INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 274 - Representatives Upchurch, Jarrells. Cosponsors: Representatives Boggs, Brown, Crawley, Denson, Lepore-Hagan, Howse, Miller, J., Miranda, Robinson, Russo, Sheehy, Skindell, Sykes, Weinstein, West.

To repeal section 9.68 of the Revised Code to restore local authority to generally regulate firearms-related conduct.

H. B. No. 275 - Representative Lampton.

Cosponsors: Representatives Seitz, White, Riedel.

To amend section 9.48 of the Revised Code to expand political subdivision joint purchasing authority to expressly include purchases for construction services.

H. B. No. 276 - Representatives Powell, Schmidt.

Cosponsors: Representatives Zeltwanger, Riedel, Jordan, Koehler, LaRe, O'Brien, Vitale, McClain, Fowler Arthur, White, Bird, Manchester, Abrams, Wiggam.

To amend section 2923.31 and to enact section 2907.251 of the Revised Code to prohibit a person from receiving proceeds of prostitution.

H. B. No. 277 - Representative Powell.

Cosponsors: Representatives Merrin, Riedel, Gross, Carfagna, Zeltwanger, Hoops, Brinkman.

To amend sections 4709.05, 4709.07, 4709.08, 4709.10, 4713.08, 4713.09, 4713.24, 4713.28, 4713.31, 4713.34, 4713.45, and 4713.59 of the Revised Code to revise the law governing the regulation of cosmetologists and barbers.

H. B. No. 278 - Representative Hillyer. Cosponsor: Representative Seitz. To amend sections 128.46, 4501.29, and 4501.30 and to enact sections 128.541, 128.543, 128.545, 128.547, 4501.304, and 4503.305 of the Revised Code to make changes to laws governing the multi-agency radio communications system (MARCS).
