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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.569 of the Revised Code to create the "Ohio 2  
Oil and Gas Energy Education Program" license 3  
plate. 4

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 5  
4503.569 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 6

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 7  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 8  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 9  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 10  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 11  
in division (B) of this section. 12

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 13  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 14

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 15  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 16  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 17  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 18

cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 19  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 20  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 21  
other abortion-related activities. 22

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 23  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 24  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 25  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 26  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 27  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 28  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 29  
other money in that fund. 30

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 31  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 32  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 33  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 34

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 35  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 36  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 37  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 38  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 39  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 40  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 41  
directly to their clients. 42

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 43  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 44  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 45  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 46  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 47

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the

future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 77  
contributions into its general account to be used for 78  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 79  
America foundation. 80

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 81  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 82  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 83  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 84  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 86  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 87  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 88  
scholarships and other educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 90  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 91  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 92  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 93  
that organization. 94

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 95  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 96  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 97  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 98  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 100  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 101  
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 102  
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 103  
programming. 104

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 105

pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 106  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 107  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 108  
need. 109

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 110  
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 111  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 112  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 113

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 114  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 115  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 116  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 117  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 118  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 119  
scholarship fund. 120

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 121  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 122  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 123  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 124  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 125  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 126  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 127  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 128  
funds as provided in this section. 129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 130  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 131  
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 132  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 133  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 134  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 135

program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 136  
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 137  
funds as provided in this section. 138

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 139  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 140  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 141  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 142  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 143  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 144  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 145  
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 146  
funds as provided in this section. 147

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 148  
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 149  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 150  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 151

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 152  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 153  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 154  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 155  
cyclists of all ages. 156

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 157  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 158  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 159  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 160  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 161  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 162  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 163

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 164

receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 165  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 166  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 167  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 169  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 170  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 171  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 172  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 173

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 174  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 175  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 176  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 177  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 178  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 179  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 180  
sponsors within this state. 181

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 182  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 183  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 184  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 185  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 186  
activities. 187

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 188  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 189  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 190  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 191  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 192  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 193

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and the improvement of patient outcomes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state, to assist that organization in paying for the charitable activities and programs it sponsors in support of United States military personnel, veterans, and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to



the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 224  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 225  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 226  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 227

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 228  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 229  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 230  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 231  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 232  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 233  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 234  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 235  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 236  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 237  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 238

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 239  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 240  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 241

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 242  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 243  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 244  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 245  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 246  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 247  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 248  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 249  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 250  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 251  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 252  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 253

under this section. 254

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 255  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 256  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 257  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 258  
programs. 259

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 260  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 261  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 262  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 263

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 264  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 265  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 266  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 267  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 268

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 269  
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 270  
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 271  
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 272  
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 273  
the person who paid the contribution resides. 274

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 275  
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 276  
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 277  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 278  
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 279  
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 280  
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 281  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 282

managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 283  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 284  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 285  
such payments are to be made. 286

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 287  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 288  
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 289  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 290  
river watershed. 291

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 292  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 293  
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 294  
nature preserve. 295

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 296  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 297  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 298  
the money in support of the park. 299

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 300  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 301  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 302  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 303

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 304  
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 305  
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 306  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 307

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 308  
receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 309  
Ohio oil and gas energy education foundation to fund 310  
scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and 311

natural gas industry. 312

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 313  
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 314  
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 315  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 316  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 317  
local beekeeping programs. 318

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 319  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 320  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 321  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 322  
legends to inspire future leaders. 323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 324  
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 325  
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 326  
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 327  
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 328  
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 329  
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 330

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 331  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 332  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 333  
the contributions for educational purposes. 334

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 335  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 336  
Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 337  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 338

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 339  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 340

contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 341  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 342  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 343  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 344  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 345  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 346

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 347  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 348  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 349  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 350  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 351  
(G) of that section. 352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 353  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 354  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 355  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 356  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 357  
Ohio and for educational programs. 358

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 359  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 360  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 361  
supporting cancer research. 362

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 363  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 364  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 366  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 367  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 369

receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 370  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 371  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 372  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 373

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 374  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 375  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 376  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 377  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 378

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 379  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 380  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 381  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 382  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 383  
scouts. 384

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 385  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 386  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 387  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 388  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 389

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 390  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 391  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 392  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 393

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 394  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 395  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 396  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 398

receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 399  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 400  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 401  
charitable purposes. 402

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 403  
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 404  
Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose. 405

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 406  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 407  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 408  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 409  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 410

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 411  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 412  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 413  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 414  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 415  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 416  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 417

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 418  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 419  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 420  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 421  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 422  
in the line of duty. 423

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 424  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 425  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 426  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 427

the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 428

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 429  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 430  
association of chiefs of police. 431

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 432  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 433  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 434  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 435  
families. 436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 437  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 438  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 439  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 440

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 441  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 442  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 443  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 444  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 445  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 446  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 447  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 448  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 449  
participating in that program. 450

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 451  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 452  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 453  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 454

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 455  
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 456



Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 457  
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 458  
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 459

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 460  
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 461  
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 462  
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 463  
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 464  
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 465  
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 466  
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 467  
lives to the fullest. 468

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 469  
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 470  
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 471  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 472  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 473

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 474  
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 475  
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 476  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 477  
Cleveland, Ohio. 478

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 479  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 480  
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 481  
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 482  
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 483  
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 484  
resides. 485

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 486  
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 487  
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 488  
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 489  
law enforcement education and assistance. 490

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 491  
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 492

receives pursuant to section 4503.954 of the Revised Code to 1017  
University school located in the suburban area near the 1018  
municipal corporation of Cleveland. The school shall use fifty 1019  
per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition 1020  
assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining 1021  
fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing 1022  
services to the school's students that assist in developing or 1023  
maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. 1024  
The services provided may include bereavement counseling, 1025  
instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity 1026  
training, and the counseling and education of students regarding 1027  
bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and 1028  
human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the 1029  
school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to 1030

receive training in providing those services. The school 1031  
principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate 1032  
school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 1033  
that the school hires to provide those services. The school 1034  
shall ensure that any such charitable organization is exempt 1035  
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 1036  
Internal Revenue Code. The school shall not use the 1037  
contributions it receives for any other purpose. 1038

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1039  
receives pursuant to section 4503.955 of the Revised Code to 1040  
Saint Albert the Great school located in North Royalton. The 1041  
school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives 1042  
to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall 1043  
use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1044  
in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1045  
developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1046  
the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1047  
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1048  
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1049  
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1050  
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1051  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1052  
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1053  
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1054  
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1055  
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1056  
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1057  
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1058  
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1059  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1060  
purpose. 1061

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.956 of the Revised Code to the Liberty Center local school district, which shall use the contributions for its gifted programs and special education and related services.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school shall not use the contributions it receives for any political purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit athletics at the school.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the contributions for any political purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for any political purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1091  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1092  
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1093  
purpose. 1094

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1095  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1096  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1097  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1098  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1099

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1100  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1101  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1102  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1103  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1104

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1105  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1106  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1107  
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1108  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1109  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1110  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1111  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1112

Sec. 4503.569. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1113  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1114  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1115  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1116  
and issuance of "Ohio Oil and Gas Energy Education Program" 1117  
license plates. The application may be combined with a request 1118  
for a special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 1119  
4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed 1120

application and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) 1121  
and (C) of this section, the registrar shall issue to the 1122  
applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set of 1123  
"Ohio Oil and Gas Energy Education Program" license plates and a 1124  
validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required 1125  
by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1126

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1127  
inscribed on the license plates, "Ohio Oil and Gas Energy 1128  
Education Program" license plates shall display an appropriate 1129  
logo and words that are selected by representatives of the Ohio 1130  
oil and gas association and approved by the registrar. "Ohio Oil 1131  
and Gas Energy Education Program" license plates shall display 1132  
county identification stickers that identify the county of 1133  
registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 1134  
Code. 1135

(B) "Ohio Oil and Gas Energy Education Program" license 1136  
plates and a validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, 1137  
shall be issued upon receipt of an application for registration 1138  
of a motor vehicle under this section; payment of the regular 1139  
license tax as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised 1140  
Code, any applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under 1141  
Chapter 4504. of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee 1142  
prescribed by section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an 1143  
additional administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution 1144  
as provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance 1145  
with all other applicable laws relating to the registration of 1146  
motor vehicles. 1147

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 1148  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1149  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty 1150

dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1151  
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1152  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1153

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1154  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1155  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1156  
of "Ohio Oil and Gas Energy Education Program" license plates, 1157  
into the state treasury to the credit of the public safety - 1158  
highway purposes fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised 1159  
Code. 1160
