leaders.297

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use the contributions for educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar302receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the303Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the304contributions to support the activities of the organization.305

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 306 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 307 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 308 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 309 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 310 commission and that is participating in the license plate 311 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 312

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of the county of residence of an applicant.

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 314 contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 315 the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 316 that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 318 (G) of that section. 319

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 320 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 321 322 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, which shall use the contributions for the protection and 323 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 324 Ohio and for educational programs. 325

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 326 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 327 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 328 supporting cancer research. 329

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 330 receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 331 332 Stan Hywet hall and gardens.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 333 receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 334 Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 335

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 336 receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 337 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 338 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 339 throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 340

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 341

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receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 342 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 343 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 344 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 345 scouts. 346

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar347receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the348Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council349shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner350throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.351

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 352 receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 353 charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 354 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 355

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 356 receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 357 Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 358 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 359

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 360 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 361 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 362 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 363 charitable purposes. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar365receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the366fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall367deposit the fees into its general account to be used for368purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.369

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 370

receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 371 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 372 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 373 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 374 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 375 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 376

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 377 pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 378 concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 379 contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 380 to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 381 in the line of duty. 382

The registrar shall pay the contributions received383pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater384Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those385contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in386the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.387

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of chiefs of police.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar396receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the397fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall398use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.399

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 400 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 401 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 402 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 403 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 404 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 405 406 administering a program to secure the proper representation in the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 407 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 408 409 participating in that program.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar410receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the411Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the412contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414 receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 415 Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 416 which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 417 advocacy purposes throughout the state. 418

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 419 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 420 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 421 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 422 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 423 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 424 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 425 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 426 lives to the fullest. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar428receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to429

Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the430contributions into its general account to be used for purposes431of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar433receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the434Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to435commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in436Cleveland, Ohio.437

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 438 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 439 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 440 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 441 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 442 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 443 resides. 444

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting law enforcement education and assistance.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 450 receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 451 Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 452 moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 453 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 454 agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 455

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar456receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the457rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston,458

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Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 459 used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 460 rotary foundation. 461 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 462 receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 463 Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 464 contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 465 under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 466 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 467 receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 468 buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 469 470 contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 471 receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the 472 municipal corporation of Twinsburg. 473 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 474 receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 475 Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 476 maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 477 478 connection. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 479 receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 480

Medina county historical society, which shall use those481contributions to distribute between the various historical482societies and museums in Medina county.483

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar484receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the485Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the486contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and487

scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar489receives pursuant to section 4503.767 of the Revised Code to490folds of honor of central Ohio, which shall use the491contributions to provide scholarships to spouses and children492either of disabled veterans or of members of any branch of the493armed forces who died during their service.494

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 495 receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 496 Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 497 research projects. 498

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those contributions solely to promote and support the historical preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar505receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the506Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those507contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth508baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City.509

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 510 receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 511 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 512 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 513 providing services to the school district's students that assist 514 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 515 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 516

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counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 517 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 518 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 519 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 520 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 521 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 522 523 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 524 that the school district hires to provide those services. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1067 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1068 vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1069 may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1070 and issuance of "Playhouse Square" license plates. The 1071 application may be combined with a request for a special 1072 reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1073 Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1074 compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1075 section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1076 appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Playhouse Square" 1077 license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker 1078 alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1079

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1080 inscribed on the license plates, "Playhouse Square" license 1081 plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that are 1082 selected by the board of trustees of playhouse square located in 1083 Cleveland, Ohio, and approved by the registrar. "Playhouse 1084 Square" license plates shall display county identification 1085 stickers that identify the county of registration as required 1086 under section 4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1087

(B) "Playhouse Square" license plates and a validation1088sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon1089receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle1090under this section; payment of the regular license tax as1091prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any1092applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504.1093

section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional	1095
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as	1096
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with	1097

(C)(1) For each application for registration and	1100
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this	1101
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of fifteen	1102
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the	1103
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution	1104
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code.	1105
(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of	1106
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of	1107
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing	1108
of "Playhouse Square" license plates, into the state treasury to	1109
the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created	1110
in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code.	1111
