A BILL

To amend sections 3717.33 and 3717.52 of the 1
Revised Code to require the Director of 2
Agriculture and the Director of Health to adopt 3
rules governing the assessment of registered 4
environmental health specialists and 5
environmental health specialists in training who 6
conduct inspections of retail food 7
establishments and food service operations. 8

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3717.33 and 3717.52 of the 9
Revised Code be amended to read as follows: 10

Sec. 3717.33. Pursuant to section 3717.04 of the Revised 11
Code, the director of agriculture shall adopt rules regarding 12
the following: 13

(A) Licensing categories for retail food establishments 14
and licensing requirements for each category, including 15
appropriate practices for the activities performed by a retail 16
food establishment; 17

(B) Standards for collection of food samples from retail food establishments for purposes of identifying adulteration and misbranding;	18 19 20
(C) Records to be generated and maintained by licensed retail food establishments;	21 22
(D) Appeals of proposed suspensions and revocations of retail food establishment licenses and appeals of suspensions of licenses issued for violations presenting a clear and present danger to the public health;	23 24 25 26
(E) Standards and procedures, including a schedule of frequency, for conducting inspections of retail food establishments;	27 28 29
(F) Standards and procedures for determining during an inspection whether articles should be removed from use because of a clear and present danger to the public health;	30 31 32
(G) Standards and procedures for conducting investigations of complaints pertaining to retail food establishments;	33 34
(H) <u>(H) (1) Surveys conducted by the director to determine whether boards of health are qualified and have the capacity to administer and enforce the provisions of this chapter and the rules adopted under it applicable to retail food establishments and to abide by the Ohio uniform food safety code. <u>(a) The director to evaluate whether an individual registered as an environmental health specialist or an environmental health specialist in training under Chapter 4736. of the Revised Code who is employed by or has contracted with a board of health to enforce this chapter as it relates to retail food establishments has sufficient knowledge of the provisions</u>	41 42 43 44 45 46

of this chapter, rules adopted under it, and of the Ohio uniform 47
food safety code to conduct such enforcement; 48

(b) The director to evaluate an individual under division 49
(H)(1)(a) of this section solely through the use of an objective 50
written or electronic assessment that complies with all of the 51
following: 52

(i) It is developed by the director in consultation with 53
representatives from the Ohio environmental health association 54
and the association of Ohio health commissioners. 55

(ii) It does not exceed fifty questions in length. 56

(iii) In order to pass the assessment, the individual must 57
correctly answer eighty per cent or more of the questions in the 58
assessment. Questions on the exam shall be derived from the most 59
common violations cited during the previous inspection year. 60

(iv) The individual is allowed to review the Ohio uniform 61
food safety code during the assessment. 62

(2) The director, in consultation with representatives 63
from the Ohio environmental health association and the 64
association of Ohio health commissioners, shall review and 65
update the assessment described in division (H)(1)(b) of this 66
section on at least a biennial basis. 67

(3) For purposes of any field review portion of the 68
survey, the director may require a registered environmental 69
health specialist or environmental health specialist in training 70
to participate in the field review for training and educational 71
purposes. However, the director shall not use such participation 72
to evaluate whether the registered environmental health 73
specialist or environmental health specialist in training has 74
sufficient knowledge of this chapter, rules adopted under it, 75

Section 2. That existing sections 3717.33 and 3717.52 of	145
the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	146
Section 3. (A) The Director of Agriculture shall complete	147
the initial development and implementation of the assessment	148
described in division (H) (1) of section 3717.33 of the Revised	149
Code within one hundred eighty days after the effective date of	150
this section.	151
(B) The Director of Health shall complete the initial	152
development and implementation of the assessment described in	153
division (B) (1) of section 3717.52 of the Revised Code within	154
one hundred eighty days after the effective date of this	155
